TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT SINCE RE-AFFILIATION
SEASON 1972-73

Presented to members of the T.W.A.A.A. at the Annual General Meeting held at the National Fitness Council Rooms, 138 Bathurst Street, Hobart, on Saturday 28th July, 1973 at 2.00 p.m. LADIES.

It gives me great pleasure to present our twenty second Annual Report for the season 1972-73, and to advise that our Registration for that period was 500.

The 1973 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th February, and the following girls were selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Track and Field Championships, which were conducted in Hobart, on Saturday 3rd and Sunday 4th March.

This was the largest Team ever to take part in the Australian Championships. Congratulations to the members of our Tasmanian Team for their performances.

One of the most exciting events were the heats of the Junior 400 metres when Penny Gray broke the Tasmanian Residential Record with a time of 57.1 seconds, and minutes later her sister Robin Gray in the second heat clipped half a second off the time to record 56.6 seconds, and establish a new Residential Record.

In the 800 metres Penny established a new Residential Record, her time being 2m 11.5 secs., and winning a bronze medallion for the State.

Lack of experience robbed Penny from winning the 1500 metres, but it was a very proud moment when she was placed second, winning a silver medallion, and establishing a new Residential Record, her time being 4m 39.1 seconds.

As State Secretary it was a very proud moment for me to see Penny on the Victory Dais, as our State has not had a Junior win a medal since 1964 when Sue Rush (Eustace) won the 100 and 200 yards Junior Championship of Australia in Melbourne.

Twins Gaye and Kaye Clayton performed very well making the finals in the 100 and 200 metres. I feel sure that the experience gained by them both will be very helpful to them in the coming season.

Another breathtaking event was the 4 x 100 metres Junior Relay consisting of Gaye and Kaye Clayton, Leanne Smith and Michelle Downie who were placed third with the time of 48.8 seconds, the same as Queensland. I'm sure every Tasmanian present felt proud to see our girls receive their bronze medallions.

Although Monica Biro, Lyn Marquis and Leanne Smith were unable to make the finals, it was pleasing to see them fighting on with determination.

Although Wendy Cope and Francine Murray did not jump as well as they had done previously, I feel sure that the conditions, and the first time in big competition had some bearing on their performances, but this experience will be helpful to them.

Ruth Squibb was placed fourth in the Javelin with a throw of 44.06 metres, which established a new Open Residential Record.

In the State Championships Lyn Marquis took out the honours in the 200 metres, 400 metres and was second in the 100 metres.

Monica Biro won the 100 metres in the time of 12.3 seconds, and was second in the 200 metres.

Lyn Clayton filled the 3rd placings in the 100 and 200 metres.

In the Field Games Ruth Squibb won the Javelin with a throw of 136 feet 6 inches and the Shot Put, her distance being 30 feet 8 inches.

Lyn Maxfield was second in the Javelin, Long Jump, High Jump and Discus, and third in the Shot Put.

Rosemary Scanlon performed well in winning the Long Jump with a leap of 16 feet $11\frac{3}{4}$ inches and was first in the High Jump with a jump of 4 feet 4 inches.

Rosemary Krainoff won the Discus with a throw of 81 feet 10 inches, and was second in the Shot Put.

Others to fill minor placings were J.R. Caldwell and B. Rice.

S. Brasher won the 800 metres and defended her title in the 1500 metres.

The most outstanding Junior was Penny Gray who established new Residential Record in the 800 metres, her time being 2m 23.6 secs., and the 1500 metres with the time of 4m 45.4 seconds.

Robyn Gray performed very well winning the 200 metres, 400 metres and was third in the 100 metres.

Kaye Clayton equalled the Residential Record of 12.3 seconds in the 100 metres and was second in the 200 metres.

Twin sister Gaye Clayton was second in the 100 metres and third in the 200 metres.

Leanne Smith performed wery well in the 400 metres running the same time as Robyn Gray, 58.3 seconds. Leanne was third in the 800 metres.

Michelle Downie ran well to take second placings in the 800 metres and 1500 metres.

E. Butler filled third placing in the 1500 metres.

Sue Davis won the 100 metres Hurdles, and the minor placings were filled by J_{\bullet} Lansky and L_{\bullet} Williams.

In the Field Events wins were recorded by Gale Singline Discus, Wendy Cope High Jump, F. Lawson Long Jump, Jenny Hood Javelin and C. Schultz Shot Put, with H. Herrmann, B. Pursell. S. Bryant, K. Herrmann, S. Kettle and K. Sullivan filling the minor placings.

In the Sub-Junior events Debbie Rattray performed well by winning the 100 metres and 150 metres, with Club mate J. Sheehan filling second placings.

Third placings were filled by A. Egan and Kim Gillies.

In the Field events Carmel Goldsmith established a new Tasmanian Record in the Long Jump with a leap of 16 feet 6 inches, and was third in the High Jump.

In the High Jump Yvonne Tiggelaven performed well, her winning jump being 4 feet 7 inches, and was also third in the 80 Metre Hurdles.

Others to win their events were C. Brasher Discus, K. Youd Shot Put, H. Vincent Javelin, J. Sheehan Hurdles.

Other placings were filled by S. Millwood, J. Mahoney, M. Harrington, D. Millwood and Elizabeth Robinson.

Diane Brasher was the most outstanding Juvenile winning both the 80 and 100 metres.

D. Walmsley was second in the 100 metres and third in the 80 metres.

Other placings were C. Grierson second in 80 metres, K. Roberts third in the 100 metres.

