PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The highlights of the 1991/2 Season have been provided by the achievements of the athletes. They have surpassed all previous efforts from this State. We have three (3) athletes selected in the squad to represent Australia at the Olympic Games in Barcelona.

Gail Luke, Susan Andrews and Simon Hollingsworth have all been successful in being selected in the Australian Olympic Squad. This is the only time that Tasmania has had more than one (1) representative selected in a track and field team for one (1) Olympic Games. On behalf of all the members of Athletics Tasmania I express to these athletes our very best wishes and good luck in their quest for glory in Barcelona.

At the Australian Senior and Under 20 Championships in Adelaide the State team won six (6) Gold Medals compared to Western Australia seven (7), South Australia three (3) and the A.C.T. two (2). This result makes Tasmania a relatively strong State in national track and field competition compared with the larger states. The Tasmanian athletes are now held in great respect by their peers from other states, a dramatic change from the past when a Tasmanian was not considered a chance of being a medalist.

Our under age athletes also continued to be very successful. Andrea Hughes, Steven Kingston and Brendan Hanigan being selected in the squad to go to the World Junior Championships in Seoul. While a number of other athletes have been selected during the year to represent Australia at various events overseas.

The other very important achievement has been the honour of an I.A.A.F. Veterans Pin awarded to Mr Graeme Briggs A.M. On behalf of Athletics Tasmania I express our great pleasure that Graeme should be recognised with the highest award given by the I.A.A.F. Graeme is a past President of Athletics Australia and was President of Athletics Tasmania from 1973/74 to 1988/89. Congratulations Graeme!

I would like to welcome Mr John Quinn the A.I.S. Coach who has been appointed to Tasmania and wish him every success as he endeavours to further improve the standard of our elite and potential elite athletes.

A new system of split Summer and Winter registrations was adopted this year. It has proved to be successful in many ways but still has some drawbacks and will no doubt be a source of discussion in the near future.

I wish to compliment the Southern Athletic Branch on their initiative in purchasing the electronic timing and video photo finish system which is a huge technological step forward.

I congratulate everyone connected with Athletics Tasmania for the part they have played in the successes of this year. The athletes have been very successful and the Officials have again worked at a high standard to present well conducted meetings throughout the state.

In conclusion I wish to thank the Promotions and Development Officer, Mr Wayne Mason, for his tireless efforts during the year, and all the members of the Board for the efforts in seeing athletics in Tasmania through another successful year. I believe we have turned the corner and the sport is about to improve its participation level as well as the profile and the performance of those athletes.

OBITUARY

For the second year in succession Tasmanian athletics has lost two (2) great stalwarts with the deaths of Mavis Ebzery O.A.M. and Des Hardstaff. Both passed away after relatively short illnesses.

Mavis who retired from the administrative side of athletics two (2) years ago had continued to act as a starter until last year completing over forty (40) years association with the sport. She helped to reform women's athletics after the war and became the inaugural Honorary Secretary of the T.W.A.A.A., a position she held until the amalgamation with the men's association in 1981. For this service she was awarded Life Membership.

Similarly Mavis was very involved on an Australian level being Tasmanian delegate to the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union and was a Life Member of that body also. She was appointed Assistant Manager/Chaperon of the 1964 Olympic Athletics team which competed in Tokyo after having been a technical official at Melbourne in 1956.

After the joining of the men's and women's association Mavis continued as Hon Secretary until her retirement in 1990. As a technical official she was on the starting panel in Tasmania, also at many National Championships, the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane in 1982 and the World Cup in Canberra in 1985.

Mavis' great service to our sport culminated in her being awarded an Order of Australia Medal.

She was Women's Athletics delegate to the Tasmanian Olympic Council and was elected Vice President of that body becoming the first woman in Australia to hold such a position. She was awarded Life Membership of the T.O.C.

Mavis was a staunch upholder of the rules and regulations which controlled athletics and will probably be remembered by many competitors for this, especially the need for all singlets to be tucked in and no ear rings or jewellery. Her influence over the years has been extremely significant and will be sadly missed.

Des Hardstaff commenced athletics as a competitor at St Patrick's College but his greatest contribution came later when his children showed ability and became extremely talented athletes. He helped with coaching, became an official and graduated to managing quite a number of mens teams to Australian Championships.

