TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT SINCE RE-AFFILIATION SEASON 1973/74

Presented to members of the T.W.A.A.A. at the Annual General Meeting held at the National Fitness Council Rooms, 138 Bathurst Street, Hobart on Saturday 27th July, 1974 at 2.00 p.m. LADIES,

It is my privilege and pleasure to present our twenty-third Annual Report for the season 1973/74, and to advise that our Registration for that period was 575.

Another Club was formed in the North, the Tamar Club, and we extend a warm welcome to this Club.

A Junior Team consisting of eight members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Track and Fiela Championships held on the 2nd and 3rd March in Adelaide.

Penny was the most outstanding member of the Team, winning a gold medal in the 800 metres, and a silver medal in the 1500 metres. In the 800 metres Penny established a new South Australian Residential Record, her time being 2 mins. 10.6 seconds, and her time for the 1500 metres 4 mins. 42.2 seconds.

I feel sure that with more interstate competition, and further coaching, this young athlete who still has two more years to compete as a junior will show a great deal if improvement.

Twins Gaye and Kaye Clayton were not up to their usual form, but ran very well in the 4 x 100 metres relay.

Ann Egan in her first National Championships ran well, especially in the 200 metres, her time being 25.4 seconds. This was Ann's best time for this distance.

Shirleanne ran a good leg in the Relay, and the girls were very unlucky not to win a bronze medal.

High Jumpers Francine, Wendy And Yvonne did not jump as well as had been expected, but Yvonne a sub-junior and her first big competition will have more confidence, and I feel sure that she will benefit from being a member of the Team.

Due to the extensive heat experienced during the Championships it is felt . that this proved a deterrent to the performances of our girls.

The 1974 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th of February.

Lynn Marquis took out the honours in the 200 and 400 metres and was third in the 100 metres,

Lyn Clayton was first in the 10C metres and filled third place in the 200 metres,

It was pleasing to see Fay Denholm make a come back and perform quite well. Fay was second in the 100, 200 and 400 metres, and K. Barker was third in the 400 metres.

Shirley Brasher won the 800 metres and defended her title in the 1500 metres.

In the Field Games Kathy Gilbert won the long jump and was second in the high jump. Kathy put up a fine performance in the 100 metre Hurdles to set a new Residential Record in the time of 16.3 seconds. K. Hermann performed very well winning the high jump, second in the javelin and long jump and third placing in the discus.

R. Krainoff was second in the discus, and shot put and third in the javelin. Ruth Squibb won the javelin with a throw of 41.08 metres, but this was well below Ruth's best performances.

In the shot put Elaine McLeod was first, and it was pleasing to see Elaine competing after being absent from our State in Victoria.

Penny Gray was the most outstanding junior winning the 400, 800 and 1500 metres.

Kaye Clayton established a new Residential Record in the 100 metres, her time being 12.0 seconds, and was third in the 200 metres.

Twin Gaye Clayton was second in the 100 metres with a time of 12.1 seconds but was unplaced in the 200 metres.

Improved spinter Ann Egan was first in the 200 metres and third in the 100 metres.

Robyn Gray was second in the 200 metres and ran second to sister Penny in the 400 metres.

Sally Lansky a much improved distance runner was second in the 800 metres and third in the 400 metres. This athlete competed in Melbourne on the 23rd February last and won the 800 metres, her time being 2 mins. 16 seconds.

Sally Bryant was second in the 1500 metres and third in the 800 metres.

C. Brazendale filled third place in the 1500 metres.

In the 100 metre Hurdles Jan Sheehan was first with Sally Anne Setter and Shirleanne Kettle filling the minor places.

In the High Jump Sally-Anne Setter established a new Residential Record with a leap of 5 feet $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches, which was one of the highlights of the Championships.

In other Field events wins were recorded by Sally Bryant Long Jump, J. Gordon Javelin and Shot Put, with G. Pursell, W. Cope, K. Sullivan, J. Wilkinson, G. Singline, S. Cuthbertson, G. Cleary, C. Schultz and S. Kettle filling the minor places.

Congratulations to Newstead establishing a new Residential Record in the 4×100 Metres Relay, the time being 48.7 seconds.

