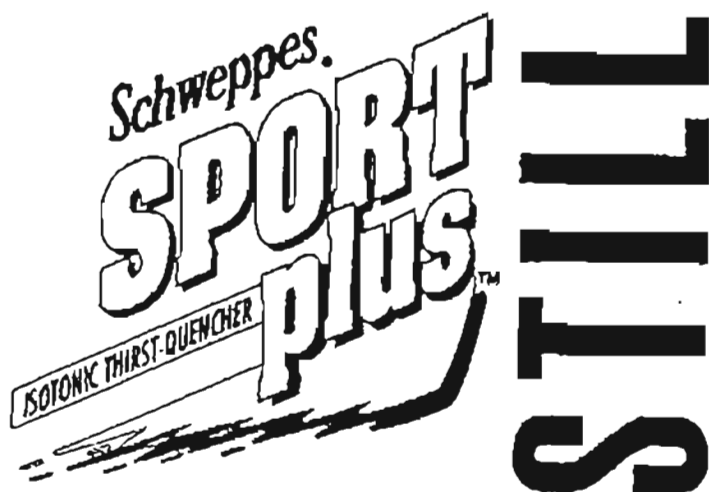

PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is with pleasure that your Board presents the Fourteenth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

The year has been rather low key, although many high spots are noted. First up a new look State 10km Road Title, in conjunction with the *Sheraton/Budget Fun Run* was held. This event was well organised by Peter Keenan and Road Running Director Mike Harding.

Within a month we were conducting the *APPM/Tigerhead* 2nd Australian Mountain Running Titles on Mt. Wellington. Although the numbers were not as high as anticipated the competition was fierce. In the Open Womens event Louise Fairfax was beaten for first place in the last kilometre and Daniel Smee won the Australian Short Course Title for Men. Louise was subsequently selected in the National Team and finished 11th in the World Trophy Cup, two places better than the Australian Title holder.

Glen McCarthy and Justin McDonald went with the Australian Espoirs Team to Malaysia and performed creditably.

The *Cadbury Winter Grand Prix* was a great success. Well done Mike Harding for his excellent commitment and hard work.

The *Talays Tasmanian Cross Country Championships* were held in wet weather at Trevallyn, however this did not dampen anyone's spirits and many good performances were seen. The Tasmanian Team suffered from the heat at the Australian Titles in Melbourne, with Mandy Westbrook being our best performer.

The Tasmanian Half Marathon Team caused an upset (but not in our minds!!) by taking the Teams silver medal at the Australian Title at Lake Macquarie. Well done to the athletes and thanks to Paul Garrott for his assistance as resident manager.

On the Track the State All Schools was first up with many fine performances, which were carried over to the National Titles in Canberra. The Briggs Match was disappointing but appears to be too soon in the season for the athletes.

The *Trident Seafoods National Relays and Mobil Grand Prix* was an excellent event. Gainsford's 200m run was sizzling, as was Hollingsworth's and Hanigan's hometown runs.

During the Australian Grand Prix Series Andrea Hughes had the right wind behind her with a great leap of 1.91m, a State record.

The *Talays State Track & Field* Titles had many fine performances but needs tidying up to avoid large gaps which makes it a boring spectacle.

The Australian Open/Under 20 Track & Field Titles were superb for entertainment but too over officious. Sitting on the judges stand it was hard for me to refrain from shouting encouragement. Hollingsworth, with a State Record in his heat and again in the final, was excellent but not good enough to win, however he won the Grand Prix Series. Kylie Turner's run in the Under 20 800m was so close as the silver medal just went by. Hanigan's run was electric, what more can be said!! Fitzpatrick, competing out of his age group, again showed his maturity with an excellent silver medal performance. There were many other fine performances and state records set.

The Australian Underage Titles were well organised and conducted. The congratulatory letter from Athletics Australia praising us was very welcome. The unique 1-2-3 in the Under 18 Decathlon was fantastic. I felt proud when presenting the medals to James Fitzpatrick, Nathan Wheldon and Geoff Gibbons, and to Ashley Howlett for his Under 16 win. Many other top class performances were recorded.

Our resident International competitor this year was Maryann Murray who was selected for Australian Teams for five trips between November and April, competing in Ekidens and the World Cross Country Championships. A great effort!!

Congratulations also to the three H's: Hanigan, Hollingsworth and Hughes for their selection in the Australian Commonwealth Games Team.

Chris Wilson must be praised for his work with the Australian Officials Subcommittee in reshaping the officials training to ensure we have better allround officials.

