A. has made reasonable progress in both parts of the State during the past season but if some of the younger members would help on the official side, athletics would reach its proper position. It is difficult to get men to act as officials, councillors etc. in most sports and our Association is no exception. The few willing helpers are left to do most of the work and then are often critisized for doing their best. Apart from this, however, everything has run smoothly; membership has increased to 133 registrations; finance has been quite satisfactory. Most of the newcomers, in fact the majority of competitors, are juniors which augers well for the future. Indeed this season's results show how the standard has rison.

Interest was shown in the pe rformances of Herb McKinley of Jamaica - World's 440 yards accord Holder who was specially invited to come to Australia to compete in the Championships. The attendance on the first day was 25,000, a slightly smaller number being present on the second day - the results being a great financial success.

Tasmania was represented in the 440 yards and 880 yards by N.J. Ruddock and in the one mile and three miles by W. Emmerton. Although both competitors put up good performances they not succossful in gaining a place. The experience they gained will, of course, be of great benefit to Tasmanian Athletes. On 29/11/147 16 Two relays were run during the season. men of the New Town Harrier Club covered the 22 miles between Hobart and New Norfolk in 1 hour 26 mins. 20 secs., an average of 3 mins 55 secs. per mile. This effort reduced their previous time by 6 mins 51 secs.

The Launceston to Hobert Relay of 123 miles was run by a team of 23 on the 7/2/48 and the standing time of 12 hours 30 mins was reduced to 9 hours 43 mins 5 secs., or an average of 4 mins 43.4 secs. per mile. The first hundred miles were run in 8 hours 3 mins 26 secs. Final 11 miles at 4 mins 17 secs. per mile = 14 miles per hour. Best Stage was from 8B to 100 miles at an average of 4 mins 72 secs. It will be noted that in all eleven Tasmanian Records were broken during the two days of the Championships, Nine Jnr, one senior and one new event. Perhaps the main reasons for nine out of ten junior records being broken was the fact that the age limit has been raised from 18 to 19 years but even so some of the performances were exceptionally good, being very little behind the seniors. This would indicate that with another year 's competition they will offer strong competition to the present seniors when they graduate. With regard to the senior record, the 120 rards hurdle, Peter Gardner who made the record has been included in the Olympic Team mainly because of his run in Hobart. It was indeed exceptional ly good and that time should stand for many years.

INTERSTATE VISITORS.

The T.A.A.A. was extremely pleased to have as competitors on both days in the State Championships members from the Old Melburnian Athletic Club, the Collingwood Harrier Club and the Malvern Harrier Club. On the second day, when the events were conducted at Launceston, John Bartram and Bill Ramsay, two Victorian Athletes who have been selected to represent Australia at the 1948 Olympic Games, also competed.

The presence of all these visitors added greatly to the interest and enjoyment or those who attended the Championship Meetings, and will prove a stimulus to our local competitors. The T.A.A. will welcomed, with great pleasure, similar visits in the future.

TWILIGHT SPORTS.

Twilight Sports were conducted at North Hobart Oval on Wednesday evening from November to March; at the commencement fields were on the small side but as the season progressed fields increased considerably.
