GentIiemen,
Your Council again has pleasure in presenting a report on the activities and functioning of your Associntion for the Season 19591960. It has been one of the most successful seasons on record and your members have been painstking in their many assignnents. Thirteen Council Meetings and quite a nunber of Sub-Committee Meetings were held, During the year Mr. C.G. Briggs found it necessary to resign because of ill health, but we are happy to report he is strong and well again. Mr. C. Harvey was appointed to replace Mr. Briggs.

## BRANCH ACTIVITIES :

The major part of the competition is carried out by the three State Branches very efficiently, which leaves the work of the Council largely in the nature of administration. This was the intention when the Constitution was altered and it appears to be the most satisfactory way of running our Sport on a State wide basis, Council members have always assisted Branches where and when possible.

## TRACK AND FIELD:

The Branches have been very active. The Southem Branch conducted the State Championships, and the Northern Branch and the North Western Branch each had charge of a day of the Triangular contests,

The $S_{o}$ uthern Branch embarked on $I_{n}$ vitation Meetings and at two seprate Carnivis invited inerv. Lincoln, B. Baker, R. Cakley, and Herb. Elliott. Both lieetings were outst ndingly successful and were well supported by the public. Lincoln established a new Tasmanian Record for the Mile in 4 min. 3.5 secs., and Elliott recorded new laamanian half Mile figures of I min. 49.4 secs. The Council would give its support and encouragement to the other Branches in arranging similar Carnivals.

The Northern Branch took charge of the 5 miles and 4 miles Cross Country Championships, the North West Branch the 10 miles Crese Country Championships and the Southern Branch the 10,00 metres and 5 miles Junior Cross Country Charmionships, C. Wood of the Northern Branch has proved himself the States outstanding distance runner.

Much useful work was transacted between the $A_{0} A_{0}$ U. A. and your Council. At each monthly Meeting there is always a big parcel of IJnion business to be handled, and the Union is most fortunate indeed to have Wr. Arthur Hodsdon, the Honorarymecretary-Treasurer, who is the last word in efficiency, ability and reliabjility. Your congratulations re extended to iirr. $\mathrm{N} . \mathrm{G}$. Hutton who has been ppointed as one of two Union delegates to the Austr lian olymic Fderation. Fe is the first Tasmanian Athletic :feicinl to be appointed to this very important position. Ir. Hutton is 2lso Vice Iresident of the Union, and is the Council's representative on the Union Executive. He polled prticularly well for the pcsitions of Athletic Sectional Manager, General and Assistant Manager for the Australisn 1960 Olympic Team, and was "rhoto finished" out of sppointment as Executive INember of the $A_{0}$ U. F.

TASMANLINT OLYMPIC CUUNCIL
Your delegates, Messrs. Tarwick and Hutton, have represented the Council well on the Tasmanian Olympic Council and have taken the lead on many occasions in matters of interest to amateur sport in the State, On the instigation of Mr, G.T. Briggs, your Council was responsible for the T. O. C. having a Christmas "Cet Together" at the Royal Autocar Club. This was a worth while social function. Hut Huton is Fresident of the T. O.C. and your Tresident attended the recent Australian Olympic aderntiom as a proxy-delegete. AUSTRALTAN WOMEN'S TRACK YND FTETD CHWRYONGHIPS

There were held at Northi Hobart in March this year and many of your mernbers assisted the Tasmanian Women's hssociation in orgnniaing and conduoting the Meeting which was voted $\therefore$ great success. OUTSTANDING EFRFORMANCES

There hove been many very promising performexs during the year. Cutstanding performer has been John Denholm of the Eastern Suburbs Club, who holds the Tasmanian Junior Mile record of $4 . \min .18 .8$ secs, and the 880 yards record of 1 min. 52.8 secs. Still a Junior for another year, he has reached the best fustralian times and ran third in the Junior 880 yards Championship and a very close second in the Junior Mile in the Australian Notional Championships in Pexth, W. A. We are all hoping that he reaches the ultimate on the running track.

Of equal merit is the brilliance of the Southern Junior
Reliay Team - J. Denholm ( 880 yards), S. Jennett ( 440 yards), T. Cashion (220 yards) and B. Reid (220 yards), who established the Mile Medley Relay record of 3 mins. 51.6 secs. at North Hobart on 28 th Jonuary 2960 under adverse weather conditions. This performance has been loudly praised in Amateur fthletic circles throughout iustralia. CINDER TPRZCK.

Your Council has been regotiating with the Hobart City Council for the establishment of a cinder track in Hobart. The City Council hos given us a very favorable hearimg, and the indications are that a section of the reclamation area at New Town Bay will be made available for this purpose. It is hoped the track will be ready well before the holding of the Australian National Chempionships in Hobrt in 1966.

FINANCE.
The financial position is a satisfactory one There is a small credit balance and there ure no outstanding heary comnitinents. For the first time in the history of the Association moneys have been invested. A sum of $£ 200$ has been invested in Hydro Electric Comission Loan 1962 , and $£ 100$ Commonweal th Loan 1976.

## STATE REPRESENMATION

Your issociation was represented in both Track and Field and Cross Country in Australin Championships during the year. The selected team for the 10,600 Metres Cross Country Championship of iustralia in Melbourne last August was B. Woods, C, Crack and E. Scott (Noxthern 3ranch) and R. Nichols (Southern Branch). Because of fog: a disruption in the Air Transport to idelbourn pre-cluded the Northern members from taking part.

## AMATEUR ATHEPIC UMICUS CONGFBRNCES.

This year's Annusl Conference was held in Perth, and your Association was represented very creditably by Messrs. N. G. Hutton and C.A. Wise, An alteration to the Constitution of Amateur Status of Football boundary Umpires as sucgested by lasmania is of interest to your officials and runners.

## TEPRESEITATIVE TEAMS.

A plan for finsncing representative teans has been agreed to and the method of selection of teans will be besed on that adopted by the selectors for the athletic section for this year's Olympic Games. COACHING.

The question of coaching is always a difficult one, and greater emphasis will be placed on this section of activities during the forthcoming year. Two very fine lectures were given $b_{y}$ Commttee Menber, Nir. R. Forter, during the year, one on the Physiological Basis of Training, and the other on the Psychological approach to Training.

Mr. N.J. Huddock, who has been Secretary-Ireasurer, of the
