OFFICIALS' DAY: On March 26th. a committee of athletes organised a programme for officials. Good performances were registered: 100 yards 12 secs., javelin 116 ft. 3 ins., 16 lb. Shot 27 ft. 5 ins., being the best. Result (over eleven events): A. S. Preshaw 49 points, G. Jacobs 47 points, T. Hallam 43 points. Twelve officials competed. The athletes' committee is congratulated upon its conduct of the meeting.

SPORTS GROUND.

A committee is working upon a scheme that will probablu bear good results within the coming season. The scheme is State-wide in extent and embraces all forms of athletics and athletic interests. As the scheme requires further consideration, your Council desires only to keep you informed that this important matter is not lapsing.

NORTHERN CENTRE.

The good work of the Northern Committee, and particularly of Mr. E. R. Munting, is bearing fruit in the enrolment of young athletes as well as being manifested in the very efficient organisation of local athletics and two State Championships. The Council warmly congratulates the North upon its work for amateur sport euring this year under review.

TASMANIAN OLYMPIC COUNCIL.

Following the lead of the 1936-37 Council, your Council has brought to a successful issue the re-constitution of the above body with six affiliated associations. This result must be largely attributed to the initial efforts of your late Hon. Secretary, Mr. M. L. I. Round, who set the matter on foot last season.

BIENNIAL CONFERENCE.

Your delegates to the Conference of the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia in February at Sydney were Messrs. N. G. Hutton and F. A. Rose. Congratulations are extended to them for their no small share of the reconstitution of the Union's composition, one that is more representative of State interests and giving the Union more financial strength and support.

EMPIRE GAMES.

Mr. D. Bonham of the Sandy Bay Club, after running a fine third in the mile at the Australian Championships in Brisbane in December, was chosen to represent Australia in this event at the Ampire Games in Sydney in February. Your Council congratulates him upon this well-won honour.

To Messrs. N. G. Hutton, F. A. Rose and H. Clark also recognition of their services to the cause of amateur athletics in this State was paid by their selection as officials in these Games.

On February 18th., 25 members of the Empire Games team from Britain, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland, and Ceylon appeared at the North Hobart

Oval in exhibitions and handicap events. Although the meeting was not successful financially, the failure being due to Centenary Regatta attractions, the competition against and association with outstanding athletes should be beneficial to Tasmanians privileged to be present.

RELATIONS.

We record with pleasure that our relations with other State Associations and the Australian Union continue amicable and mutually helpful. Within the State we thank particularly the Amateur Cycling Union for co-operation in programmes and grounds.

OFFICIALS.

While the organisation of the competitions has been hampered at times by the lack of officials, your Council records its thanks for the services of all who have at any time assisted the conduct of the games and events, especially referring to the conscientious attention to duties and extra assistance rendered by Messrs. F. Morrell, C. Hallam, H. Clark, T. Hallam, C. Cracknell, and your delegates to the Biennial Conference.

OBITUARY.

We record with regret the death of Mr. W. Dunn, an active athlete of the Sandy Bay Club. Mr. Dunn competed in all competitions catered for and was an able athlete, popular with officials, club-mates and adversaries.

FINANCE.

The year under review has been adifficult one, as unusual expenses have been incurred. The funds have been carefully guarded and the co-operation of athletes in assisting to meet the urgency by forgoing Championship trophies for Track and Field Titles is greatly appreciated. An active social committee can do much to place the Association again beyond the border-line where they have hovered for some seasons past.
