Ladies,

I have pleasure in presenting this report for the 1965/66 season, and to advise that our season has been very successful. The total number of members for the season being Two Hundred and Ten.

The Triangular Meeting was held in Launceston on the 11th December, 1965, in conjunction with the Men's Association. Competition was very keen especially in the Juvenile Section, only one point separating South and North-West.

Congratulations to South under the Captaincy of Sue Eustace recovering the Shield from North-West.

A special thanks to the Ladies Committee who provided a very appetising luncheon and afternoon tea.

Selection Trials were held on Saturday 5th February 1966, at the North Hobart Oval, and the following Team was selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Championships held at the Sydney Sports Ground, from 15th to 19th March 1966:-

S.Eustace (Captain) - 100 yards, 220 yards & Relay (Open)
P.Allender - 100 yards, 220 yards, & Relay (Open)
H.Nichols - 100 yards, 220 yards, Long Jump (Junior) & Relay.
C.Higgins - Long Jump (Junior) and Relay.

Although Pam did not reach the finals of the 100 yards, she was placed 4th in her heat with the creditable time of 11.3 secs. Unfortunately, Pam had to withdraw from the 220 yards and relay, due to trouble with her leg muscles.

Sue was unable to compete in the 100 yards and 220 yards owing to a deep-seated leg injury she was suffering from, but showed a great deal of courage to compete in the Relay.

Heartiest congratulations to Lyn Maxfield, who substituted for Pam in the Relay. Lyn ran an excellent leg and gave our Team a good start.

Although unplaced in their events, Heather and Christine performed very well, and the experience they gained will be most helpful to them both; especially the warming up exercises and preparation of competitors from other States.

Our Association wishes to extend its congratulations to the girls for their very good performances, both at the Schoolgirls' and Schoolboys' Championships, and the Anzac Sports. Several new records were established by girls from the various Clubs throughout the State.

At the State Championships the senior sprint events were won by Pam Allender with Kaylene Patmore and Fay Green filling minor places.

In the 440 yards, Kaylene Patmore the titleholder won the event with Fay Green again taking second place, and J.Walker third.

The girls who did well in the field games were Meredy Holgate, Zearust Abbott, Jenny Batcheler, Jenny McShane, J.Marsh, S.Virth, Lindsay Burbury, J.Walker, Louise Henry and Jenny Butler.

Owing to a leg injury Sue Eustace was unable to compete.

The junior sprints were dominated by Julie Coleman, closely followed by Kaye Ashcroft, and Beth Facey and E,Rowe taking third placings. Julie and Kaye dead-heated in the 75 yards.

The most outstanding junior in the field events was Yvonne Buckley, who won the high jump, discus, shot put and long jump.

Other girls who performed well were Lexie Walker, Christine Higgins, Judith Smith, Mary Flannagan, Christine Byers and Gloria Cross.

The sub-junior events were keenly contended with Lyn Maxfield winning the 75 yards, 100 yards and the javelin. Christine Patmore was third in the 75 yards and first in the 80 Metre Hurdles, with C.Ibbott, G.Patmore, D.Pritchard and G.Chugg filling the minor places. A.Lewis displayed her ability by winning the 220 yards.

The girls with first placings in field events were L.Diprose, E.Byers and R.Squibb with D.Ivory, J.Chiffey, C.Ibbott, L.Banyard, A.Bailey, S.Saunders and S.Thompson in the minor placings.

The most outstanding Juvenile competitor was Michele Downie, who won both the 75 yards and 100 yards events. Michele has shown great ability as a sprinter during the season.

L.Marquis ran well taking second place in both of these events, with L. Lutwych third in the 75 yards and A.Johnston third in the 100 yards.

Our Association was delighted to learn that Elaine Frawley has made the State Team in Victoria again, and was also a member of the winning Relay Team.

News of Elaine returning to Tasmania shortly is very pleasing and the Association will be looking forward to seeing her competing during the coming season.

At the conclusion of the State Championships, an Evening was held at Trinity Hall, where in the absence of our President, Alderman Mabel Miller, certificates were presented by Mr.C.A.Wise. Supper was served.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

It is with pleasure that I present the report of the Tasmanian Team which competed in the Australian Women's Track and Field Championships, held at Sydney Sports Ground from 15th to 19th March, 1966.

The Team comprised of Sue Eustace (Captain) Pam Allender, Heather Nichols and Christine Higgins.

