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ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT SINCE RE-AFFILIATION - SEASON 1960/61.

Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting,
held at the National Fitness Council Rooms, 59
Collins Street, Hobart on Saturday, 28th July, 1962
at 2.0 p.m.

LADIES,

It is very pleasing to report that the 1961/62 season has been very successful. The total number of members for the season was 190.

During the Athletic season two new Clubs in the South affiliated with our Association, and this helped to create a keener interest in Saturday morning inter-club competition.

Our season opened at the end of October, and Inter-Club competition commenced on the 11th November.

The State Selection Trials were held on Saturday, 13th December at the North Hobart Oval, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Championships held in Adelaide on Saturday 29th and Monday 31st January, 1962:

Elaine Frawley	- 100, 220, 440 yards, and Relay
Sue Rush	- 100, 220 yards, and Relay
Rosemary Page	- Relay
Pam Allender	- Relay.

On Saturday 16th December at our Inter-Club Meeting, Sue Rush broke the Australian Junior Record for the 220 yards, her time being 24 secs.

The high standard of times set for girls to attain selection in the Tasmanian Team came in for a great deal of unwarranted and adverse criticism, but the inclusion of the only two members of the Team to break the qualifying standards proved the wisdom of the Selectors attitude when Elaine Frawley and Sue Rush were selected for the British Empire and Commonwealth Games Squad.

The Association extends its congratulations to both of these girls, and wishes them every success for the trials, which will be held on Saturday 13th October in Melbourne.

An invitation from the V.W.A.A.A. was extended to Elaine Frawley to compete at the Box Hill Athletic Carnival, which was held at Olympic Park on Boxing Day. Elaine proved her ability by running second to Glenis Beasley in the 100 and 220 yards.

The greatest thrill on the first day of the Australian Championships was seeing our Tasmanian girl, Sue Rush, standing on the Victory Dais receiving the acclamation of the crowd as Junior Champion of Australia in the 100 yards.

Elaine performed very well under adverse conditions, having to run with her toe in a splint, and we feel that a great deal of courage and determination was displayed by Elaine. It was a fitting reward when she ran third in the 220 yards open event.

All Tasmanians present were very elated when it was announced that Elaine's time for the heat was the fastest, her time being 24.4 secs.

It was a great surprise for other States when Rosemary Page won the 220 yards Invitation event, her time being 26.6 secs.

Our youngest team member, Pam Allender, who shows great promise as a relay runner, performed very well.

On the team's return from Adelaide, Sue Rush stayed in Melbourne to compete at a Carnival conducted by the V.A.A.A. Sue performed very well to run third to the Australian Champion, Glenis Beasley, in the 100 and 220 yards.

The Association was very disappointed in the Triangular Meeting held in Launceston on Saturday 10th February by the lack of competition provided in various events.

It is felt that after it had been brought to the notice of the various centres about providing competitors for each event, that something definite would have been done by the Selectors.

It may be necessary in the future for Selectors to take a firmer stand to ensure that girls selected for events shall compete.

The Shield was retained by South.

For the first time a Tasmanian Sub-Junior and Junior Team competed at a Triangular Meeting between Victoria and South Australia at Royal Park on the 10th and 11th March. Sue Rush dominated the sub-junior events; winning the 75 and 100 yards. Glenis Nation took third placing in the long jump, and Janice Scolyer won the Junior Javelin. The sub-junior Relay Team was third in this event.

The Association wishes to extend its congratulations to these girls for performing so well for Tasmania.

After the Trials a film evening was held at the Imperial Hotel, at which the Tasmanian Team was announced.

Our thanks are extended to Mr. John Small for the splendid way he coached our Tasmanian Relay Team.

At the conclusion of the State Championships a presentation evening was held and Certificates were presented to the girls by our President, Lady Park.

"F. J. KOHL" SHIELD. Safety Bay retained the Shield with a total of 109 points.

Other placings were - Devon 57 points
Newstead 24 points

Entries for the Tasmanian Championships were very heavy in the Juvenile and Sub-Junior; and good performances were shown by many girls. It was pleasing to note that for the first time for several years our senior fields were quite well represented.

An invitation was extended by the Forest Athletic Club to Sue and Elaine to appear at their Carnival during Easter. The 100 and 220 yards events were won by Elaine.

An honour was bestowed on the girls and the State Secretary by being invited to join the Chief Secretary, who opened the Carnival, to travel with him in the Ministerial Car.

