Once again it gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the 1968/69 season and to advise that the year has been a very successful one. The total number of members for the season was 420.

The Trinagular Meeting was held at White City, Launceston on the 14th December, 1968.

In the open events Fay Green was most outstanding winning the 80, 100 and 200 metres.

Lyn Marquis showed good form by winning the under 14 years 80 and 100 metres and also the high jump.

In the field games S. Burness performed very well winning the discus and shot, and was third in the javelin.

This year an under 11 years age group was introduced for the first time, and this was won by North West. Congratulations to North West on their outstanding win, and the girls for their very good performances.

For this age group a very nice trophy was donated by Mrs. M. Green and Mrs. D. Claxton (President and Secretary) of the Northern Women's Combined Clubs. Our sincere thanks to these ladies.

It was very gratifying to see North West take out this trophy as they only have one Club from which to select their team.

The 1969 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 16th and Sunday 18th March, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Championships which were conducted in Brisbane, on Saturday 15th and Sunday 16th March.

Mrs. D. Patmore was appointed Manageress.

Heartiest congratulations to Elaine winning the 400 metres. This was the most popular win of the Championships, and all States were barracking for Elaine when she made a wonderful finish to beat Olympians Joyce Bennett and Sandra Brown. It was 36 years since a title had been won for Tasmania, and the joy and excitement was something that the Tasmanian Team and their supporters will long remember.

To add to this wonderful achievement I was asked as State Secretary to present the Gold Medal to Elaine. I may add this was a very touching moment, but a very proud one, not only for Elaine, but myself as we knew that the people of Tasmania would be overwhelmed by her victory.

Elaine was fourth in the final of the 200 metres with a very good time of 24.3 secs.

Although Fay, Lyn and Christine were not successful in their events they showed a great deal of determination, and I feel sure that the experience they gained should help them considerably in the future.

The girls performed very well in the Relay Team, there time being 48.4 secs.

At the State Championships the senior 200 and 400 metres and Long jump were won by Elaine Frawley. The 100 metres was won by Fay Green, who also was second in the 200 and 400 metres.

Congratulations to Gail Quinn (Junior) for winning the open 800 metres for the second successive year in the good time of 2mins. 23.9 secs., and she was third in the 1500 metres.

I. Boehn was winner in the 1500 metres, second in the 800 metres and third in the 400 metres.

A most outstanding performance in the field events was that of Helen Thomas who dominated three events - discus, shot put and javelin.

Other girls who performed well were L. Marsh, C. Holder, S. Brannan, E. Rowe, S. Eustane and J. Butler.

In the Junior 100 and 200 metres Lyn Maxfield showed great form by winning both of these events and gaining third in the 400 metres and 2nd in

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION

The Nineteenth Annual Conference of the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union held at the National Hotel, Queen Street, Petrie Blight, Brisbane on Thursday and Friday March 13th and 14th, 1969 and attended by Mesdames M. Ebzery and D. Frawley as delegates for the T.W.A.A.A.

The Notice of Motion submitted by the T.W.A.A.A. regarding levies, and supported by Victoria was not passed.

Notices of Motion submitted by the N.S.W.W.A.A.A. (1) to substitute 100 metre hurdles for 80 metres hurdles in open championships was passed, (2) the addition of 200 metres hurdles to the open programme was also approved, but the addition of 4 x 400 metres relay was left in abeyance pending further information from the I.A.A.F., (3) It was agreed that the 100 metres hurdles should count in the interstate point score competition (4) 100 metres hurdles was substituted for the 80 metres hurdles in the junior championship, (5) the 1,500 metres was included in the junior championship programme and (6) An Honorary Statistics Officer was added to the list of officers, and Miss Lil Neville of Victoria was appointed.

Requests from South Australia W.A.A.A., and Queensland W.A.A.A. for the holding of future Australian championship programmes over three consecutive days was rejected.

South Australia's notice of Motion to add to Rule 12 Amateur Status, Exceptions-met with mixed success and the addition of Clause (d) was not accepted, but Clause (e) "Writing, lecturing or breadcasting upon athletes or athletic competitions for payment

(1) if she is a journalist or radio commentator by profession or

(2) if she has ceased to take part in athletic competitions or

(3) if she being an athlete engaged in athletic competitions obtains the permission of and has payment of the amount involved made direct to her constituent association" was passed.

On South Australia's motion, the Australian cross country and road walking championships were extended to two days, with the following championships held on the second day 3 x 1,500 metres relay, 3 x 800 metres junior relay and 3 x 800 metres relay (14 years and under).

On the motion of Victoria it was decided to review the Australian championship programme Rule 261, and States were asked to give consideration to this during the coming year with a final decision to be made by June.

Rule 23 Officers and Committees, on the motion of Western Australia has been changed to "There shall be a Records Committee of three (3) to include the Honorary Secretary, and two (2) members of the Executive, one of whom shall be appointed Honorary Recorder".

New South Wale's motion to the appointment of a uniform committee of two with power to co-opt one senior for the two 1969 international meets was approved, and an allotment was made from the International team fund towards defraying costs.

It was decided to allow "Australian Best on Record" recognition of performances made by sub-junior athletes, and recommended that Australian women's athletic teams attend a training camp of at least one week, prior to departure.

It was agreed that Senior Athletes from each State to meet during Australian Championships Meeting (convened by the host Association), 2 representatives to meet Union Conference at 9.30 a.m. on 2nd day of Conference, for discussion.