Behind the scenes, the office at the Domain was revamped to make it more professional looking. Kevin has been finding his way. During the year Glen McCarthy worked as the Mars 5 Star co-ordinator with plenty of zest and excellent results. He also coordinated the Schools Knockout Competition which was very demanding on all resources, especially officials.

Some directors are leaving their duties to the General Manager. This does not work out!! I believe that if more people are prepared to help our sport then all jobs would be made easier. Do not complain, accept a position on the Board and have your ideas put into practice!!

The Department of Tourism, Sport and Recreation must be thanked for their continued support.

Schweppes again sponsored our Junior Development Squads and Rita Whitehouse must be thanked for her excellent work in this area.

GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

I have much pleasure in presenting my first full report as General Manager of Athletics Tasmania.

The last year has been a tremendous learning experience for me, observing for the first time the delivery of our sport in Tasmania from the grass roots level.

The year has been a busy one with many teams and championships being co-ordinated. Perhaps the highlights of the season were the conduct of the Trident Seafoods National Relays and the Australian Underage Track & Field Championships. Both events were, as usual in Tasmania, excellently conducted. Congratulations are extended to the organising committees of both meets. A special thank you is also extended to all the officials who, as always, showed professionalism, enthusiasm and commitment to the conduct of all meets throughout the year.

On the administrative front Athletics Tasmania is progressing slowly but surely towards a more efficient association. The regular mailout to all clubs has ensured that everyone is aware of Athletics Tasmania's activities. The introduction of a state newsletter will hopefully extend this communication path to all the athletes as well. The office renovations have mostly been completed and I am sure that everyone will agree that the Athletics Tasmania office now has a more professional and pleasant look. In the next year it is anticipated that the announcer and timing equipment will be relocated to its own home, allowing additional space in the office for new staff.

I still have some concerns with regards to the Board and Committee structure of the sport. It was disappointing to have two important portfolios on the Board remain vacant and for many of the committees to not even meet during the year. For all clubs and members to have their input on the running of the sport I believe the committee network needs to be strengthened and all board positions filled. We cannot always rely on the same small band of people to do the work. I would ask all members, especially parents of athletes, to consider how they may be able to assist in the running of our sport.

Without doubt the most exciting news of the last year was the announcement of Sydney as the host of the 2000 Olympic Games. With this announcement come a responsibility for our sport. As the banner sport on the Olympic calendar we now have the responsibility of ensuring strong and large representation of athletes in the team. As well as supporting our talented athletes in their endeavours we all need to address issues such as grass roots participation and talent identification. It will be a long time before we again have such a major event to promote and develop our sport. Lets make the best use of it now.

I would like to extend my thanks to all our major sponsors for their support in the last year. Also grateful thanks to the Board, especially Wayne Fletcher, Graeme Briggs and Noel Ruddock, for all their input and support in the last year. And finally many thanks to Karen Leavey, who on many occasions worked well beyond her paid hours without complaint and often dealt with the workload of two people.

REGISTRATIONS

The big disappointment of the past season was the large decline in North West registrations, a total of 84 athletes left the club. The two other regions showed a small increase in competitors but, rather surprisingly, a drop in officials. All year registrations increased, in both men and women, with a total of 84 athletes, up 38 from last year.

Sandy Bay and Newstead Harriers, the two oldest clubs, had big increases, 29 and 28 respectively. Sandy Bay has returned to its 1992/93 numbers whilst Newstead Harriers have increased 50 in the last two years, getting back to the numbers it used to have. The decrease by Eastern Suburbs and Northern Suburbs of 11 athletes each was rather disappointing. It is hoped that this trend can be halted and also that the smaller clubs, especially those with under 30 members, can recruit strongly for 1994/95.

FINANCE DIRECTORS REPORT

For the year ended 31 March 1994 expenditure exceeded income by \$2412.89. There was a donation of \$1100 to enable a fax machine to be obtained and thus members accumulated funds declined by \$1312.89 to stand at \$28871.78 as at 31 March 1994.

However, not included in total income of \$55323.78 was an amount of \$9877.52, the net proceeds of Australian Championships conducted during the year. Such level of income will not be available next year.

Income from registration fees was \$1260 below budget and continued the decline in recent years. Receipts of \$21990 from this source represented 39.7% of total income or 48.4% if the proceeds of the Australian Championships are removed from the calculation. Clearly, the system of registration, the method of collection and the quantum of the fee are issues which must be addressed if financial viability is to be achieved. Apart from intra-state meetings and State Championships there is not any other significant source of income available to the Association. Sponsorship nowadays is confined to specific projects and not available for general purposes.