Together with his wife, Margaret, Des was a great supporter of the North Launceston Club, the Northern Branch and the Tasmanian Association. He was Track Referee at St Leonards during the last Track & Field season and always came south to act at Statewide meetings conducted in Hobart.

Des Hardstaff's friendly attitude, ready wit and great personality will be fondly remembered by all who came in contact with him both on the ground and off, especially those convivial post competition discussions.

ADMINISTRATION DIRECTOR'S REPORT

With the specific duties of Directors now reasonably well established, the administration side has settled into a fairly consistent routine with periods of fairly hectic activity at the time of state championships, team selection and organisation and others where it was relatively quiet.

Wayne Mason has again been of great assistance helping with on the spot matters occurring at the DAC and I thank him for always being willing to help.

The Board of Directors has met regularly at Campbell Town with the majority of meetings being lengthy affairs. The Executive has come together less frequently but it is proposed that it will do far more next year resulting in the Board only having to meet bi-monthly. All Directors have continued to be hard working and very responsible in their attitude and this has helped to make the past year so successful.

A special word of thanks to Beryle Woolley and Molley Clements, both Special Award Holders, who have continued to be of great assistance with typing of minutes, programmes, reports and letters.

REGISTRATIONS

The change to seasonal registrations, which resulted from discussion at the Annual Conference, certainly proved quite successful. Excluding officials and coaches there was an increase of 81 in competing athletes halting the gradual decline of the previous years. It is difficult, without having any figures with which to compare, to state exactly where and why the increase occurred. However, the North West certainly had plenty of winter registrations. It is also interesting to see the number of athletes who compete throughout the year and the relative evenness in the three (3) areas. 41 South; 48 North and 42 North West. With a discount for all year registration in 1992/93 these numbers could probably increase.

The only disappointing feature was the slight decrease in the North, highlighted by the very disappointing Newstead Central figures. It was pleasing to be able to provide competition for 25 members of New Horizons Club without them North would have been well done and this is rather worrying.

Northern Suburbs, Sandy Bay and North West clubs all had gratifying increases. It is to be hoped this can be matched by some of the Northern clubs.

HIGHLIGHTS :

Four (4) rounds of the Heavy Metal Grand Prix Throws were conducted during the season. Round 1 - SAB Interclub Round 2 NBAAT Interclub Round 3 - G T Briggs Match - Penguin and the final round at the State Championships. The competition proved a real bonus for the throwing contingent. Special thanks to Wayne Mason and Guy Adamson.

The State Championships were conducted over four (4) days allowing athletes to compete in higher age groups. It was also a bonus for multiple event athletes allowing them to compete in all disciplines before the Australian Championships where they competed very successfully. I believe this is the best mix for the Championships as it allows distance, sprinters, throwers and jumpers to compete in the full range of events. An athlete would be limited if the championships were over two (2) or three (3) days duration again.

G T Briggs Match once again proved a winner. Athlete of the Match went to Todd Apted of the Northern Team with a state record in high jump of 2.12, and the Southern Team took the \$500 prize money in a close tussle with the Northern Team.

Finally I believe that Briggs Match and Championships held around the State during the season has allowed athletes to be better suited to National Competition because of the travelling and the different competition surrounds. This can be borne out by the number of MEDALS at the Senior, U20, U18 and U16 Australian Championships.

The incorporation of the last round of the Confab Heavy Metal Grand Prix Throws meant that all throwers entered and consequently the whole schedule was thrown out. However it is much better to have too many competitors than not enough.

The North West club officials with support from quite a number from the other branches ran the meeting very well and show that they are profiting from the experience of conducting high standard carnivals.

Todd Apted of the North won the G T Briggs Trophy as the Athlete of the Meeting by setting a State High Jump record of 2.12 m. South won the \$500 prize money in an extremely close contest with North by only four (4) points. 939 to 935 with North West 570.

When Athletics Australia approved of the Relay Meet becoming part of the Mobil Grand Prix circuit, it proved advantageous to all to move the date back a week. The choice of Sunday was beneficial allowing a slightly earlier start, however by the last event, light was fading and it was extremely cold.

Added to five (5) Mobil Grand Prix events being scheduled Queensland Sugar sponsorship also became available. This together with three (3) new local sponsors and the deletion of the 120 m Gifts held to make sure that the meeting made a profit.

