Ladies,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to present our twentieth Annual Report for the Season 1970/71, and to advise that our registration for the season was 450.

The Triangular Meeting which was to be held at White City, Launceston on the 12th December, 1970, was postponed owing to climatic conditions. The Women did not take part at a later meeting conducted on the 21st February. Our State Championships had been held the previous week, and the State Team selected, and other arrangements had been made for members of the Team on this date, and it was regretted that we had to withdraw from the meeting, which was most unfortunate.

It is hoped that our girls will be able to take part this season in the Triangular Meeting.

The 1971 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th February, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Track and Field Championships which were conducted in Sydney on Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th March.

Our girls performed quite well at the Australian Championships. Monica Biro ran second in her heat of the 200 metres, but unfortunately crossed out of her lane, and was disqualified.

In the heat of the 100 metres, Monica was third, her time being 12.1 seconds. This is Monica's best time for this event. In the heat of the 400 metres, her time was 59.5 seconds.

Lyn Marquis ran very well in the heat of the 400 Metres, her time being 58.3 seconds.

Lyn Clayton was placed third in her heat, with a good run of 12.2 seconds.

In the open events Fay Denholm performed quite well. Her times in the 100 metres 11.9 seconds, 200 metres 25.5 seconds, and in the 400 metres 57.3 seconds.

Unfortunately on the day of competition of the Javelin, Ruth Squibb was recovering from a throat infection and her throw of 129 feet 8 inches was not up to her usual distances, but under the circumstances, she performed quite well.

At our State Championships Fay Denholm was the most outstanding senior, winning the 100, 200, 400 and 800 metres. Fay did not compete in the 1500 metres.

S. Brasher defended her title in the 1500 metres, and was second in the 800 metres.

Joanne Munden was second in the 100, 200 and 400 metres, with Sue Dick taking third place in the 200, 400, 800 metres and high jump. Kaye Bird was third in the 100 metres.

In the Field Games Vicki Shipp performed well winning both the long and high jumps.

Helen Thomas established a new residential record in the shot put with a put of 35 feet $10\frac{3}{4}$ inches, and was third in the discus.

N. Hanrahan you the discus and was second in the javelin and shot put.

Lyn Maxfield won the 100 Metre hurdles and was second in the long jump.

Ruth Squibb won the javelin throw and had minor placings in the long and high jumps, and hurdles.

In the junior events Monica Biro was the most outstanding athlete, equalling the 100 metres residential record of 12.2 seconds, and establishing residential records in the 200 metres 24.4 seconds, 57.2 seconds in the 400 metres.

Other girls who performed well were L. Clayton, L. Dick, L. Marquis and M. Downie.

In the Field events K. Gilbert, R. Pope and J. Park performed well, winning their events.

Others to take out placings were M. Nillson, S. Berry, R. Krainoff, V. Woolley, R. Scanlon, W. Nightingale, K. Baker and S. Kerfoot.

The 100 metre Hurdles was won by S. Davis with V. Woolley and K. Gilbert filling minor placings.

In the 4 x 100 metres Relay, Sandy Bay established a new residential record, the time being 49.3 seconds.

In the Sub-Junior twins Kaye and Gaye Clayton were outstanding in their events, with Kaye winning the 100 metres and Gaye taking first place in the 1500 metres, thus reversing the placings.

L. Jackson was third in each event.

In the Field events Gail Singline performed well winning the discus and shot put.

Others to win their events were S. Langmaid, F. Murray and F. Lawson, with P. Rattray, D. Denne, J. Marquis, P. Marquis, K. Youd, S. Kettle and R. Gray filling second and third placings.

C. Badcock was winner of the 80 Metre Hurdles with J. Sheehan and D. Denne filling the minor placings.

A new Tasmanian Record was set in the 4 x 100 metres relay by Newstead in the very good time of 51.0 seconds.

Owing to the change of age classifications at the 1970 Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union Conference, Juvenile events Under 11 years were conducted for the first time.

We arrived in Sydney at 3 p.m. after a very enjoyable flight. We were met by the New South Wales State Secretary, Mrs. F. Wrighter, and our Liaison Officer and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Hardy. We were then taken to our hotel, "The Canberra Oriental", King's Cross, which was very nice. After changing, Mr. and Mrs. Hardy took us to the nearby Rushcutter Bay oval where arrangements had been made for the girls to train.

Wednesday was the first day of competition for the girls. It was the heats of the 400 metres for Fay, Monica and Lyn Marquis. All three girls performed well and the times recorded were quite good. The Opening Ceremony was held at the conclusion of Wednesday's events. It was a very colourful sight with all State Teams marching in their uniforms. We were the smallest Tesm, but as we marched we all felt very proud to be representing our State. Lady Cutler was introduced to each Manageress after the opening of the Championships, and I would like to quote her remarks, "Your Team is very small Mrs. Green, but you all look very nice and smart. I am very impressed with your uniform, your hats are lovely, you must be very proud of your Team". assured her how very proud I was, We were all entertained to luncheon, and it was very pleasant to mingle with the officials and to meet the members of our Union.

Thursday we had an enjoyable harbour cruise, and visit to the Zoo. Unfortunately Ruth was still not feeling well owing to a throat infection, so stayed at the hotel.