REPORT ON TASMANIAN STATE TEAM 1973

The State team representatives competing at the Australian Championships were:-

Seniors

Ruth Squibb (Captain), Lynne Marquis, Monica Biro.

Juniors

Robyn and Penny Gray, Gaye and Kaye Clayton, Michelle Downie, Leanne Smith, Wendy Cope and Francine Murray, with all juniors making their debut in a State side.

Incidently this was the largest team ever to represent the State.

As the Championships were held in Tasmania this year, to save costs, it was agreed that team members be either billetted or stay privately, at their own cost, with the exception of bus fares, which were reimbursed by State, to Northern and North Western members, and bed and breakfast for Manageress. The girls assembled on Wednesday 28th February, and it so happened that seven of the team stayed at the City Motel, with other members joining them, when ever possible. We were welcomed by the Liaison Officers from Northern Suburbs who kindly presented fruit and cordials from their Club and T.W.A.A.A.

Owing to unsettled weather and water logged state of training grounds, training pssibilities were very limited. However, athletes showed willing and participated when able to do so.

Triday being a leisure day, members rested until mid morning, then went training before going to the City for lunch, after which we divided into groups for a shopping excursion.

Team members attended a dinner at the Town House as the guests of State President and Manageress. Unfortunately Mrs. Bowring was unable to be present. All enjoyed the evening out.

All the team looking very spectacular in full uniform assembled along with teams from mainland states and officials to march on for the Opening Ceremony on Saturday 3rd March. The Australian Women's Track and Field Championships were proclaimed open by Lady Bastyan Patroness of T.W.A.A.A. The "Oath of Amateurism" was pronounced on behalf of all competitors by Ruth Squibb, who carried out the duty in a most efficient manner, and from compliments received, I'm sure all Tasmanian's present were very proud of her.

During competition over three days all girls gave of their best and showed by performances the vast improvement in the State over the last few years. Although we did not win any gold medallions, our record was individual: one silver, one bronze and bronze in junior relay, and two fourth placings.

The teams ability can be judged from the following representations, two in the 100, 200, 400 and 1500 metres junior; one in 400 senior and 800 junior finals and junior relay, along with one senior javelin, and two junior high jump. State was represented in nine finals out of entries in ten events, during which five State residential records were broken. First was by Penny Gray in heat of junior 400 metres in 57.1 but this was reduced to 56.6 by sister Robyn, five minutes later, thus both made the final. Later Penny qualified for junior 800 metres by winning her heat on a water logged track. In the final on Saturday Penny reduced her own Residential Record by over two seconds to finish in third position.

Kaye and Gaye Clayton both made the final of 200 metres, with both running well in the final against strong opposition. Wendy Cope and Francine Murray both jumped a little below their best, due mainly to soft take off, but I'm sure they gained many points from watching mainland competitors.

In senior javelin Ruth Squibb broke her own State Residential record, and managed to gain fourth position.

In junior relay Gaye, Michelle, Leanne and Kaye thrilled the team by finishing third to win another bronze medallion.

Our only representative in open 400 metres, Lynne Marquis finished in sixth place recording her best time in Tasmania.

On the Monday the twins Gaye and Kaye once again ran well in the 100 metres to make the finals in which they finished just behind the placegetters.

However, it was Penny in the junior 1500 metres who gave us our greatest thrial. Early in the third lap both Michelle and Penny were well placed and when Penny hit the front with less than half a lap to go we were almost voiceless from barracking, however, Debbie Costello's greater experience in hard competition stood her in good stead at finish when she managed to hit the front shortly before the tape. Penny's effort was great in winning the silver medallion with a Residential record of 4-39.1, her third record for Championships.

Our only girls who did not make the finals were Monica open 200 and Leanne junior 400, nevertheless both gave of their best and were good team members.

I consider the friendly atmosphere experienced in the team, with Ruth's leadership, enabled every member to rise to the occasion with a supreme effort when their time came to compete.

All attended the Finale Evening on Monday which gave an enjoyable ending to the Championships.

I wish to congratulate the whole team for their excellent conduct both on and off the field and thank the girls parents and trainers for their co-operation, support and consideration given to me at all times.

To the Liaison Officers thank you also for your kindness and inviting us to join the W.A. team on a tour of the mountain, which all thoroughly enjoyed.

In conclusion I thank the Association for the honour of electing me to my position and to say it gave me great pleasure to be associated with all during my term of responsibility.

The following Motions were carried:-

Merit Award

Whilst length of service shall not of itself confer the right of nomination for the award, no person shall be eligible for the nomination unless she has been actively associated for at least twenty years with the Amateur Athletic movement in Australia.

Championships Programme

The 3,000 Metres Open to be an additional event in the Australian Championship, and where practicable the 400 metre Hurdles to be included. The Opening Ceremony to be held on the 1st Day of the Championships.

Australian Cross Country and Road Walking Championships

The 3 x 1500 Metres Junior Road Relay to be deleted and substitute 3×2000 Metres, Junior.

The 3 x 800 Metres 14 Years and Under and substitute 3 x 1000 metres Sub Junior.

The 500 metres Open Championship to be conducted over a one-lap course where practicable.

Levies

All Officials and competing Athletes, irrespective of age, must be registered members of their Associations and each Association shall pay annually to the Union registration dues for all registered members except those under the age of 11 years.

Rule 246

Delete the word "women", the existing rule then to read:
"apart from athletic events no other events shall be held at any meeting".