REPORT - TEAM MANAGERESS. On Monday 22nd January, 1962, members of the Tasmanian team were farewelled at the airport by parents and friends. The crossing to Melbourne was rather bumpy, and the thoughtfulness of the V.W.A.A.A. in sending Mrs. Holden along to the airport to greet the girls was much appreciated. The trip to Adelaide was very rough, but the discomforts of the trip were soon forgotten in the warm welcome extended to us by our Liaison Officer, Mrs. Heffernan, and other South Australian officials. The Secretary of the S.A.W.A.A.A., Mrs. Cahill, was at the Grosvenor to see us settle in. Each girl had a single room, and although these were very comfortable and had all conveniences, we found that sleeping at night was very difficult.

The weather was hot and humid all the time we were there, and the nights were just as hot as the days. Our girls found the heat rather oppressive, so a lot of our time was spent at Elder park on the banks of the Torrens, and just across the road from the Grosvenor. The girls trained on the Adelaide Teachers College Oval during the mornings. The ground was hard, and it was difficult to find any shady places to rest. Our first setback occurred when Elaine injured her foot, and it was doubtful right up to the day of the Championships whether or not she would be able to compete. A colourful parade of all athletes in full uniform and preceded by their State flag, provided a very spectacular sight for the opening of the Championships. Our team of four was the smallest there, but they didn't lack supporters among the onlookers. Excitement kept mounting during Saturday afternoon every time Sue Rush carried the Tassie colours across the finishing line. The zenith of Tasmania's pride and glory was when we saw Suzann standing on the victory dais receiving the plaudits of the crowd as Junior Champion of Australia. A very gallant try by Elaine (running with her big toe in a splint) gained her third placing in her heat of the 100 yards, but only firsts and seconds went into the finals. All the girls were suffering with leg troubles, and Monday morning was a nightmare trying to get the girls fit enough to perform in the afternoon. Messrs. Allender, Cullen and Collin Cooper rendered great assistance at this time. Our next blow came when it was found that Suzann would be unable to compete in the 220 yards. Although still bothered with her injured foot, Elaine won her heat of the 220 yards, and then with a valiant do-or-die effort, gained third placing in the final. All our girls performed well, and Rosemary Page displayed great determination to win the Invitation 220 Yards. Considerable promise was shown by the baby of the Team, Pam Allender, in her relay run.

Mrs. Heffernan arranged for a convoy of cars to take the team and other Tasmanian supporters to see the lights of Adelaide from the foothills of the Lofty Ranges. On the Sunday she arranged for the team to be taken to the mountains to escape the heat. We were also entertained at her home on several occasions. On Thursday we attended a civic reception held by the Lord Mayor at the Town Hall for all teams. On Saturday night a barbecue evening was held for all the teams in the spacious grounds of the lovely home of Mr. and Mrs. Pascoe. On Monday the Presentation Evening was held at the Rex. It was a great thrill for us all to watch Sue Rush go up and receive her medal.

Then came that wonderful moment when our two Tasmanian girls, were named as members of the Empire Games Squad. This was a glorious finish to the 1962 Australian Championships for Miss Triffitt and myself. My special thanks go to Mrs. Tynan, Manageress of the Victorian Team, for the kindness and help given to me on many occasions. Thanks are also extended to Mrs. Cahill, Secretary of the S.A.W.A.A.A., and other officials for the kindness and courtesy extended to me at all times. Our gratitude and thanks go to Mr. and Mrs. Heffernan whose kindness and hospitality anticipated all our wants. Others to whom we are greatly indebted are Mr. & Mrs. Marnham, Mr. & Mrs. Innis, Mr. & Mrs. Follet, Mrs. Young and Collin Cooper. I would like to thank the girls for their co-operation, loyalty and help, and to say how proud I was to be associated with them.

Under the new allocations, due to the Championships being held annually, Queensland will conduct the 1963 Championships during the month of March.

Congratulations to Mrs. V.H. McQuiston who was elected as Manageress of the Australian Women's Athletic Team for the forthcoming British Empire and Commonwealth Games to be held in Perth later this year. Also to our new President, Mrs. E. Robinson.

DARWIN CLUB. Registrations in North-West were quite good for 1961/62 season, but senior athletes are noticeably absent especially from Darwin. Although records were not broken in Darwin, performances of many sub-junior and juvenile competitors in the near future could be outstanding, judging by standards and consistency in track events, but in field games competition was weaker than past years. Darwin athletes to show promise were Elaine Kidd, Diane Mount, Leonie Radford, Sue Lawler and Shirley Reid.