Friday morning we visited the city, went to Paddys Market, and had lunch and then returned to the Hotel to rest. On my return a lovely surprise was awaiting me. In my room was a beautiful orchid spray which was sent by the New South Wales Women's Association for me to wear to the cocktail party to be held that evening.

Saturday we arrived at the oval early so as to give the girls plenty of time to warm up. Fay clocked 11.9 seconds in her heat of the 100 metres. Ruth, our javelin representative competed very well, although her throw of 129 feet 8 inches was not her personal best. We were all pleased with her efforts as she was still feeling the effects of a throat virus. Monica ran very well in the heat of the 200 metres, gained second place, but to our disappointment was disqualified.

Sunday was a very interesting and exciting day, all heats and finals were eagerly contested. Monica gave an outstanding performance in the heat of the Junior 100 metres, gaining third place and clocking her best time of 12.1 seconds. Lyn Clayton also competed in the 100 metres and ran a very good time of 12.2 seconds. Lyn was also placed third. It was unfortunate for both girls that only first and second placings were eligible for the finals. Fay ran well in the heat of the 200 metres. Next came our Relay. I am sure that our State would have been pleased with the girls run. Each member of the Team showed great determination and ran very well.

Although our girls did not make any of the finals, their performances were very good, and it was a great experience for the juniors.

The Closing Ceremoney was very colourful, with the girls from all States marching in their compositive uniforms. At the conclusion all the girls joined hands and ran around the oval cheering. It was a wonderful sight and brought tears to many eyes, for this was the end to a most wonderful and exciting Australian Women's Championship.

Tasmania can be proud of their small team, for their fine performances, good conduct and neat appearance. Many compliments were paid regarding our uniform and the good behaviour of the Team.

Sunday evening all teams were entertained by the New South Wales Women's Association at the Finale Evening held at Luna Park. It was a most enjoyable evening.

I wish to thank our Captain Fay Denholm for all her help given to the girls and myself. We found Fay to be a very capable and efficient captain, a credit to the Association.

To all State Team members, thank you girls for your co-operation. I was very proud to be your Manageress, you were a credit to the Association, your Club and Parents. A big thank you to the girls for the lovely gift I received. I spent eight very happy days with the Team, and as the years go by I shall always remember the 1971 Australian Championships.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the Association for granting me the position of Manageress. I was greatly honoured. I would also like to take this opportunity of thanking Mrs. Ebzery for all her help, and also Mrs. Frawley. Thank you also to our very pleasant Liaison Officer, Mrs. Hardy and her husband who helped to make our stay a very enjoyable and memorable one.

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION CONFERENCE

The twenty first conference of the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union was held at the Masonic Club 171 Castlereagh Street Sydney, New South Wales, on Thursday March 11th at 7.30 p.m. and Friday 12th at 9.30 a.m., and on Sunday at the Sydney Sports Oval after the completion of the Australian Championships. Mesdames Ebzery and Frawley attended as delegates for the Tasmanian Women's Amateur Athletic Association.

Among the Notices of Motions that were brough forward and carried were that 200 metre hurdles be added to the Junior Track and Field Championships, so that juniors can get experience in this event before becoming seniors.

The election of Manager to be by perforential voting. The "Spittles Shield" to become Relay shield for Cross Country Championships like the "Joan Beretta" Shield. The shield plate with names on is to be removed and returned to donor, new plaques to be put on it with suitable engraving. Suggestions of ways and means to make it possible for an Australian representative to attend the Women's International Federation meetings, because it is felt to be vitally important for Australia to have a personal representative at such a Conference, so that our views on all matters can be made known.

All States have been asked to stipulate the number of registered Senior and Junior Athletes. It is felt that too many senior athletes are leaving before it is necessary for them to do so and it is felt that all States will have to devise ways of keeping their senior athletes.

The 1500 netres and 800 notres walk will now count for points in the Australian Championships, the Walkers felt that their event warranted scoring as did every other event on the programme. All delegates were requested to inform their State teams that girls appearing on the Victory Dias, be correctly dressed in State uniform or track suit.

The operation of the Union rules governing the conduct of the Annual Track and Field Championships of Australia in relation to the 1972 Championships has been suspended to enable the Titles to be organised as a joint venture in Porth Western Australia with the Track and Field Championships of the Australian Amateur Athletic Union of Australia and Western Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Association, including the devising of an equitable forumula to govern the sharing of the profits of the joint meeting.

Programme of 1971 Track and Field Championships with addition of Junior 200 metres be adopted.

Open and Junior Pentathlon to be hold on one day.

Open and Junior Pentathlon Championships to be held on first day of the programme with Open and Junior 400 heats. That the second day of the 1972 Programme shall include heats of the 200 metres. Hurdles and 800 metres in conjunction with the first section of the Junior Australian Championships. Opening Ceremony to be held at 1.30 p.m. Saturday. Format of both Opening and Closing Ceremony as used at 1971 Australian Championships be adopted. All athletes to take part in Closing Ceremony.

Agenda matters pertaining to one subject to be grouped together.

<u>Little Athletics</u>: The Union approves the athletic novement known as "Little Athletics" as a contest for girls under the age of 12 on date of competition. On attaining the age of 12 years it is expected that the girls will become members of an athletic Club affiliated to member Associations of the Union.
