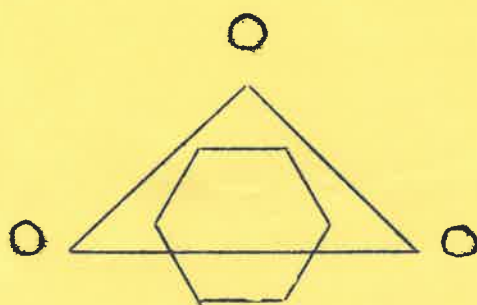

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## LADIES,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the 1967/68 season, and to advise that the year has been quite successful. The total number of members for the season was Three Hundred and Seventy.

The Triangular Meeting was held at White City, Launceston on the 16th December, 1967.

Competition in the under 14 years Division was very close. In the 75 metres the times for the three placings were 10.1 secs. with first place going to Monica Biro (South) and L. Marquis and M. Lattin, (North) filling the minor placings.

In the 100 metres Monica Biro established a new State Record in this Division, her time being 13.5 secs. with L. Marquis and M. Lattin (North) following closely with the same times of 13.6 secs.

Congratulations to South retaining the Open Shield, and to North the under 14 years' Shield. Competition was keen, especially in the latter age group. The points score was as follows:-

Visiting Teams were served with a very nice luncheon provided by members of the Northern Women's Combined Clubs.

Officials were entertained to a very appetising afternoon tea served by the Ladies Committee of the Men's Northern Branch. To these people the Association express their sincere thanks for the hospitality extended both to Athletes and Officials.

The 1968 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 17th and Sunday 18th February, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Championships which were conducted in Adelaide, on Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th March.

Mrs. Doreen Frawley was appointed Manageress.

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Congratulations to Elaine making the final in the 200 metres, and also Gail in the 800 metre Junior.

All the other girls performed well, and the experience gained, should help them considerably in the forthcoming season.

At the State Championships the senior sprint events and 400 metres were won by Elaine Frawley with Faye Green and Kaye Ashcroft filling the minor places. Elaine also won the Long Jump.

For the first time at our State Titles the 800 metres and 1500 metres were included in the programme.

Congratulations to Gail Quinn (Junior) winning the open 800 metres in the good time of 2 mins. 21.4 secs, and she was also second in the 1500 metres to M. Boehn who ran the very good time of 5 mins. 4.2 secs.

In the field events Yvonne Buckley was most outstanding, winning four events as well as the 80 metre hurdles, second in the long jump, and 3rd in the 800 metres.

Other girls who performed well were S. Bensemann, J. Butler, S. Marsh and S. Irvine.

In the Junior 100 and 200 metres Glenys Patmore was most outstanding winning both events and establishing a new Residential Record in the 200 metres. Sue Dick performed very well there was only 1/10 second separating these two girls in both events.

Competition between these two girls next season should be very interesting.

K. Bridge filled 3rd place in these events.

In the Long Jump Vicki Shipp established a new residential record with a jump of 17ft. 2in. Vicki also won the High Jump.

Other girls who performed very well were R. Squibb, C. Lutwyche, H. Thomas, G. Le Rosignol, L. Ward, C. Ibbott, R. McCrow, J. Chiffey and S. Brannan.

Congratulation to Northern Suburbs establishing a new Residential Record in the 4 x 100 metres relay, the time being 52.3 secs.

The Sub-Junior events were keenly contested with M. Lattin winning the 100 metres, and M. Biro and A. Lovell filling the minor places.

In the new event, the 150 metres this was won by C. Patmore, with M. Biro and L. Marquis in second and third placings with the same time of 20.2 secs. The 80 metres hurdles was won by C. Patmore and D. Fuglsang was second.

In the field games the following girls performed very well J. Parkes, C. Schofield, J. Lutwyche, J. Parker and M. Downie winning their respective events and C. Patmore, K. Baker, F. Waterman, L. Marquis, J. Young and J. Lutwyche filling the minor places.

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The most outstanding Juvenile was S. Langmaid who won both the 75 and 100 metres.

Other girls who performed well were B. Nicholls, K. Swabey, D. Jordan and J. Wright.

Congratulations to Van Dieman's Club establishing a new State Record of 59.2 secs. in the 4 x 100 Relay.

It was pleasing to see so many of our Club Girls taking part in these Championships.

It gives me great pleasure to present my report on the activities of the Tasmanian Team competing at the Australian Women's Athletic Championships conducted in Adelaide from the 6th to the 10th March 1968. We were farewelled by parents and friends at the Hobart airport, in the early hours of Monday morning 4th March. On arrival in Adelaide we were met at the aerodrome by the President of the South Australian Women's Association Mrs. Wendy Ey, our Liaison Officer Mrs. Molly Heffernan, and Mr. Bob Hussey. We were taken to the Marrayatville Hotel, where each girl received a gift of fruit from the South Australian Association, a case of oranges was also presented to the team, this gesture was appreciated by all team members. Our accommodation was excellent, clean and homely, large airy bedrooms, meals varied and well cooked. It was really a home away from home, and all the girls were pleased and contented with everything, this relaxing atmosphere helped them to settle in quickly, and a happy spirit of comradeship prevailed. Our hotel was within walking distance of the Kensington Oval, where the championships were being staged. Mrs. Heffernan took the girls to her Club, Western Districts ground to train, they were also allowed to train on the Kensington Oval for a short period, to try to accustom themselves to the different track surface they would be competing on.

The heats of the 400 metres were held on Wednesday, Elaine competed in the second heat, she ran quite well under the circumstances to fill 4th place. Thursday was quite an exciting day for us, as it was the first time Tasmania had had a long distance runner competing. Gail lifted our spirits when she came in 3rd in her heat of the Junior 800 metres.