Devon have proved much stronger this year in both track and field games. Mary Hudson of Devonport High has proved herself champion of track events and her performances in the future could be watched with interest judging by her great improvement in 1962. Marlene Bellchambers has once again taken the honours in field games, although great competition was provided by Jan Scolyer and Louise Henry.

Evelyn Piper and Cynthia Adams have been most consistent in their high jumping, and Cynthia especially in track events. Toni Webb and Lea Johnston hurdled well during the season and took the honours in the Championships. In the Juvenile class, Judith Fist and Gloria Cross have showed considerable improvement.

Marlene Bellchambers again won the E. Goss Trophy for the highest aggregate in field games and hurdles over the two days of the finals.

East Devonport won the "L. Curtis" Shield for the open premier team. Points for this trophy covered all track and field games. Devon High School won the "L. Curtis" Pennant for Under 14 premier team. Best performances for the year were as follows:

DEVON WOMEN'S CLUB. This was a new club which was formed in the Devon Division on the North West Coast. It was decided to form only one Club, owing to former Clubs having tried to carry on for several years without any officials.

For Saturday morning competition it was decided to divide the Club into three teams and although numbers were rather small a very successful season resulted.

The Coastal Premiership between leading teams in Devon and Darwin was held for the first time and the Devon girls carried off both open and under age divisions.

At the State titles the Club was represented by the following strength in different age groups: Senior 2, Junior 4, Sub-Junior 1, Juvenile 7.

Considering that only six of the girls had previously appeared at these titles, the team performed very well in finishing second in the competition for the "F. J. Kohl" Shield, and our congratulations are offered to Sandy Bay, the winners. In all the Club won 10 firsts, 9 seconds, 7 thirds. Our most successful girls were in the Juvenile division, the most outstanding being C. Adams, who won the 75 and 100 yards. The Juvenile Relay Team was also successful, and four members out of the six were under 12 years of age.

In the Sub-Junior M. Hudson won the 75 yards, and was second to S. Rush in the 100 and 220 yards. In the Junior J. Scolyer won the javelin, discus and shot put, the last two were residential record throws. T. Webb won the 80 metre hurdles, and was third in the 75 and 100 yards. In the open events, M. Bellochambers retained her titles in the discus and javelin, but lost to E. Frawley in the Shot Put.

Four of the girls were selected in the Team for the Triangular Meeting against Victoria and South Australia. The girls enjoyed the trip and felt that they would benefit from the experience. J. Scolyer was successful in winning the Junior Javelin event.

Five girls from the Club were in the N.W. Coast team against North and South, and again showed their strength in the field game events by winning the javelin, discus and shot put. The winners were J. Scolyer Javelin, and M. Bellochambers Discus and Shot Put.

Other girls to perform well during the season were - J. Fist, G. Snare and R. Hudson in under age events.

It is regretted that a Branch of the Association is unable to function in the North so that inter-club meetings could be held weekly and conducted under proper conditions.

The Club would like to congratulate Wendy Claxton for winning the Club consistency trophy, and Gailie Wells as runner-up.

Congratulations are also extended to Sue Rush and Elaine Frawley for what they have done for athletics in Tasmania.

A. Y. C. CLUB. A newly formed Club which performed well during the season.

Unfortunately the Club was unable to produce girls who were sufficiently talented to compete with track athletes in the high grades, although this was not so much the case in the field games.

The aims of the administrators of this Club are firstly to encourage members to participate in athletics, to improve the standard of athletics in this State, and to see the girls go on to higher honours, but at the same time do not wish to limit the improvement of the Club only, but to athletics in general.

On the whole attendance at inter-club was good. Although the Club started out mainly with "D" grade runners, the policy of the Club was to promote girls as soon as they had matured

sufficiently. The girls' attendance at training was also very good.

It is felt that this Club cannot help but expand and grow into a powerful force. However, the immediate future will see only a gradual rise because of the ages of most of the girls, and it is also felt that within a term of five seasons inter-club competition will become more competitive.

The following girls show great promise and are expected to perform well next season: Wendy Marshall, Gay Francis, Carol Schofield, Miriam Manson, Kaye Wells, Margaret Patman and Lorna Bartlett.