The most outstanding sprinters in the Sub-junior sprints were J. Merrington and B. Johnson who defeated title holder Debbie Rattray in the 100 and 150 metres. D. Millwood was third in the 100 metres and D. Rattray third in the 150 metres, and Debbie was unplaced in the 100 metres.

Yvonne Tiggelaven performed very well winning the high jump, her jump being 1.53 metres equalling the sub-junior record. Yvonne also won the 100 metre hurdles an inaugural event in the time of 16.9 seconds.

Others to win Field events were D. Brown Long Jump, C. Brasher Discus and Shot and H. Vincent Javelin.

Minor placings were filled by S. Johnson, G. Chick, V. Hay, H. Kolbert and D. Millwood.

In the 80 Metre Juvenile sprint Deborah Walmsley established a new State Record with a very good time of 11.1 seconds. Deborah also won the 100 metres.

L. Gibbons was a close second in the 80 metres her time being 11.2 seconds, and was second in the 100 metres.

Congratulations to the Newstead Club who once again proved their supreme strength at the State Championships by winning all three Shields.

MANAGER'S REPORT TASMANIAN TEAM AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS ADELAIDE

It gives me great pleasure to present the report on the Tasmanian Team who competed at the Australian Championships held in Adelaide on February 28th and March 2nd and 3rd. 1974.

The Team consisted of all Juniors, with Penny Gray Captain, Kaye and Gaye Clayton, Wendy Cope, Francine Murray, Yvonne Tiggelaven, Shirleanne Kettle and Ann Egan.

The Northern girls and myself joined the two Southern girls at Hobart and flew from there to Adelaide where we were met by our Liaison Officer Mrs. Molly Heffernan who is well known to members of the Association.

Owing to a misunderstanding the first night was spent at the Commodore Motel. We were transported there by Ansett Airways, and the next morning they moved us to the Feather Motel, which was very comfortable. The girls had twin rooms and I occupied a single room. The motel was well air conditioned.

On the afternoon of our arrival Penny and Francine had to attend an Athlete's Meeting at Barton Terrace, North Adelaide. Later in the evening we all attended a Welcome Reception at the Red Carpet Room of the Hotel Australia.

At the conclusion of the Reception I had to attend a Manager's meeting, and Mrs. Heffernan had made arrangements for the girls to be taken out for a meal with Mr. Hussey and later returned to the Motel.

Thursday was the first day of the Championships. Penny was the only member of the Team who had to compete. At 10.40 a.m. she ran in Heat 2 of the 400 metres, but failed to make the final, but was placed in fourth position. By this time the heat was starting to tell on the girls.

The Opening Ceremony followed the Junior and Senior Bentathalon, and the Junior and Senior heats. It was a very colourful and spectacular sight. Tasmania was the third Team to march on to the arena. The girls looked very smart in their yellow frocks and green blazers. They were very proud as they were lead by their Captain Penny Gray.

After competition Mrs. Heffernan invited the girls and myself out to her home at Kristy's Beach for a picnic tea. Mr. Hussey again kindly provided the transport. It was a very pleasant evening, and the temperature was much cooler than in the City.

On Friday training was held in the morning and in the afternoon the girls went shopping. By this time the heat was distressing for the girls and Yvonne was not very well. Shirleanne showed her true sportsmanship and stayed with Yvonne at the Motel whilst the rest of us went into the City. After a quiet evening meal the girls went to bed ready for the next day's competition.

Even though Saturday morning gave the appearance of being another extremely hot day, the girl's spirits were high and all were keen to do well.

We were taken to and from the ground by a special bus, which was more convenient than a taxi.

On Saturday we arrived at the ground about mid-day. The first event was the High Jump. Although Yvonne was not up to her usual standard she performed quite well. This was Yvonne's first big competition and I am sure that she has gained a great deal of experience. Francine and Wendy performed quite well but neither girls were up to their best standards.

