It gives me great pleasure to present our 1969-70 Annual Report, which reveals the expansion of our Association. The year has been a very successful one, and the total number of athletes registered for the season was 460.

The Triangular Meeting was held at White City, Launceston on the 6th December, 1969.

In the open events Fay Green was the most outstanding athlete, winning the 80, 100 and 200 Metres.

In the field events Rosalyn Pope won the open shot and discus, and Ruth Squibb showed her ability in the Javelin with a throw of 116 feet 2 inches.

Congratulations to the Northern girls on their fine performances in taking out the Under 14 years and Open titles and tying with North West in the Under 11 years age group.

Fay Green performed very well, and was unlucky that she did not make the final of the 200 metres. She was fourth, her time was 24.7 secs. the same as the third placegetter who went into the finals.

Christine Patmore performed well and gained 2nd place in her heat of the 400 metres in 58,5 secs., but was unplaced in the final.

In their heats Susan and Leonie Dick performed very well, even though they were not successful they showed a great deal of determination and the experience they gained should help them in the coming season.

Congratulations to our girls, Fay Green, Christine Patmore, Leonic Dick and Susan Dick in the 4 x 100 metres open relay. Although they were unplaced they ran very well, there time being 48,0 secs.

In the Junior Relay it was most unfortunate that the baton was dropped by Lyn Clayton from the change-over from Lyn Marquis. The girls had high hopes of a minor placing, but the event finished in a bitter disappointment to all after their arduous training.

In the Senior events at the State Championships Fay Green was outstanding winning the 100, 200, 400 and 800 metres. She did not compete in the 1,500 metres.

S. Brasher performed well to win the 1,500 metres and was third in the 800 metres.

Others to do well in the pprints were Lyn Maxfield and Glenis Patmore. Gail Quinn was second in the 800 and 1,500 metres.

In the field games Ruth Squibb broke the long standing Javelin Residential Record with a throw of 127 feet 11 inches. This was an improvement of 11 feet 9 inches since competing at the Triangular Meeting in Launceston. Ruth also won the 100 Metres hurdles and was third in the Long Jump and Discus.

C. Lutwyche performed well winning the Long Jump and High Jump.
Other girls who did well in the field games were Lyn Maxfield, Helen
Thomas and Carol Holder.

Christine Pathore was the outstanding Junior winning the 100, 200, 400 metres and the 100 metres inaugural hurdles. Christine established a new Residentail Record in the 200 and 400 metres.

Others to do well were Leonie Dick. Monica Biro and Susan Dick.
Lyn Marquis created a new Risidential Record in the heat of the 100 Metres.

In the field events K. Gilbert, S. Maxfield, D. Bailey and R. Pope performed very well winning their events.

Others who did well were V. Wooley, R. Krainoff, L. Hammer, K. Gilbert, J. Garwood, J. Young and J. French.

In the 150 Metres Sub-Junior event Mary Stokell set a new record, her time being 18.6 secs., with K. Baker and M. Downie filling the minor places.

In the 100 metres K. Baker won with a good time of 12.5 secs., with M. Stokell and M. Downie taking 2nd and 3rd placings.

D. Denne ran well to win the 80 metres with L. Black and S. Davis gaining 2nd and 3rd placings.

K. Harriman showed potential in the high jump clearing the bar at 4 feet 6 inches. D. Denne and L. Black filled the minor places.

Other girls who performed well were G. Ewington 1st in the Javelin with L. Jackson and L. Black filling the minor places.

In the Juvenile events Nathalie McGee won the 80 metres, and was second in the 100 metres.

J. French was first in the 100 metres. Other girls who performed well were L. Roberts, J. Jordan and J. Duffy.

In the 400 metres Relay Northern Suburbs established a new Tasmanian Record in the time of 56.2 secs.

For the first time Under 10 years Juvenile events were conducted. The most outstanding athlete in this division was T. Hoell, George Town Club, who won both the 80 and 100 metres.

Other girls who performed well were G. Harvey, C. Viney and G. Cousins.

