To Messrs. N. G. Hutton, F. A. Rose and H. Clark also recognition of their services to the cause of amateur athletics in this State was paid by their selection as of ficials in these Games.

On February l8th., 25 members of the Empire Ganes team from Britain, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland, and Ceylon appeared at the North Hobart

Oval in exhibitions and handicap events. Although the meeting was not successful financially, the failure being due to Centenary Regatta attractions, the competition against and association with outstanding athletes should bo beneficial to Tasmanians privileged to be present.

We record with pleasure that our relations with other State Associations and the Australian Union continue amicable and mutually helpful. Within the State we thank particularly the Amateur Cycling Union for co-operation in programmes and grounds.

We record with regret the death of Mr. W. Dunn, an active athlete of the Sandy Bey Club. Mr. Dunn competed in all oompetitions catered for and was an able athlete, popular with officials, club-mates and adversaries.