In keeping with the wishes of the major sponsor to keep the relays as national events; invitations were sent to those countries thought most likely to send relay teams. South Africa showed interest but could not be officially asked to compete, however Brazil after extended negotiations agreed to come to Tasmania and tour other states afterwards.

The work of Brian Roe, Australian National meeting co-ordinator, over the preceding week, made sure that all events had top class competitors with most having good depth as well.

Highlights from Tasmania's point of view were Susan Andrews' win in the Women's 400 G.P. Simon Hollingsworth's gutsy victory in the 400 m Hurdles and Gail Luke's second to Jenny Laurendet in the Women's 400 m Hurdles G.P.

Australia was too strong for a slightly undone Brazil in the 4 x 100 m Relay and although only two (2) teams contested the 4 x 400 m it almost emulated last year's dead heat with Mark Garner just catching Steven Kingston in the home straight to win by .14 sec.

Two (2) men's and one (1) women's Australian Club Relay Championships were conducted and although quite a number of interstate clubs advised they would compete only two (2) eventually started. Southern Suburbs (Qld) won the men's 4 x 100 championship; OVA the men's 4 x 400 m and Sandy Bay the women's 4 x 100 m.

Not only was the meeting a great success on the track but a good crowd of over 2000 attended ensuring a profit sufficient to offset last year's loss.

A total of 38 athletes competed at this year's Australian Championships, 12 women and 26 men. I believe this is the largest and best performed team this state has ever selected to contest these championships.

As these championships were the final trials before the squads were named to prepare for the Barcelona Olympic Games the fields were large and very competitive. Given the high standard of competition the performances of the Tasmanian team was outstanding. I was proud of the respect and esteem which officials and athletes from other parts of Australia have for Tasmanian competitors. The athletes have a highly competitive and confident attitude which is spread from the experienced athletes to the newer members.

Our medal tally was six (6) Gold; two (2) Silver and three (3) Bronze. This compares most favourably with the tallies by South Australia (3 Gold) and Western Australia (7 Gold).

Andrea Hughes won both the Senior and Under 20 Women's High Jumps to further prove her outstanding ability and potential in her chosen event. Gail Luke our most aggressive competitor was a clear and convincing winner in the women's 400 m Hurdles and she again broke the Olympic qualifying standard. Craig Watson came from behind to take the Senior Men's Shot Put in a performance below his best. Steven Kingston ran a strong race to lead all the way to win the Under 20 Men's 400 metres. In a major upset Brendan Hanigan blitzed the red hot favourite to win the Under 20 Men's 800 metres.

The Senior Women's and Men's 4 x 400 metres Relay teams performed in highly creditably manner finishing 3rd and 4th respectively.

Andrea Marquardt (Under 20 Women's 3000 metres) and Justin McDonald (Under 20 Hammer Throw) picked up Silver Medals in their respective events. Kealin Hanigan avoided the fall in the Senior Men's 1500 metres to pick up the Bronze Medal and Jarrod Shaw also won the Bronze Medal in the Under 20 3000 metres Steeplechase.

The Institute of Sport syndrome is starting to affect Tasmanian teams. In the Men's 4 x 400 metres Steven Kingston wearing his Institute singlet (his State singlet had been lost) led the first lap but was being called a Victorian because of the colour of his singlet. I believe we must decide that all members of the State Team be representatives of the State only or there is no state team at all.

SELECTION COMMITTEE - TRACK & FIELD REPORT

The Selection Committee had really just one (1) major task during 1991/92. Given individual entry for Australian Championships it was a matter of simply naming those athletes who had qualified and entered in the teams announced and in the case of the East Coast Challenge where no standards apply and where limited numbers enter, all athletes have been selected.

The All Schools Team is one that provides a real task. The Committee worked throughout the Casa Monde Tasmanian All Schools Championships analysing performances, measuring them against standards and considering those athletes who had nominated for the team but had valid reasons for not competing in the Tasmanian All Schools Championships. In the end a large team of over 60 was selected and eventually performed very creditably at the Australian Championships in Melbourne. Selection policy was reasonably relaxed to give as many athletes the opportunity for Interstate competition only excluding those for whom places were conceivably available but were too far from selection standards to be competitive. Regard was taken of results at the Championships in Hobart in 1990.

Unless the overall situation changes I would expect that the Selection Committee would work in much the same way in Season 1992/93

RECORDS

In recent years record applications have been relaxed so that performances achieved in competition at Tasmanian Championships and National Relay Meets are accepted without application.

