LADIES,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to present our twenty-first Annual Report for the season 1971-72, and to advise that our Registration for the season was four hundred and sixty.

The 1972 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th February, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Track and Field Championships which were to be conducted in Perth, Western Australia on Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th March.

Our girls performed very well at the Australian Championships with two of our junior girls making the finals.

Leonie Dick won her heat in the 200 metres, her time being 25.4 seconds.

Lyn Marquis was second in her heat in the 400 metres, her time being 56.8 seconds.

Fay Denholm was fourth in her heat of the 400 metres, her time being 56.3 seconds.

These times are the best performances of Fay and Lyn.

Monica Biro was unfortunate not to make the finals, but performed quite creditably.

Ruth Squibb was fifth in the open javelin with a throw of 133 feet 7 inches.

The Relay Team was disqualified much to the girls disappointment.

At the State Championships the senior sprints were won in fine style by Fay Denholm (Newstead) who won the 100 metres in 11.9 secs., the 200 metres in 24.8 secs., and the 400 metres in 57.2 seconds.

Kaye Bird was second in the 100, 200 and 400 metres with Sue Dick taking third placing in the 200, 400 and 1500 metres.

Lyn Maxfield was third in the 100 metres.

The Senior 800 metres was won by Roslyn Pope from the title holder S. Brasher in the time of 2m 32.5 secs., L. Smith was third.

In the 1500 metres S. Brasher avenged her earlier defeat by winning in 5m 19.1 secs., a new Residential Record. The minor placings were filled by Roslyn Pope and Sue Dick.

In the Field Games Ruth Squibb won the Javelin with a throw of 130 feet 4 inches. She also won the Shot Put, and was second in the High Jump and Hurdles.

Roslyn Pope also performed well winning the discus with a throw of 91 feet 6 inches, and was second in the shot put and third in the high jump.

Sue Dick won the long jump with a leap of 16 feet 11 inches, and the 100 metres hurdles in 19.6 secs.

In the high jump Vicki Shipp was first, her jump being 4 feet 9 inches. She was also second in the long jump.

Lyn Maxfield was second in the discus and javelin, and third in the shot put and 100 metre hurdles.

In the Junior events Monica Biro won the 100 and 400 metres in the respective times of 12.3 secs., and 57.6 seconds.

Leonie Dick was second in the 100 metres clocking the same time as the winner, and was third in the 200 metres in the time of 25.1 secs., second in the 400 metres and third in the 100 metres.

The 800 metres saw a great struggle between Penny Gray, Michelle Downie and Wendy Cope with Penny Gray winning in the good time of 2m 21.2 secs., and thus equalling the Residential Record.

In the 1500 metres inaugural event Penny Gray took out the honours with a good run of 5m 14.5 secs., with Michelle Downie and Barbara Knott filling the minor places.

In the Field Events D. Brinkley's performances were outstanding with Debbie taking out first placings in the discus, shot put and javelin.

Others to win their events were: K. Gilbert 100 metres, hurdles; J. Killalea High Jump and Roseanne Scanlon Long Jump, with K. Herman, S. Langmaid, S. Davis, W. Cope, R. Krainoff, S. Kerfoot and S. Williams filling the minor placings.

A new Tasmanian Residential Record was established in the 4 x 100 metres relay by Newstead in the very good time of 49.0 seconds.

In the 100 and 150 metres J. Sheehan performed very well winning both the 100, 150 metres and 80 metre hurdles with minor placings being filled by S. Kettle, G. Singline and J. Lansky.

Of the most outstanding performances in the field events was in the high jump, where a new Tasmanian Record was established by Francine Murray with a leap of 4 feet 11½ inches. Francine was also third in the long jump and first in the shot put.

Others to win their events were G. Singline discus, H. Vincent javelin, and S. Kettle long jump.

Minor placings were C. Templar, C. Brasher, K. Charleston, D. Denne, J. Lansky and R. Gray.