EASTERN SUBURBS CLUB. With the aim of helping to further competition in Southern Tasmanian Women's Athletics, the E.S.W.H.C. was formed at the commencement of the 1961/62 athletic season. Mrs. E. Reece, wife of the Premier, accepted the office of Patroness, Mrs. J. Rush, President, Mrs. R. Malcolm Secretary, and Mrs. J. Walker Treasurer. Owing to ill health, Mrs. Walker resigned, and Miss L. Belcher was elected into the vacant office. Mr. Ted Cullen is our Club coach, and a very valiant supporter of our small but hard working committee.

A total number of twenty four girls have competed at inter-club competitions during the season, the outstanding performer being Sue Rush, who was cleared from Sandy Bay and ran during the season under our colours, red and white.

Sue represented the State at the Australian Women's Championships in Adelaide to become Australian Junior Champion in the 100 yards. She is also holder of the Australian 200 yards Junior, her time being 24 secs. Sue also represented at the Triangular Meeting in Melbourne and has been chosen as a member of the Empire Games Training Squad.

At the Tasmanian Women's Championships 1961/62 season, Certificates were awarded to the following girls -

Other promising runners include G. Polder, Sue Rwell, V. Reid, V. Pullen, J. Donnelly and L. Smith.

A Christmas party was held for the girls at the home of the President. Each Club girl received a small Christmas gift.

Other activities for money raising have included public subscriptions, raffles, barbecues and a cabaret evening.

At the conclusion of the season a trophy night was held in the Moonah School Gymnasium. An attractive memento certificate was awarded to each girl in the Club as a souvenir of our first season, and 14 valuable trophies were all donated by interested supporters of the Club. The Club Coach and Secretary were each presented with an attractive gift.

A sum of £37/5/- was raised and handed to Miss Triffitt, Secretary T.W.A.A.A., in an effort to help pay off the debt of sending the representative team to Adelaide, and the Club completed the season financially stable.

SANDY BAY HARRIER CLUB. This season it is very pleasing to report that the Club has maintained the number of members which it had last season. Thirty members affiliated with the Club this season.

It was very pleasing to see two new Clubs join the Southern Association this season. The joining of these new Clubs made Saturday Inter-Club Competition much keener. But in the final stages of the season Sandy Bay's experience and all-round strength proved too much for the other Clubs and they ran out easy winners in the Inter-Club Competition. Although Elaine Frawley lost her 220 yards State Residential Record to Sue Rush, an ex member of our Club, she made up for it by setting State Residential records in the 440 yards (57.5 secs.) and the Shot Put (33 ft. 5½ ins.). Elaine also ran an excellent time for 220 yards (24.3 secs.). Jennifer Batchler also broke a State Residential record in the Discus, with a throw of 95 ft. There were some close finishes in the "B", "B Reserve", "C", "D" and "D Reserve" grade sprints.

In the Club Championship Elaine Frawley was once more Club Champion. Elaine won the 75 Yards, 100 Yards, 220 Yards, Javelin and Shot Put, and came third in the Broad Jump and Discus. Bev. Lewis was runner-up Club Champion, winning the Broad Jump and coming second in the High Jump, 75 yards, Discus, 220 yards and Shot Put. Glennis Nation, Elizabeth Giblin, Pam Allender, Kayleen Patmore, Leonie Mickleborough, Julie Langdon, Margot Austin and Jenny Butler also went well. In the Juvenile, Elizabeth Read was Champion and Glennis Patmore was runner-up. Elizabeth won the Juvenile 75 yards and 100 yards, and Glennis

was second to Elizabeth in these events. Lexie Walker and Annetto Geard also performed well in the Juvenile events.

At the State Championships our Club won the "F. J. Kohl" Shield for the fifth successive year. In the Sub-Junior Division Glennis Nation won the Broad Jump and was third in the 100 and 220 yards. Jan Wilkinson won the High Jump, Discus, and was third in the Broad Jump. Others to do well were Jenny Butler, Barbara Shacklady and Carol Collier. Club members were very prominent in the recent Anzac Day Sports meeting. Glennis Nation equalled a record of 12 secs. in the under 5 100 yards, set by Elaine Frawley and Sue Rush. Elizabeth Road also equalled a record of 9.8 secs. set by Sue Rush in the Primary

School Open 75 Yards. Glennis Patmore broke a record with a time of 10.2 secs. in the Under 11 75 Yards, held by Elizabeth Read. Others to do well were: C. Bond, J. Wright and B. Shacklady. P.