There was no repeat of the large number of records that came through in 1990/91 because of the Australian All Schools Championships in Hobart, but there were nevertheless an impressive number of records broken and the Grand Prix circuit and Australian Championships produced a number of best on record performances.

The most significant this year was the new U13 and U14 record for which benchmarks were relaxed somewhat and in which a number of inaugural records were set.

In practice the Records Committee is a committee of one. There were no outstanding issues and records were processed on the basis of Branch recommendations in an automatic fashion. In the early part of the season walk records from the North West Coast were accepted, despite a lack of judging because the performances were compatible with those achieved in competition in Hobart and because we were not inclined to penalise athletes because of organisational problems.

The records published in the Hand Book are steadily being purged of any inaccuracies thanks to the advice of a number of scrutineers.

MARKETING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Marketing remains a developing area with problems to resolve. The main areas are publicity and promotion, sponsorship and development.

PUBLICITY AND PROMOTION:

I believe publicity and promotion is being conducted extremely well during 1991/92. We have had great support from the media in all regions and our elite athletes have provided a focus which has given the sport a profile that would be hard to improve upon. Major events in the winter season that are related to the sport, such as the City to Casino, the Burnie Ten and the Huon Valley Classic received enormous attention and the National Relays Meet achieved the same in the summer season as well as attracting large spectator crowds. The ABC, Channels Six and Nine and the Advocate, Examiner, Mercury and Southern Star have all been very supportive. I would pay tribute to Wayne Mason and the efforts he had made to keep sports journalists well informed of our activities and to John Briggs of the Mercury and Loris Dart of the Examiner who have given great support to Athletics. I can vouch for the effort because of my experiences with the Southern Star and the pressures of achieving content and regular deadlines.

Two issues of a Statewide Newsletter were produced. One by Helen Boon and one by me. The Southern Branch had a weekly newsletter and the establishment of a regular summer newsletter remains a desirable objective.

DEVELOPMENT:

Athletics Development has a strong marketing ingredient. One of the objectives is to increase participation in the sport and to engage other bodies such as schools in this process. Wayne Mason has performed an admiral job throughout the year and our capacity has been vastly increased with the arrival of John Quinn as the A.I.S. Coach in the State. John has contributed across a spectrum of activities and with the provision of clerical support in the coming season Athletics will have resources what we could have only dream of in the past.

SPONSORSHIP:

In a severe recession sponsorship is difficult. I have said all along that much of our sponsorship will be derived from supporters of the sports, links that individual Directors and others have with potential sponsors and a lot of luck. Athletics Tasmania competes with the branches, clubs individual athletes and related events for the scarce sponsorship dollar. Our budget is based on certain sponsorship component and in that sense 1991/92 has some positive features. Registrations have achieved budget projections and the National Relays Meet produced a surplus which will help make that independent of our operating budget.

We also receive considerable support through airfares from Australian Airlines and invaluable support from the Department of Sport and Recreation for provision of our Development Officer and from the Australian Sports Federation for the funding of our A.I.S. Coach.

Once again we have conducted a raffle to raise funds for Clubs and for Athletics Tasmania. The new format guarantees a reasonable return to Clubs of 65c a ticket. It has only been a partial success with 8,000 tickets. The full potential was \$5,200 to Clubs and \$6,000 to Athletics Tasmania. As it turns out only 5745 tickets were sold with profits being \$3696 to Clubs and an estimated \$2,800 to Athletics Tasmania. Perhaps the number of tickets was ambitious and if prizes had been scaled down to \$6,000 Athletics Tasmania would have benefited by an extra \$1500.

Some Clubs have supported this very well and others very poorly given that the main objective was to raise funds for athlete's support I recommend that such support be given in a way that recognises the contribution of the clubs concerned.

I still believe the raffle is worthwhile and that it should be conducted again in 1992/93 in much the same form.

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COACHING DIRECTOR - REPORT

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT CAMP:

Athletics Tasmania held its first-ever Junior Development Camp at Camp Banksia, Port Sorell on the weekend of the 1st - 3rd November 1991.

Thirty one athletes registered for the camp - South 3 North West 8 and North 20.

The venue proved ideal for such an activity with the preparation carried out by the groundsman the sites and track were in ideal condition. The catering was excellent.