The first day of the Championships (Saturday the 9th) was hot and humid. The girls were nervous, but determined to do their very best, which they certainly did. The opening ceremony was a colourful one, it consisted of two girls from each State dressed in their competition uniform, marching on to the Oval, and forming a semi circle around the officials and distinguished guests. Our two representatives Glenys and Gail made every Tasmanian feel proud as they marched on to the arena, with the flag of our Association showing up to great advantage. Elaine was in the first heat of the 100 metres, she was fourth in the quite creditable time of 11.9 secs. Fay was in the second heat, and although very nervous, ran with great determination and clocked 12.4 sec. Kaye came up against Di Burge in the third heat, and ran well with a time of 12.3. Vicki jumped 4' 7" in the High Jump, the conditions were entirely different from any that she had previously competed in, but the experience should help her in future. Glenys was very nervous as she took her place in the second heat of the junior 200 metres, she ran very well against such stiff opposition as Raylene Boyle and Chris Malakar. Gail ran well in the final of the Junior 800 metres to finish 5th in 2min. 23 sec, this effort should act as a spur to encourage her on to better performances in the future.

On Sunday the second day of the championships the first heat of the 200 metres provided us with a thrill when Elaine came 2nd to Dianne Burge in 24 sec, and made the final. Fay was more relaxed in the 200 and finished 4th in her heat in 25.1, Kaye ran another good race and finished 5th in 25.3. Vicki encountered plenty of strong opposition in the Long Jump, but in the circumstances did quite well. Glenys was in Raylene Boyle's record breaking heat of the Junior 100 metres, and ran well to clock 12.4. The final of the 200 metres was a real thriller, with Di Burge breaking a record to win it, Joyce Bennett and Jenny Lamy were close behind to fill the minor placings, Elaine ran 24.1 in this race. The relay team combined well together and recorded the time of 48.52.

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The girls enjoyed the Civic Reception, where they met and chatted with team members from all States. The Finale Dinner which was held at the Findon Hotel was another function that was greatly enjoyed.

I would like to thank the President of the South Australian Women's Association Mrs. Wendy Ey, for the kindness and help she and members of her Association extended to me on all occasions, and to congratulate them on the efficient manner in which they conducted the Championships. I cannot speak too highly of the wonderful way in which our Liaison Officer Mrs. Heffernan looked after our team. Her home, family, friends and time were placed at our disposal, and we were not slow to take advantage of her kindness. We were very grateful for the opportunity that was afforded us of visiting so many varied and interesting places in and around Adelaide. The favourable impression that was formed about Adelaide by our girls, was due to the warm hospitality shown them by Molly and Luke Heffernan, Bob and Jan, Mr. and Mrs. Hussey, Uncle Wally and Mr. and Mrs. White, we only hope they enjoyed our company half as much as we enjoyed theirs.

It was pleasing to have our own "Cheer Squad" in the Stands, and I am sure that all the Northern Suburbs supporters who were in Adelaide were pleased with Gail's performances. The State Secretary Mrs. Mavis Ebzery visited the girls on several occasions, and on Sunday had lunch with us at our hotel.

Many compliments were received regarding our competition and walking out uniforms. I am sure that all the girls will benefit greatly from taking part in these Championships, they have plenty of ability and I hope that what they saw and learnt, the performances they witnessed, and the girls they met in Adelaide will inspire them to train harder and so attain better results for themselves in their own performances, and that they will once again have the privilege and pleasure of representing Tasmania in Brisbane next year.

I would like to thank the Association for giving me this opportunity of being Manageress of the State Team in Adelaide. The girls were a credit to Tasmania, both on the track and off. I would like to thank them all for the loyalty, courtesy, help and co-operation given to me at all times. I count it a privilege to have had the pleasure of looking after them.

DEVON CLUB

Our efforts in the well organized Triangular competitions were not as rewarding as in past years but lots of experience was gained. Those who were most successful were C. Adams, L. Ward, R. Squibb and T. Jager.

Keen competition was shown at the carnivals held at Forth and Henley-on-Mersey. Honours were shared evenly and the large contingent from Launceston clubs were rewarded for their winning efforts also.

The Coastal and Devon Championships saw the end of the 1967/68 season and many worth while performances were witnessed with winners of each section keenly contested until the final event.

One might sum up the season by saying that the most rewarding feature from the administrative side was the number of parents showing interest in their young champions to be, and also the number of Athletes who were so anxious to compete in all events held each Saturday in both running and field events. The standards gained by the younger athletes were quite meritorious.

Most young Athletes in our ranks gained the rewards of their efforts when competing for their schools in inter-school competitions and the champions were many. Our ranks should be raised to record numbers particularly next season.

Approximately 150 people were present at the Film and Trophy evening wind up on April 26th conducted by the Mens' Branch and many athletes were rewarded for their seasons efforts.

The Eighteenth Annual Conference of the Union was held at the Sportsmen's Association Clubroom at Parkside, Adelaide on March 7th and 8th, at which the Association was represented by Mesdames Ebzery and Frawley.

The Notice of Motion submitted by the T.W.A.A.A. regarding levies was not passed.

However, Notices of Motion submitted by New South Wales (1) requiring the three interstate member of the Jury of Appeal to be qualified referees or have qualifications and experience of equivalent technical standing and (2) the deletion of Rule 15 (q) stated that competition in events from 200 metres and over shall be restricted to athletes of at least fourteen years of age, were both passed.

On the motion of the Victorian W.A.A.A. the annual subscription for constituent Associations has been raised to \$10.00 per annum.

Considerable discussion was held on the amended Constitution of the Union, and several suggestions were adopted. It is hoped to have the new Constitution available in two or three months.