Congratulations to the George Town Club who were competing for the first time in the State Championships. The girls' performances were very good and it will be interesting to see their progress next season.

# DEVON WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC CLUB

In presenting this report I wish to say yet another most successful and encouraging season has elapsed, with club activities, both competitively and socially excelling all expectations.

Club registrations of 77 athletes was on a par with the previous season. The greater numbers being in the sub junior and juvenile divisions where keen competition was experienced over the Saturday morning meetings.

In field events Ruth Squibb scored a 1st, 2nd and 3rd in throwing events, while Judy Young was equal 1st in the long jump and 3rd in the shot put. Francine Murray and Kerrie Sheehan were the most successful in Under 14 year division, winning the high and long jumps respectively. For the Under 11 year division Debbie Rattray won the 80 metres and Kim Templar was second in both the 80 and 100 metres while the team was a close second in the relay. Congratulations to North on winning the shields.

.In conjunction with the men's club, two very successful carnivals were held at Forth and Henley on the Mersey. At Latrobe over sixty girls, including approximately twenty from Newstead and North Launceston Clubs were competing in the sprints and field events.

Last but not least is the mention of our only senior athlete Ruth Squibb who won the javelin, with a new State Residential record of 127'11, 100 metres hurdles, and was placed in the discus, shot and long jump.

#### AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION

The Twentieth Conference of the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union was held in the Board Room, Victorian Police Association, McKenzie Street, Melbourne, on Thursday March 12th, 1970 at 7.30 p.m. and on Friday March 13th at 9.30 a.m. and Mesdames, Ebzery and Frawley attended as Delegates for the Tasmanian Women's Amateur Athletic Association.

- 1. Notices of Motions submitted by the New South Wales Women's Amateur Athletic Association (1) Rule 2 Membership IEIETE "and other women's amateur athletic Associations as may be admitted from time to time", was passed.
- 2. Membership ADD "Until otherwise determined by the Union in Conference, Norfolk Island, and Australian Capital Territory shall be considered to fall within the jurisdiction of the New South Wales Women's Amateur Athletic Association, and the Northern Territory and the City of Broken Hill within the jurisdiction of the South Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Association.
- 3. The motion regarding the conducting of Sub-Junior Australian Championships to be held at a different time to the existing Australian Championships was lost.

On the motion of New South Wales the following change has been made in the age Classifications:-

Sub-Junior

- 11, 12, 13 and 14 years.

Junior

- 15, 16 and 17 years.

Senior

- 18 years and over.

On the motion by Victoria and New South Wales it was passed that the awards for the Australian Junior Championships shall be:-

Second prize ...... Silver Medallion

Third prize ...... Bronze Medallion of same design as awarded to the open section.

On the motion of Victoria the Programme for the 1970 Championships to be discussed after the Championships, if proved suitable to be regarded as Standard Programme, if not provide suitable necessary amendments to be made before adopting as standard.

On the motion of Queensland standards for individual competitors are to be raised for Australian Championships.

It was passed that the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union recognise long and valued service by members of Constituent Associations with an 'Award of Merit', which would include Union Badge with 'Award of Merit', and a 'Certificate of Merit'.

On the motion of Queensland distances for the Cross Country Championships were changed from:-

3,000 metres to 5,000 metres 1,500 metres to 3,000 metres 800 metres to 1,500 metres

The South Australian motion relating to Amateur Status was carried:—
(1) Rule 12 - Amateur Status. Exceptions - A salaried teacher of physical education may be considered as an amateur provided she has never acted as a professional, even in the sport she teaches. ADD "Teaching, training or coaching in any sport as the member of the staff of a school or other educational institution provided her work is solely educational and that she is not paid directly or indirectly for the coaching of athletes for competition".

Girls to be careful not to be photographed holding or standing near Advertised Goods.

Representatives of various States being presented with medals to be in State uniform or if weather cold in a track suit.

Pam Kilborn and Diane Pease represented the Senior Athletes of Australia at the Conference and some valuable suggestions were presented.

In regards the usage of the 61b shot, Conference advised that this was not recognised, only the 81b 13oz, which was used in all competitions.