The number of athletes was less than had been planned for as it was decided that a maximum of 45 would be ideal. Transport proved to be a problem from Hobart and it was felt some form of transport would be organised for the forthcoming season.

The program set for the weekend worked well and with the allowance for the long weekend in 1992 athletes will have an opportunity to add extra coaching in selected events. All athletes participated in four coaching sessions plus general warm-up and a familiarisation to Race Walking directed by Albert Johnson, ably assisted by Paula Lodge and Wayne Mason. The activity was enjoyed by all. Free time activities included swimming and recreation in the gymnasium.

The weekend proved a "plus" for athletes and coaches alike with good interaction and co-operation. The input from David Culbert - National Long Jumper and Colin Smith - National Event Javelin Coach - was greatly appreciated by all who had contact and thanks is extended to Kevin Oakey and the Athletics Australia Junior Development Fund for its support.

Thanks is also extended to Brian Roe for his donation of a Book Prize - the winner being Brett Budgeon from the North West.

COACHING AND COMPETING:

Congratulations to all athletes on a very successful season at Branch, State, National and international level. You will find all those results elsewhere in the report to substantiate what a great year this has been for our athletes and also for their coaches with all their work and support of our athletes.

You will, by now have received circulars of forthcoming seminars, clinics and courses for our coaches and coaches to be. Please make sure that your Club has representation at these initiatives for 1992 - 1993 season.

COACHING DIRECTOR

REPORT : DEVELOPMENT AND PROMOTIONS OFFICER

I have now completed two years in the position of Development and Promotions Officer which was my agreed period of employment.

During the past twelve months I have been involved on the following activities which broadly fall within the Development and promotions role

THROWS GRAND PRIX - Through the assistance of Guy Adamson we were able to secure \$1000 sponsorship from Northern firm Confab Engineering. The series was conducted through five rounds and culminated in the State Championships. The aim was to raise the profile of throwing and encouraging young throwers. I believe this was successful and while there has been criticism of the lack of media coverage there was a substantial improvement on coverage from previous years.

The Challenge was won by Gavin Ryland and Andrea Hughes.

COACHING CLINICS - The traditional September school holiday clinics were held in each Region. Numbers were down on previous years although final numbers were still in the order of 170. As the majority of participants are in the 11 - 12 age group the clinics perform a valuable role in assisting in the transition from Little Athletics. Again I was most grateful for the assistance I received from members of the ATFCA (Tas).

COACHING CAMP - Helen Boon organised the inaugural Athletics Tasmania camp and will no doubt have made mention of this in her report. The camp was well run but may need to be more event specific in future.

SCHOOLS KNOCKOUT COMPETITION - This was trialled successfully in the South of the State last season and with financial support again coming from Athletics Australia it is hoped, with the co-operation of each Branch, to extend statewide next season.

CAPS - An initiative of the Australian Sports Commission, the CAPS scheme has had a slow introduction but is starting to move with several registrations now received - all from the North of the State.

The scheme is a type of Duke of Edinburgh Award with a sporting base and has a lot going for it. I highly commend it.

NATIONAL RELAYS - This Meet achieves a high profile in the community for our sport and occupies an important place on the Athletic Calendar. I have not particularly enjoyed my involvement in this Meet in the past two years because of an unreasonably high work expectation in the final weeks before the event.

STRATEGY PLANNING - I participated with other members of Athletics Tasmania in a pilot programme on Strategy Planning for Sporting Clubs. It is a pity that further action on strategy planning has not occurred. At a later date I attended a Train the Trainer course in association with Sport and Recreation. Only one other sport was invited to attend this course.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT - On the invitation of Athletics Australia a Club Development proposal was put together in association with Andrew Willis. The proposal included items on Administration accreditation, Coaching accreditation and Strategy Planning. Some funding has been received and it is now planned to offer subsidy to Clubs representatives attending Administration courses.

SOUTHERN INTER-HIGH CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK AND FIELD - With the demise of the Education Department sports co-ordinator in the South I became directly involved in the organisation of Southern Carnivals in association with the Sport and Recreation junior Sports Officer. Without this involvement the carnivals would not have been held.

The Sport and Recreation position is likely to disappear this year throwing the complete responsibility for these carnivals, if they are to continue, on our sport. My question is - do I continue to be involved or does the responsibility fall to the Southern Branch - and other Branches should the Northern Education position disappear.

