TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT SINCE RE-AFFILIATION - SEASON 1961/1962.

Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting, held at the National Fitness Council Rooms, 59 Collins Street, Hobart on Saturday, 27th July, 1963 at 2.0 p.m.

LADIES,

Once again it is very pleasing to report that the 1962/63 season has been very successful. The total number of members for the season was 180.

It is regretted that the Launceston Women's Amateur Athletic Club has gone into recess, and it is hoped that this Club will again be taking an active part in the forthcoming season.

At our last Annual Meeting Mrs. Claxton of the Exeter Club was appointed from the Association as Organiser of the Weekly Inter-Club competition, but unfortunately this competition was not as successful as it was hoped.

During September an invitation was extended by the Victorian Tomen's Amateur Athletic Association to Elaine Frawley and Sue Rush to attend two Inter-Club competitions to enable them to compete against other girls who had been selected for the British Empire and Commonwealth Games Squad. This invitation was greatly appreciated by our Association.

On the 10th of October Elaine and Sue travelled to Melbourne prior to the Trials which were held on the 13th and 14th October. The Squad was accommodated at the Race Course Motel, and the girls' Chaperone was Mrs. Holden of Victoria.

At the Trials Elaine ran impressively and came under notice of the selectors for their two special events - 100 yards and Relay.

We were disappointed by the form displayed by Sue, who was unable to produce any semblance of her past performances.

Congratulations to North-West on their impressive winning of the Shield for the Triangular Contest, which was held at Latrobe on Saturday, 9th February.

It was very pleasing to see the large fields of entries at the State Championships, especially in the Juvenile and Junior Sections.

It is very gratifying to see so many seniors continuing with their athletics, especially girls who have been competing since 11 years of age.

Many records were broken, and fine performances were displayed by several of the girls.

In the Juvenile section it is regretted that owing to entries being so heavy, only the heat winners could go into the finals.

The Association plans to reorganize the Juvenile Section before the next Championships.

Congratulations to the following girls who were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Championships held in Brisbane on the 23rd and 24th March -

Elaine Frawley (Captain) - 100 yards, 220 yards and Relay.

Evelyn Piper - High Jump.

Pam Allender - 100 yards Australian Junior Championship

and Relay.

Glenis Nation - Relay. Sue Rush - Relay.

Although the girls had no titles to show this year each member of the Team performed very well. The sprinters were unlucky that they were unplaced in their heats owing to the very close finishes. Outside lanes were drawn in each event and this combined with the heat was a great disadvantage to our girls.

Elaine was most unlucky, finishing 3rd in both heats, and her time for the 220 yards was 24.7 secs., when two finalists recorded 24.8 and 24.9 secs and were able to compete in the final.

Sprint standards were kept at last year's standard. The qualifying standard for high jumping was lowered from 5 feet 3 ins. to 4 feet 9 ins. this season, but the Selectors feel that the field performances of Tasmanian girls is so below Mainland standards that it doesn't warrant lowering the qualifying standards.

Glenis Nation competed in the Junior Long Jump recording a distance of 16 feet 2 " and Evelyn Piper competed in the Junior High Jump, recording a height of 4 feet 8 inches.

The Association wishes to extend its congratulations to the girls for their wonderful performances, both at the Schoolgirls' and Schoolboys' Championships at the Anzac Sports. Several new records were established by girls from the various Clubs.

Our sincere thanks are extended to Mr. Roy O'Toole for the splendid way he coached our Tasmanian Relay Team.

At the conclusion of the State Championships a film evening was held at the Imperial Hotel at which the Tasmanian Team was announced and certificates presented by our President, Lady Park.

"F. J. KOHL" SHIELD. Sandy Bay retained the Shield for the sixth successive year with a total of 87 points.

REPORT - TEAM MANAGERESS. On Wednesday, 20th March, 1963 at 10.25 a.m. members of the Tasmanian Team left Hobart on the first step of their journey to Brisbane to compete in the Australian Championships. The first stop was at Launceston for a few minutes. The crossing was very smooth to Melbourne where we had $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours break. We had a light lunch and a rest. At 2 p.m. we were on our way again. At 4 p.m. we arrived at Mascot where we had a four hour wait.

We took a taxi into the City, where we went around the shops and then had a look at the famous bridge, had some tea and went to a theatrette for an hour before returning to our plane.

The girls were beginning to feel tired, but were in good spirits.

We left Mascot at 8 p.m. After a pleasant journey we arrived in Brisbane at 9.40 p.m. and were met by Mrs. Hillier of the 9.7. A.A.A., who kindly arranged our transport to the Kingsley Private Hotel. On arrival at the Hotel we received a beautiful box of fruit from the Opensland W.A.A.A.

On Thursday we attended a Civic Reception at the City Hall. Later in the day the girls did some light training, but owing to the heavy rains, training tracks were hard to get. However the girls were allowed to train at Toowong Park, which wasn't very good but was better than nothing.

Friday was spent resting and preparing for Saturday, the first day of the Championships.

A colourful parade of all athletes in full dress uniform provided a very spectacular sight for the opening of the Championships, on a dull, but quite pleasant day.

Elaine Frawley, although feeling the effects of the heat, ran a very creditable third in the 100 yards, but only the first two went into the final.

Evelyn Piper, having her first Australian Championship experience, performed quite well and gained a great deal of experience which should help her in her future performances.

The heat and humidity affected all the girls, especially of a night when it was almost impossible to sleep.

On Sunday, the second day of the Championships, Elaine Frawley again ran well and was third in the 200 yards, but again only two went into the final.

Pam Allender performed well in her event, and showed considerable promise as a sprinter.

Glenis Nation showed a great deal of determination in the long jump, and even though she did not gain a place, she should benefit from the experience.

With the Championships over we were all given a farewell tea at the ground, where all the girls intermingled. The two girls from Papua were very popular with all the States.

The tea was a pleasant ending to the 1963 Australian Championships.

My special thanks go to Miss Triffitt, Mrs. Frawley, Mr. O'Toole and John Small for the help given to the girls and myself on many occasions.

In conclusion I would like to thank the girls for their co-operation and loyalty at all times and to say how proud I was to be associated with them.