Gail Harvey was the most outstanding Juvenile creating new records in the 80 and 100 metres. K. Milner was second in both events and S. Whiteway the third placings.

Congratulations to Newstead winning this Shield for the second successive year with a total of 86 points with Sandy Bay 55 points second, and Devon 52 points third.

Once again congratulations to Newstead winning the Shield with a total of 18 points with Devon and Van Diemen's equal second with four points each.

Newstead are to be congratulated on their great Relay wins, winning in all Divisions.

The Triangular Meeting was held at White City, Launceston on the 26th February, 1972.

One of the highlights of the meeting was our State Team competing against a junior men's composite team in the 4 x 100 metres Relay, with the women winning in 48.5 seconds. The other outstanding performances were by the Devon girls Francine Murray and Wendy Cope with their wonderful achievement of jumping five feet. This record has not been equalled since 1967 when Yvonne Buckley established this record.

Congratulations to the Northern girls on their fine performances in taking out the Open and Under 11 years of age group and to North West the Under 14 years.

MANAGER'S REPORT

It is with pride and pleasure that I present my report on the activities of our State Team during their stay in Perth, Western Australia.

On Monday 20th March, 1972 (at dawn's early light) our Team of Fay Denholm (Captain) Newstead, Ruth Squibb Devon, Lynne Marquis Newstead and Monica Biro and Leonie Dick Sandy Bay were farewelled by parents and friends from the Cambridge and Western Junction Airports. We travelled from Melbourne by Jet and had a fast and pleasant trip, during the long journey all our girls were able to become more intimately acquainted with our State Secretary Mrs. Mavis Ebzery and our President Mrs. June Bowring, who travelled with us.

Our accommodation at Forrestt House was very comfortable, and everyone settled in easily and soon felt at home in their new surroundings. The Swimming Pool in the centre of Forrestt House was much appreciated by our Juniors during the very hot weather that we experienced during our stay in Perth. I received compliments from the Staff and Management of the hotel on the good manners, neatness and conduct of the Team.

The girls really enjoyed their training sessions on Monday and Tuesday, mainly because the training oval was far superior to anything that they had ever competed on in Tasmania. It also gave them an excellent opportunity of seeing other State champions in action, and observe their training methods, and also get advice and encouragement from many of them. The girls mixed well with all States and made many friendships.

Competition for Juniors commenced on Wednesday 22nd March and finished on Friday the 24th, competition for Seniors was held on Saturday and Sunday. On Wednesday at 10.30 a.m. in Heat 1 of Event 5, Lynne Marquis put Tasmania on the map when she came 2nd in the 400 metres in the good time of 56.8, everyone was terribly excited to think we had someone in the finals. On Thursday at 2.45 p.m. there were three heats in the 200 metres. Lynne was in the 1st Heat and clocked 25.8, Monica Biro in the 2nd Heat came in 4th in 25.4, and then in Heat 3, we had the spectacle of every Tasmanian screaming their heads off as Leonie Dick and Narelle Jones (Qld.) came racing down the strait stride for stride, Leonie surged to the front and won in 25.4, everyone was jubilant -- two girls in the finals. On Friday during their heats of the 100 metres, the girls performed well, but found the stiff breeze difficult to handle. The heats of the Open 400 were also held on Friday. Fay Denholm in the 1st Heat ran in tremendous and determined style to come 4th in her personal best time of 56.3.

The Opening Ceremony at 2.00 p.m. on Saturday 26th March was very colourful and spectacular, three women and three men athletes representing their State marched on to the Oval behind the R.A.A.F. Band. We were represented by our three Juniors looking very immaculate and showing to advantage in their marching. We were also very proud to see Mrs. Ebzery march on to the Oval with the other Union Executive members. The Meeting was declared open by His Excellency the Governor General of Australia Sir Paul Hasluck.

Fay was in the 2nd Heat of the 100 metres and ran well to come 4th in 12.6. Ruth's Javelin event was just after the Opening ceremony she came 5th with her throw of 133' 7", Ruth had a very good throw in the vicinity of 145ft., but unfortunately she over balanced and was disqualified.