MLC SCHOLARSHIPS - I have undertaken a liaison role with MLC on the Junior Sports Scholarships.

MEDIA - With one exception, my most time consuming task has been servicing the Media.

For each State Competition, Winter and Summer, I normally provide a media release previewing the event, act as media liaison person during the Meet and provide reports following the conclusion of the Meeting. For major events separate media reports with Northern, North Western and Southern flavour respectively, both pre event and after the event are often prepared.

In addition to this I am in regular contact with media representatives. During 1991/1992 I wrote a weekly athletics column for a short period during John Brigg's absence and undertook a direct air interview each Saturday morning with Hobart Radio 7HT from January to late March.

Those critical of my lack of achievement in the Development area should be aware that this role is particularly time demanding and is normally performed out of hours but has helped, along with the performances of some outstanding athletes, to provide the best profile the sport has ever enjoyed.

In addition to the Development and Promotions role I have also been involved in a number of other tasks, some loosely related to my perceived role and some totally unrelated.

SPORT/COMMUNITY INTERACTION - I enjoy an excellent rapport with officers of Sport and Recreation and have, as a result, been involved in a number of Seminars/Meetings as a direct representative of Athletics and, on occasions, as a representative of sporting organisations in general.

I have also been involved in the organisation of the City to Casino event - a fun run with a strong community focus.

OFFICE MANAGEMENT - By far my most time consuming task has been to be available at the Athletics Tasmania Office to answer the wide ranging requests for information and queries that countless people, both within and outside the sport, direct to me. Whether the queries are related to Development and Promotions is purely incidental. Most receive a response which encourages further contact. This is good for the sport but a major inhibitory to the achievement of any task of substance.

The queries and contacts do not cease at the expiration of Office hours. There is a substantial out of hours requirement in my employment.

TECHNICAL DIRECTOR REPORT

EQUIPMENT - As a result of advertising and contact with schools the Association has acquired a number of items which could be used by Branches and Clubs.

WEIGHING OF IMPLEMENTS - Throwing equipment to be used by individual athletes at Championships have been checked and certified during the past season.

An ongoing aim of the Technical Director in 1992/93 is for liaison with Technical Officers at the main venues by regular communication so that meetings held throughout Tasmania can proceed smoothly without technical hitches.

MEMBERSHIP:

Membership in Tasmania continue at a high level with approximately seventy members. With the slight drop out and the continual new members this has been the number over the previous three years. It is good to have new members added to our numbers and reasons for people leaving the Branch usually revolves around the fact that they are no longer involved in track and field.

INSURANCE:

Coaches are becoming aware of the necessity of this and numbers are gradually increasing from two people a few years ago to seven now. As the word is spread more widely this will increase.

The highlight of the year was the announcement of the Tasmanian Institute of Sport Coach, John Quinn, and all in Tasmania are pleased to have this position filled by a person who so obviously has so much to offer our athletes and coaches.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT:

The Department of Sport, Recreation and Tourism in Tasmania has again been supportive of our coach education programme with money allocated for Level 1 courses within the State and also funds for those attending courses and seminars outside Tasmania. Financial support was also received for Esa Peltola for his time with us. The Government assistance plus the continued support from Rothmans Holdings Ltd has been greatly appreciated by the Branch as fees are able to be kept at a manageable level.

COURSES:

Three courses were again offered, as every year, one for each region, but this year the North West one was in least demand and so a small number of coaches, including a teacher from King Island, travelled to the Hobart and Launceston courses. A total of forty three attended the courses, with thirteen of these being Level 1 or extending Level 1. Our numbers still very much involve Little Athletics parents, hence the larger Level 0 attendances but coaches are using the system to increase their accreditation and knowledge by using the building system.

CLINICS / SEMINARS / CAMPS:

The Tasmanian Junior Development Clinics have taken over from the Sugar Clinics and are continuing to play an important part in the progression of young athletes. However, numbers were down this year and so the format is under review.

The first Junior Development Camp was held at the Sport and Recreation Camp at Port Sorell and proved to be a very popular weekend. Little Athletics have held camps for many years for the under 12 age group but Athletics Tasmania have not until this year introduced this progression for the slightly older athletes. Members of the coaches association are very involved in both these camps.