In the first heat of the 200 metres Gaye Clayton was placed 4th, her time being 26.0 seconds, heat 2 ann Egan was 5th her time being 25.4 seconds. This was Ann's best performance for this distance, and in heat 3 Kaye Clayton was fourth her time being 25.6 seconds. Penny had to wait until 4.35 p.m. for the final of the 800 metres. Her spirits were high and the excitement of the Tasmanian Team and supporters was tremendous, and when Penny won this event it was a great achievement, not only for her, but the people of Tasmania. To see Penny receiving her first gold medal was one of my greatest thrills in all my years that I have been associated with athletics.

The Relay was very exciting and the girls ran very well, and were beaten by the narrowest of margins for a bronze medal.

At the end of competition we returned to our Motel for a quiet rest after all the excitement of the day.

Through the kindness of our President, Mrs. J. Bowring and myself as Manager of the Team we were able to enjoy a celebration dinner. Mrs. Ebzery our State Secretary gave each member of the Team a silver teaspoon with the South Australian Coat of Arms, but was unable to join the girls for dinner owing to a Union engagement.

In the heats of the 100 metres the girls times were as follows:-

The girl's performances were not up to their usual standards, but it is felt that the intensive heat did not help them.

Everyone was waiting for the 1500 metres and were delighted when Penny was awarded the silver medal, her time was 4 mins. 42.2 seconds. Penny was very distressed after this event as the heat was very humid and affected her breathing.

The Closing Ceremony ended another Australian Championship, and I feel sure that it will be long remembered by our girls who thoroughly enjoyed themselves, despite the heat, and they will all be trying hard to make the Team for the Championships to be held in Brisbane next year.

In concluding my report there are a number of people I would like to thank. Firstly, our Liaison Officer Mrs. Molly Heffernan and her husband, Mrs. Brenda Pearl, Mr. Bob Hussey, Mrs. Mavis Ebzery and Mrs. Doreen Frawley for their wonderful help during our stay in Adelaide, and last but not least the girls. Thank you girls for your co-operation and courtesy to me at all times, and it was also pleasing to note the comradeship amongst the girls. I was proud to be associated with all, and wish to thank the Association for the honour of electing me to my position.

In presenting this report for 1973/74 one realizes that it was the twenty second season for athletics on the North West Coast. It is pleasing to note that membership has greatly increased over the years, but rather disappointing in the senior group, as the Club had only one senior athlete for this season. However, it is hoped that an increase in senior membership will be forthcoming next season.

Deciding to open early in October we were fortunate to experience fine weather, which enabled the Club to have a couple of casual days, before the commencement of competition on 3rd November.

The N.W. Schools Championships, conducted by N.W.A.A.B. were held at the Devonport Oval early in November. It was noticeable that club members dominated in majority of events.

Assisted by Darwin athletes, four teams were entered for the Triangular Meeting held at White City. Several members were appearing for first time at inter State Competition, and it was pleasing to note that all gave of their best ability, in true amateur spirit. One feels there would be vast improvement if more of these meets could be held during the seasons.

A Christmas pageant, again conducted by N.W.A.A.B., on a State wide competition was held at Burnie in December when clubs competed on a point scoring basis, for equipment, enabled by a Government grant. It was disappointing that only four clubs participated, but being a new adventure, with limited time for decisions it was understandable that others could not be present. All clubs competing gained positions in the following order. Devon. Darwin, Tamar and O.V.A.

The Forth, Henley and Apex Carnivals were well patronised and all events conducted as handicaps proved very popular among athletes.

The Club entrant in the Miss Athlete Quest was Jann Sheehan, who along with her family did a marvellous job in raising \$600.00 for State Team Fund. We congratulate Jann and heartily thank her and helpers for this wonderful effort.

Our team of twenty one athletes competing at the State Championships all performed well. It was unfortunate that Ruth Squibb and Helen Vincent could not compete, owing to prior commitments, on the second day, as with their ability, had they competed in field events we would possibly have been in the position of gaining one of the shields. Debbie Walmsley performed exceptionally well in winning the juvenile 100M and 80M, breaking the State record in latter by .2 of a second. Others gaining certificates in individual events were Ruth Squibb, Wendy Cope, Jann Sheehan, Helen Vincent, Cindy Brazendale, and Debbie Rattray. Two seconds and one third placings were secured in relays.

