AUSTRILLIA WOSEN'S ASSEUR ASSETTE UNION

The Fifteenth Conference of the Union was held at the C.S. Harper Hall, May Street, Merth on 25th, 26th Mebruary and at Perry Lakes Stadium on March 1st, at which the association was represented by resistance D. Frawley and M. Ebbery.

Lamongst the important decisions reached were the addition of the Pentathlon to the Lastralian Junior Championships, and increasing the distance for the Open Cross Country Championships to two (2) miles.

Reimbursement of Jury combers officiating at the Australian Championships shall in future by 50% return second class rail fares met by the State conducting the Championships. The period of outstanding service for the granting of Life Membership was reduced to ten (10) consecutive years.

Fatroness: The wording of the Constitution in regard to the appointment to this position was changed from "with herpermission the Wife" of His Excellency, the Governor General of Australia" to "the First Lady".

Australian Team Selection: (1) the naming of a squad after the National Championships with the final selection made after trials held as close to the final closing date as possible; (2) the appointment of a woman to the training camp organisation committee, and the appointment for a woman manager for its duration, from the State association where the Camp is held; (3) the early departure of the term for hexico City for acclimatisation; (4) the appointment of a Coach for the relay term were passed by Conference.

Approval was also granted for medical tests of athletes prior to departure, and an application is to be made for the appointment of a woman coach to future Olympic and B. . & C. Games towns.

The inclusion of a 2 miles walk in the B.E. & C. Games, and a 3,000 metres walk for women in the Olympic Games was approved.

A greater effort is to be made by all State associations for the deletion of the title of "chaperon" for future mustralian teams, and the substitution of the designations "Assistant General Emmager (Tomen)" and "Sectional Manager (Women)".

an example with the former suggestion is inlustrated by our three top subjuniors Kaye asheadt, Heather Michols and Beth Pacy, each of whom are in schools beard bins year and possibly matriculation next season. Little time will be devoted to othletics.

Will these three girls who have exceptional ability survive these next two years, or will they after a couple of indifferent seasons mixed with intensive study finally devote their time, particularly after leaving school, to less exacting interests.

IN is a problem for administrators of women's athletics to ponder.

The 1964/65 season for Maye Asheroft was a triumphant one yet along with her valented also mates Reather Nichols and former sub junior champion Beth Facy it can be regarded as one of failure.

In the previous season all girls registered 11.7 for 100 yards and Kaye 8.9 for 75 yards. Kiye can a number of 11.7's and 8.9's this year but failed to broak through. Both and Heather were more inconsistent.

Each knew that to follow in the footsteps of Elaine Frawley, Pam Allender, Sue Rush, Gail Herring etc. they would have to be running closer to 11 seconds each week than 12.

This they failed to do, so that the next few years are going to be testing for them, to discover if they can reach national class or whether they will be just another athlete.

Kaye Ashcroft however achieved many individual honours which was topood by her great victories in the state titles.

A recruit that is showing immense potential is Judith Smith.

Except for her pet event the javelin, she was overshidowed somewhat by Yvonne Buckley in all other field events, yet Judith ichieved in discus and shot, marks which few sub-juniors before her had.

We expect Judith to do well in athletics in the next few seasons.

It was very pleasing to see Mirica Manson return to athletics and she definitely showed improvement.

Jenny McChane solved a high jump problem for us being prominent in interclub and finally winning the junior title.

Little was seen of Lyndsay Burbury throughout the year but she did well in state titles field events.

A polular win was that of Jill Harsh in the junior hurdles. Possessing sprinting ability all below that of her rivals she gained a state title, simply because she was willing to devote a little time to schooling over hurdles at training.

The future of the club seems bright because of the host of fine young juveniles coming up.

Two of these Julie Coleman and Glamis Patmore enter sub-junior ranks this coming season.

Kaye Washusen will still be a juvenile.

It is felt that the best is still to come out of these girls as they were beaten in the state titles by more mature and stronger competitors.