We left Hobart on Wednesday 16th, and had a very pleasant trip. Upon arrival, we were met at the airport by Mrs.J.Norman and Mr. and Mrs.Hagarty, who drove us to our hotel at King's Cross. We were presented with a generous box of fruit from the N.S.W.W.A.A.A. this was much appreciated by our girls.

On Thursday afternoon, a most enjoyable Harbour Cruise was arranged for athletes and officials. This was made most interesting by a very comprehensive coverage of all points of interest. In the evening a Cocktail Party was held at the New South Wales Leagues Club.

The Finale Evening for competitors, officials and supporters was held at the South Sydney Police Boys Club, the decorations were very bright, representing each State. Dancing and Supper was enjoyed by the large number who attended.

The girls trained on Wednesday afternoon and Thursday morning, and were very keen to do their best.

Our Tasmanian girls competed on Friday and Saturday afternoon, and despite heavy rain the track was in very good order. The days were bright and sunny, and the Opening Ceremony was very colourful, with all athletes assembled in their respective State uniforms.

Heather competed in three Junior events, 100 yards, 220 yards and long jump; even though she did not reach the finals, her performances were good.

Christine competed in one individual event, the Junior long jump, and showed improvement with each jump.

Our two Juniors were impressed by the preparation done by the competitors from other States, and I am sure that by watching the various exercises and amount of warming up needed they will have found a basis for their training for next season. I feel it has been a great experience for them both, and should inspire and benefit them greatly in future years.

Although Pam did not reach the final of the 100 yards, she was placed 4th in her heat with the creditable time of 11.3 secs. After this our hopes were high for Pam's chances in the 220 yards, but, unfortunately, she had trouble with her leg muscles, which caused her withdrawal from the relay.

Sue must be commended for the manner in which she ran the last leg of the relay, especially considering the deep-seated leg injury she was suffering, which necessitated her withdrawal from the 100 yards and 220 yards.

Owing to Pam's inability to run the relay, Lyn Maxfield was substituted, and was able to give Tasmania an excellent start. It was unfortunate that our relay team lacked competitive training and this was noticeable when speed was needed in the baton changes.

The closing ceremony was most spectacular. Uniformed Club teams from the N.S.W.W.A.A.A. provided a background for State Teams.

The closing was performed by our own State Secretary, Mrs. Mavis Ebzery.

In conclusion I would like to thank Mr. and Mrs. Hagarty also Mr. and Mrs. Neasby who kindly took our girls to see notable tourist spots and beaches. The kindness and interest shown by so many of the New South Wales Association members helped make our trip a very happy one.

I would also like to thank the T.W.A.A.A. for giving me the opportunity to manage the 1966 team, and the girls for their co-operation.

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION.

The Sixteenth Conference of the Union was held at the Y.W.C.A., Sydney, on March 16th and 17th and attended by your executive member, Mrs. Mavis Ebzery.

Several important amendments were introduced, including the setting of standards in the future for individual junior competitors in Australian Championships, the addition of 880 yards to the Australian Junior Championship programme and the inclusion of this event and the Open Pentathlon in the respective point scores. The age limit for entry into the open 2 Miles Cross Country Championships was reduced to fifteen years.

Metric distances for all events in place of yards will be introduced into future Australian Championship programmes.

The 1966 Australian Cross Country Championships will be held for the first time, in South Australia, the venue will be St. Mary's Course, Adelaide, on August 20th. The 1967 Australian Championships are to be held at Hobart on the 4th and 6th of March.

New South Wales application for the addition of a 2 Mile Walk to the B.E. & C. Games programme was approved, and was later endorsed by the Conference of the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia. This will be referred to the British Empire and Commonwealth Games Association for consideration.

The recommendation from Tasmania for the lowering of capitation fees to 10 cents was lost. In General Business, Tasmania moved that capitation fees be reduced to 15 cents, the whole of which is to be placed in the General Account and the Conference to decide each year how much is to be transferred to the Teams Fund Account. After further discussion it was decided that a Mail Vote be taken. The result of this Vote is not yet to hand.

A recommendation by the Australian Selection Committee to name a squad after the 1966 Championships and make a final selection of the Australian Team for Jamaica following trials in May was approved. The trials will be held at Royal Park, Melbourne, on the 21st and 22nd and athletes not selected with the squad, may upon reaching set standards and with the endorsement of their respective Associations, compete at the Trials.