Tasmanian athletes and coaches were fortunate to have a variety of visiting coaches this season, commencing with Colin Smith and coach/athlete David Culbert who attended the Junior Development Camp, Gus Puopalo, who visited Hobart on the weekend of the first Grand Prix throws competition, Esa Peltola for Hurdles and Norm Osborne who during his time in Launceston was able not only to meet and talk with coaches, supervise an assessment, but also give advice on the northern relay situation - having observed a schools competition.

COACHING ARM:

It was very gratifying to receive correspondence from the Tasmanian Little Athletics Association acknowledging the Tasmanian Branch of the Coaches Association as the Coaching Arm of the T.L.A.A. Inc. This has been the case unofficially for many years but is now officially acknowledged and in place.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

MELBOURNE

10 AUGUST 1991

The seventh Annual General Meeting was held in Melbourne with President Andrew Willis and Administration Director Noel Ruddock as Tasmania's delegates.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Statement of Income and Expenditure showed a surplus of \$94,091, a big improvement on the budgeted figure of \$286. The major portion was through actual income exceeding budget estimate.

The Board agreed in May that \$44,000 of the surplus should be allocated as follows:-

\$24,000 to States for club development and recruitment.

\$10,000 to overseas tours funds, specifically for non funded athletes involved in overseas Australian team. \$10,000 to the Grand Prix Series for promotion.

The 1992 budget provides for a surplus of \$2,615.

REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER:

Sponsorship is very difficult at present but A.A. sponsors are very strong. Mobil is in the last of three (3) years, it wants to renew - probably two (2) years with an option for two (2) more.

Mars was nearly lost but has been renewed for one (1) year with A.A. to administer the present 5 star award. It will sponsor a junior development programme incorporating the All Schools Australian Championships in 1992.

Sugar Industry has renewed its sponsorship of the sugar meet series and will include Tasmania. The Junior Development sponsorship has been increased by \$100,000.

NEC is not finalised.

Channel 7 will cover the Grand Prix Series with segments on Sunday mornings. Highlights of the Championships in Adelaide will be included in the Olympathon.

NOTICES OF MOTION:

Western Australia's motion to change the name of "Open" Records to "Allcomers" was withdrawn following the Constitutions Committee's opposition.

Tasmania's motion to delete qualifying standards for entry to Australian Championships was also opposed by the Constitution Committee although it is felt it missed the point of the motion. However there was a deal of support from other States. The motion was withdrawn and referred to the Track & Field Commission. It should be followed up and not let die away.

South Australia also withdrew its motion to have all entries for Australian Championships go through State Associations.

The only motion actually voted upon was from Queensland which wanted decisions of the Jury of Appeal at all future Australian Championships to be strictly observed and not altered, set aside or over ruled by any other person. The vote was 8 all and lost on the Chairman's casting vote.

A.A. TASK FORCE:

John Landy and Barry Stanton reported on discussions to date on restructuring the administration of Australian athletics. The only concrete proposal so far is to identify 8 director portfolios and nominations be called for each individually. Proposed portfolios were Track & Field, Distance Events, State Liaison, Development, Junior Development, Marketing, Special Events and Projects Treasurer.

VICE PRESIDENT:

Denis Wilson was appointed and the President then thanked Graeme Briggs for his service to the sport and advised that he would be appointed a special consultant to A.A. to attend all Board meetings.

BRANCH REPORTS

SOUTHERN BRANCH

Having observed the Track & Field competition for a number of years I believe it is fair to say that 1991/92 has been one of the best ever. Southern athletes have performed with great distinction at National All Schools under age and Senior Championships with the culmination of the selection of Simon Hollingsworth, Gail Luke and Susan Andrews in the Australian Olympic Squad and Brendan Hanigan, Andrea Hughes and Justin McDonald in the Australian World Junior Squad. The Tasmanian Institute of Sport and the National Grand Prix, Sugar Games programme conducted by Athletics Australia, has provided unprecedented opportunities for top class Tasmanian Athletes to compete regularly at National level and establish, through top competitive meetings, the sort of performances that reflect their true potential and the efforts of local coaches. The National circuit has robbed us of some local interest but our elite athletes have shown the way for a whole new generation who are following in their footsteps.

The undoubted highlight of the season was the National Relays Meet, but the Talays Interclub Premiership was full of interest with Sandy Bay re-exerting their supremacy in the men and snatching a breathtaking last round win in the women's competition from Eastern Suburbs and Northern Suburbs.