MARKETING DIRECTORS REPORT

(Position vacant this year)

As a result of this portfolio not being filled this year it was left to me to work on various marketing issues. In the 1993/94 year all sponsors have been maintained and packaged into specific programs for the sport. They are as follows:

- * Department of Tourism, Sport & Recreation: the government grant for 1994 was again substantial and well received. A 37% increase in the allocation has enabled Athletics Tasmania to initiate the employment of a part-time Junior Development Officer.
- * Cadbury: have continued their sponsorship of the Athletics Tasmania Winter Grand Prix series and the Tasmanian Marathon. This expanded program also includes for the first time a Schools Cross Country Grand Prix.
- * Schweppes: again supported the Junior Development Squad and its training and education program, though at a reduced amount to last year.
- * Talays: as well as supplying valuable support in the stocking of the Athletics Tasmania State Uniforms, they were again the major sponsor of the State Track & Field Championships.
- * Trident Seafoods: again tremendous support was received for our major meet of the year. Unfortunately Trident Seafoods will not be continuing as major sponsor of the Relays next year. Athletics Tasmania would like to extend sincere thanks for their long support and belief in our ability to conduct a world class event.
- * Ansett Airlines: through a National airline agreement Athletics Tasmania were able to secure an agreement for discount travel for all our members. This has made the cost and organisation of travel much more economic and efficient.
- * Tasmanian Institute of Sport: have continued to offer valued scholarships to our leading athletes that has allowed them to compete outstandingly on the national and international scene.

At this stage no new sponsors have been secured this year. Hopefully, with some new ideas, this can be rectified in the next year.

One other important area of the Marketing portfolio that has been neglected as a result of a lack of a director has been the media promotion of our events. A concentrated effort needs to be made to increase the output of media releases for all events and issues concerning athletics. The more exposure we can obtain in the media the more we can offer to sponsors as "value for money". So any assistance in this area would be greatly appreciated. Despite this thanks are extended to John Briggs (Mercury), Catherine Phillips (Examiner), Nigel Lane (Advocate) and Jaylene Seabrook (Southern Star) for their ongoing support of athletics in the newspapers.

TASMANIAN TRACK & FIELD DIRECTORS REPORT

Statewide competition for the Track & Field season was scheduled as shown below:

- * 5 Dec 1993 - G.T. Briggs Match and State Championship Relays for U14, U16 & U20 (4x100m & 4x400m for Men & Women) at Penguin.
- * 23 Jan 1994 - State Grand Prix Meet at St.Leonards.
- * 5/6 Feb 1994 - State Multiple Events for Open, U20, U18 & U16 (Men and Women) at Penguin.
- * 6 Feb 1994 - State 10000m Championships for Open Men and Women and State Track Walking Championships, except Open and U20 5000m, at Penguin.
- * 26 Feb 1994 - State Championship relays for U13, U15 and U18 (4x100m & 4x400m for men & Women) at the Domain as a prelude to the Trident Seafoods National Relays.
- * 5/6/7 Mar 1994 - all other State Track & Field Championships at the Domain.

On 26 Oct 1993 I distributed a memorandum to members of the Track & Field Committee (i.e. the Directors of Track & Field competition in each Branch) detailing recommended formats and events for the Briggs Match and the State Grand Prix Meet. Sadly I received only one response (which was most welcome) and that was from a person who was not a member of the committee. Briefly, the proposal for the Briggs Match was that there be two competitors from each team in each event, men and women, for Open, U18, U16 and U14. The match went ahead in that format. Because of the nature of the Grand Prix concept, it was proposed that the meet be conducted in four divisions:

- Division 1: the best 8 in each event.
- Division 2: the remainder of A grade (if any), B and C grade.
- Division 3: D, E and F grades.
- Division 4: G, H and I grades in selected events.

As the scheduled date neared it was obvious that there had not been any thought given to the determination of the best 8 athletes in each event (only one Branch had supplied any results to the Athletics Tasmania office). Consequently on 13 Jan 1994 I distributed a memorandum to each Branch to the effect that it would be impracticable to stage the meet. That memorandum did not draw a reaction so, regretfully, the meet lapsed.

The Briggs Match was conducted in the format which I had proposed but support was not great, despite the excellent facility at Penguin and the continual calls for tougher competition. By comparison the entries in the relays on the same day were good.