The final day of competition was on Sunday, Fay again ran well to come 5th in 24.9 in her heat of the 200 metres. Our Relay team was unfortunate in its baton changing and although we were disqualified, we clocked 48.8 for our run.

As most of our time was spent at Perry Lake Stadium, the girls were not able to see very much of Perth or the surrounding districts. The social highlight of our trip was a delightful and relaxing evening spent at Kings Park Restraunt, which is situated on a hill overlooking the city. This was made possible by the generosity of Mesdames G. Dick, J. Bowring and M. Ebzery. Our Secretary and President proved to be wonderful hostesses and their kindness, gaiety and tact, soon put the girls at their ease. As a memento of the "Get Together" each girl received a Souvenir Spoon, but I am sure no token of remembrance will ever be needed by the girls to bring that special 1972 Perth Dinner to mind.

These Championships were a wonderful experience for everyone who had the good fortune to attend as either a competitor or spectator. Our team members performed well, and have learned a lot. The long straights in the circular events were something new to them, as also were the strong winds that they experienced on some of the days of competition, which accounted for so many slow times, but I think everyone was thrilled that at least they have had the opportunity to compete on a first class athletic track, and I am sure that when plans are drawn up and help is needed for a first class athletic ground to be built in Tasmania, these girls will be among the willing helpers to try and make this dream become a reality. I was thrilled that our two Juniors Lynne Marquis and Leonie Dick made the finals, this is a wonderful achievement for Tasmania, and although they did not gain a place they should not be discouraged, because it is quite an achievement to be good enough to get to the finals in a National Title, and this should boost their confidence in their athletic ability.

There were many people in Perth who contributed in one way or another to the contentment and well being of our Team, we were encouraged by the continuous cheering of a very vocal band of "Dinkie Die Tassies" mainly consisting of our Men's team, their wives and parents and officials. Froggy Wise was always available to give help and advice when needed. Mr. Tony Blanton, Manager of the Men's team, Max Cherry, Eric Goss and Noel Ruddock were kindness itself to the girls. Mrs. J. Harmey New South Wales and Mrs. Margaret Baker Victoria were always helpful both to the Team and myself. A special "Thank you" to Mrs. Ebzery for the keen interest she took in the girls, and the help and encouragement she gave to them before and after their events. All letters and telegrams sent to the Team were greatly appreciated, and created great excitement on arrival, these are great morale boosters.

I would like to thank the Association for giving me the opportunity to take our Team to Perth, and I can state with the utmost sincerity that it was the most dedicated, yet happiest team with whom I have been associated. I am indebted to the girls for their courtesy and thoughtfulness to me at all times, their manners on and off the field reflect great credit on their parents; and their Clubs, and Tasmania can be justly proud to have girls like them to represent our State. I received many compliments on the neatness and good manners of the girls and everyone remarked on their happy dispositions. The most outstanding feature of our team was the ability of every member to share wholeheartedly in each others success or disappointment, this personal contribution from each one helped to make our living together so successful.

The twenty second conference of the Australian's Women's Amateur Athletic Union was held at Forrest House, St. George's Terrace, Perth, Western Australia, on Monday 20th March at 7.30 p.m. and Tuesday 21st March at 9.30 p.m., and on Sunday at Perry Lakes Stadium prior to the final day of the Championships.

Mesdames Ebzery and Frawley attended as delegates for the Tasmanian Women's Athletic Association.

A Technical Committee of five members, two of whom shall be one of the Referees of the Championship Meeting nominated by the Controlling Association and the Manager of the Championship meeting concerned shall be appointed by the Executive Committee of the Union at least one month before each Australian Track and Field Championship Meeting.

A Jury of Appeal of Three (3) members (none of whom shall act in any other capacity as an official at the Championship meeting) shall be appointed at each Annual Conference of the Union.

Rules 270 and 272 - delete competitors (14 years of age and under) and substitute (Sub-Junior).