Southern athletes dominated selections for the State representative teams and we can take pride in the achievement of Andrea Hughes (National Senior and U20 High Jump Champion), Gail Luke (National 400 metres Champion), Brendan Hanigan (National U20 800 metres Champion) and brother Kealin (National Bronze Medallist 1500 metres), Justin McDonald, Silver Medallist in the U20 Hammer Throw and many others.

Once again competition conducted by the Southern Athletic Branch ran like clockwork and this was a great tribute to the work of our dedicated band of officials and the excellent efforts of Lynn Andrews and Chris Wilson in encouraging and developing a new generation of qualified and enthusiastic officials.

The level of involvement by Southern athletes was rewarded by a win in the Briggs Match and by Sandy Bay in the statewide league. The Southern Branch enjoyed a high level of media publicity through Channel 6, ABC television and radio. 7HO, the Mercury and the Southern Star. We must pay tribute to the Mercury Senior Sports Journalist, John Briggs whose dedication to Athletics has been of great value to our sport.

The great technical innovation of the season with the purchase and operation of the video-electronic timing system which has eliminated once and for all concerns about manual timekeeping and judging. Chris Wilson and son Shaun have made a great contribution to Athletics through the establishment and operation of this system.

The Southern Athletic Branch Winter Programme was a great success and Winter Director, Peter Keenan and his Committee have earned the enthusiastic and growing response from the distance running fraternity for the programme they provided in 1991 and for the planning that they have put into an expanded programme in 1992.

The Southern Branch was strongly represented in Interstate and National competition, although the ranks were a little depleted through the absence of Michael Dalton, Dean Giblin and Russell Foley. Andrea Marquardt has gone from strength to strength and has earned International representation for her efforts.

The Branch as also conducted a strong winter walking programme and Ricky Cooke represented Australia at the World Cup in California and he and Greg Robertson produced fine performances in the 20 kilometre Olympic trial in March.

All in all Branch activities have been particularly active and successful throughout the season and I am sure our new President, Wayne Fletcher, is well satisfied with the results of the strenuous efforts that he has applied on behalf of the Branch. He has been supported by a Board of Management which, for the first time in a number of years, was fully manned.

The Clubs have been active and successful throughout the season and coaches have tirelessly and selflessly supported our growing band of athletes. 1991/92 was a great year and the foundation for an even better year in 1992/93.

All Directors had their jobs, these were done, thus making my job easy.

FINANCE

The financial statement has been changed from Receipts & Expenditure to Income & Expenditure. This means that only items directly attributable to the year ended 30 April are included regardless of when the money is received or paid. The final balance is a true indication of whether the Association has made a profit or loss on the year. So far the past year income exceeded expenditure by \$4809.48 which is very pleasing indeed.

Under the new system it is possible to prepare a Balance Sheet although only a partial one listing assets and liabilities. In future the growth or otherwise in members funds will be possible.

The major raffle shows a profit to the Association of \$3124.00 although this could be varied in that the actual cost of the two major prizes will not be known until they are taken and the discount allowed calculated. Also it is very disturbing to have two clubs still owing money on the tickets sold. Newstead Harrier Club owes \$729.00 and Western Suburbs \$108.60. The profit is shown as a liability held in suspense in the Balance Sheet pending a decision by the Board of Management as to its allocation.

The income and expenditure of the National Relays meeting have not been included as, although the Association's bank account is used the meeting is conducted by a separate sub committee. The amount of \$2269.00 shown in the Suspense Account is the accumulated profit over all six meetings.

A pleasing feature was that registration fees were slightly higher than budget and nearly all Championship and Intrastate meetings were profitable.

Although the Association's financial position is reasonable at present there is no place for complacency. The Government Grant for 1992 has not been received to date due to the inability to finalise contracts and even so next year the subsidy for the Development Officer's salary will be reduced by \$2500.00. In addition an office assistant has been employed as a result of the appointment of John Quinn and her salary is the responsibility of A.T. Athletics Australia has also indicated that the Mars Grant for the Five Star Award will be cut if an additional thirty schools are not recruited next year.

Sponsorship is always of concern - not only the obtaining of new businesses but the retaining of old ones. In the present climate it is always possible that the existing commitments will not be renewed.

The No 2 Account Statement has remained as a Statement of Receipts & Payments so some items from last year are included because the transaction took place in this season. There is also an amount of \$740.00 still to be received for the Pacific School Games.