Entries in the decathlon, heptathlon and multiple events were sparse and, as such, disappointing. The entries in the Open 10000m events were abysmal but the walks titles on the same day attracted a reasonable response given the numbers of track walkers in the state.

The entries in the U13, U15 and U18 relays which were held prior to the Trident Seafood National Relays were pleasing and the events provided good entertainment for those who traditionally arrive early for the meet.

In an attempt to provide a more attractive presentation, the format of the principal Tasmanian Championships meet at the Domain was changed from previous years in that all distances and field disciplines remaining for decision were held on each day in one group or another. There were not any complaints about that format which does provide a little more variety to the program. Entries were down a little on previous years and the nearness of the Australian Open & Under 20 Championships in Sydney a week later had an adverse effect in some events. It is apparent that athletes are selective in the events in which they enter. Years ago the majority of members entered the championships but that attitude has changed. The conduct of the competition on each day was of high standard.

CROSS COUNTRY, ROAD RUNNING & ROAD WALKING DIRECTORS REPORT

The following State events were conducted in 1993:

- * Cadbury Tasmanian Marathon
- * Tasmanian Half Marathon
- * Tasmanian All Schools Cross Country
- * Talays Tasmanian Cross Country
- * Tasmanian 10km Road
- * Cadbury Grand Prix Series

The 1993 Cadbury Tasmanian Marathon were again conducted over the flat course at Seven Mile Beach on Sunday 7th February, 1993. Conditions were atrociously hot for marathon running (over 30 degrees) and all athletes were closely monitored throughout the event. The numbers of entries were disappointing but shows the continuing decline in interest in marathon running in this state.

The 1993 Tasmanian Half Marathon was held on Sunday 30th May 1993. It was scheduled to be held at Brighton but was subsequently transferred to Lauderdale - Roches Beach, allowing for a suitable area for presentations but unfortunately involved using a public road that carries a degree of traffic. This was not desirable but unfortunately unavoidable. In future if this course is to be used again it should be an out-and-back course and Ringwood and Mannata Streets should be closed.

This years Tasmanian All Schools Cross Country was conducted by the North West and was held at Fulton Park, Forth. Again weather conditions were not good (wet this time) but despite this a flood of late entries saw eventual numbers swell to over 220 athletes. These runners represented 69 of Tasmania's schools with the leading school being Mt.Carmel who brought a bus load of students from Hobart. All competitors were issued with a participation certificate to record name, event and time. This proved to be a nuisance as athletes were seeking their times while officials were trying to work out team results. This should be catered for in future with a specific official. Special thanks should go to Ross Warren and his team who organised this years event.

This years event saw a return of approx \$900 to Athletics Tasmania from the 220 athletes entries. 500 athletes would see over \$2000 returned. To do this Athletics Tasmania should consider offering a 1500m event for Under 9 or 10 age groups and also conducting the event in the south as it is some time since it has held there.

The Talays Tasmanian Cross Country was held at Trevallyn Dam, Launceston on Saturday 7th August, 1993. Good performances were recorded over a tough course with conditions being slippery with intermittent rainy periods. 130 athletes competed, with Newstead Harriers Club winning the teams section of the Tasmanian Championships. The number of athletes competing in the Under 12 age group was pleasing and much of the credit for this should go to Newstead Harriers who are actively promoting our sport to the young. This should be an example to all other clubs.

The Tasmanian 10km Road Championships continues to be run with the Sheraton/Budget Fun Run. I feel that the Fun Run detracts from the importance of a State Championship and would suggest that it be held at either end of the winter season in conjunction with the Underage Road Championships.

The Cadbury Grand Prix Series were conducted over three rounds and was again generously sponsored by Cadbury. The award for the best club was won easily by Newstead Harriers Club. Individual winners were:

The job should also be split into two positions (Road/Cross Country and Road Walks) so that both areas are effectively covered.

In conclusion may I offer the current Winter Director my best wishes and urge all athletes to have positive input into the sport. We should all endeavour to introduce one athlete to the sport each year and more importantly, ensure that they register.

No officials grading exams were conducted during the season as Athletics Australia's new exams and regrading were not complete. These are now available for officials to sit for, with the IAAF Handbook now able to be used during the exam.

A number of seminars were conducted with the assistance of the SAB during the year and all were well attended by officials. These were High Jump, Pole Vault, Long & Triple Jump, Wind Guage and Starting.

It was pleasing to see the number of officials who made themselves available for the Athletics Tasmania events during the season. The major meets, the Trident Seafoods Relays, State Championships and the Australian Underage Championships were all well conducted.

A new IAAF Handbook will be available from the start of the season with a number of rule changes. All officials should obtain a copy.

Athletics Australia appointed a number of Tasmanian officials as Chiefs for the Australian Underage Championships in Hobart and I congratulate them on their appointments. Three Tasmanian officials applied to officiate at the Australian Open/Under 20 Championships at the new ground in Sydney; Brendon Hill (Call Room), Shaun Wilson (Photo Finish) and Wayne Fletcher (Walks Judge and Throws). Congratulations and well done to all three. Also, I was appointed by Athletics Australia as Technical Delegate for Administration.

TECHNICAL DIRECTORS REPORT

The 1993/94 season has once again seen a National Championships in the State. The Under 14, Under 16 and Under 18 event followed a highly successful National Relays meeting.

Resurfacing parts of the Domain track allowed Hobart to retain its position as one venue where National records can be broken in a wonderful setting, when conditions are suitable.

The major thrust is again to have the St. Leonards track resurfaced. To this end, proceeds from the State Raffle were added to the fund established for this purpose. It is hoped that this major task will be undertaken at the end of the 1994/95 season. Lobbying of the State and Federal Governments plus support from the Launceston City Council will be vital if this initiative is to be successful.

In Hobart the legacy of conducting National Championships was the major updating of equipment. New throwing implements, as well as trolleys to transport equipment to competition sites, are real assets. Thanks to Chris Wilson for the design and implementation. New Pole Vault bags now enhance that site and new portable covers are on the drawing board. I understand that the Hobart City Council are to replace the cage for Discus/Hammer events. It is the "original" from when the Domain track was first used in 1977 and nears the end of its life span, particularly when new designs and specifications are in vogue for cages. I congratulate the Council for this initiative as the cage is just as much part of the track as the jump pits and grandstand.

At Penguin the wind gauge equipment needs to be upgraded or replaced.

I believe that the specifications for the 600gm javelin have changed or are about to change (similar to the 800gm in April 1991). If this is the case where the "rating" for the implement changes it is essential that regional committees, officials and athletes are made aware of these changes.

Finally, I would like to thank my committee; Peter McDonald (South), Mick Gibbons (North West) and David Phillips (North) for "keeping tabs" on the technical aspects of our competition in the past season.

COACHING DIRECTORS REPORT

In this, the "Year of the Coach" I am happy to report that Tasmania continued to produce top quality athletes at most levels due, in no small part, to the activities of coaches throughout the state.

It has also been, for the A.T.& F.C.A.(Tas.Branch), a year of review. We have looked at some endeavours that have not been as successful as we might have desired with a view to replacing them with more acceptable practices or with modifying them to suit our coaches needs and wishes. We have also conducted a survey to obtain a picture of coaching throughout the state and determine where we can best be of assistance to our membership.

Throughout the year the Association met regularly in each region on a rotational basis. Each meeting was accompanied by a presentation on a particular topic which was followed by general discussion on the same. These proved to be interesting and fruitful for those attending and I trust we will see more members attending in future.

Several seminars were held with coaches coming from all areas to attend. Coaches of athletes selected in the Schweppes Squads were also invited to attend any presentations involving the squads.

Separate Level 0 and Level 1 Accreditation Courses were held with reasonable participation. At a National level the new Level 0 (Orientation) Course Handbook was completed.

I am concerned that there are a number of active coaches who are reluctant to seek further education, via seminars etc., due to financial constraints. I urge all clubs to encourage their Club Coaches to increase their knowledge and coaching skills by giving them financial support to attend educative sessions. I feel there is also a case for clubs to assist with membership fees and, particularly, insurance. Most coaches receive little or no financial reward and the expenses (such as petrol costs) are all met by the individual coach. It would be better to see them assisted in these areas, leaving them some financial leeway for the purchase of equipment, coaching texts, etc. I would be interested to hear from others on this matter.

I acknowledge with thankful respect the activities and assistance of the Executive of A.T.& F.C.A.(Tas.Branch) and I offer my thanks and appreciation to all coaches who contributed, in any way, to the health of Athletics in Tasmania during the past year. I urge them to increase their support for the association. I am also grateful to those of my colleagues who gave me their personal support and advice.

I acknowledge with appreciation the support given by Kevin Oakey and Karen Leavey (often above and beyond the call of duty) and the invaluable guidance of AIS Coach and A.T.& F.C.A.(Tas.Branch) President, John Quinn.

I wish all coaches a rewarding year in season 1994/95.