Coastal Championships were held over three days, two meetings at Devonport Oval and one at Burnie. Attendance was good and keen competition witnessed in most divisions.

For the end of season meeting Coastal Pentathlon Championships were conducted in five age groups, with each group being allotted a handicap, to give each of the seventeen competitors a chance to hold the perpetual trophy. At the conclusion of events all athletes, officials and supporters gathered for a luncheon, which was greatly appreciated by all. Later in the afternoon the Warden of Devonport was guest speaker and presented some of the main trophies, shields and certificates which were won by athletes during the season.

The twenty-fourth Annual Conference of the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union was held in the Conference Chambers of the Australian Medical Association, 80 Brougham Place, North Adelaide, at 7.30 p.m. on Thursday, 28th February, 1974 and at 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 1st March, 1974.

Your Association was represented by Mrs. M. Ebzery Executive Member, and Mrs. D. Frawley Delegate.

The following motions were carried:-

Rule 21 - Officers and Committees:

The Executive Committee shall consist of one Executive member from each Constituent Association. The President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall be ex officio members without voting power. The President shall have a casting vote only.

Rule 222 - (Amendment):

The election of Manager shall be by voting on the preferential basis, 1,2,3,4,5,6. The successful applicant would be the person gaining the least points.

Rule 234 - (Amendment) Jury of Appeal for Australian Championships:

- (a) A Jury of Appeal of five members none of whom shall be members of the Technical Committee or acting in any other capacity as an official of the Championship Meeting shall be appointed by the Executive Committee of the Union at least one month before each Australian Championship Meeting. An Association may nominate only one Member of the Jury of Appeal, whose qualifications shall be equivalent to those of a Referee, and not more than one member shall be from any one Association.
- (b) <u>Rule 235 Technical Committee of Five Members</u>: Shall be appointed by the Executive Committee of the Union at least one month before the Australian Championship Meeting. Not more than two members of such Technical Committee shall be from any one Association, except the host State whose representation shall be restricted to one of the Referees and the Manager of the Australian Championship Meeting.

Inclusion of Australian Athletes Overseas in International Teams:

An athlete must not have been absent from Australia for more than 12 months prior to selection. She must satisfy the A.W.A.A.U., by Statutory Declaration that she intends to return to take up residence in Australia within a further 12 months or when she has finished her course, if on a scholarship.

She must also have been a continual registered financial member of the Constituent Association to which she belongs in Australia during her absence overseas.

Formation of a Seminar:

. orout

- (a) A Seminar of the Union to be held annually, if practicable, at the time and place of the Australian Championship meeting.
- (b) Each constituent Association shall be permitted to be represented at the Seminar of the Union by the State Secretary.
- (c) Office-Bearers of the Union may attend in an ex-officio capacity.
- (d) Seminar will be restricted to discussions only.

Little Athletics:

All States are experiencing difficulty with this organisation. It has grown out of all proportion. The events being held are most unsuitable (e.g.) girls are doing typical men's events, steeplechase and triple jump.

Our Association was commended by the Union for the stand we have taken in stating that girls must belong to one or the other and not both.

A recommendation has been made to other States to follow our example.

Rule 270 ADD:

- (a) The State Association conducting the Cross Country and Road Walk Australian Championships shall be required to forward to the Honorary Secretary of each participating Association not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the first day of the competition, a contour map and fully detailed description of courses to be used, such information to be made freely available to each Team Manager and all competitors.
- (b) The course for Championship events must be clearly marked with red flags on the left and white flags on the right, all of which must be visible from a distance of 125 metres. Stewards will be positioned at intricate parts of the course to direct competitors so that they will not be hindered or misled in any way.

State Team Managers will not be eligible for appointment to the Jury of Appeal.

Rule 273 - Team Awards: (Additional Amendments)

In the event of there being insufficient members to form a team in any section, the Shield be retained by the last winning State.

Rule 274 - (Amendment) Opening and Closing Ceremonies:

Shall be as laid down for all Australian Championships. Teams will be permitted to wear tracksuits at Opening, Closing and Victory Ceremonies.

An Award for the 3000 metres Junior Road Walk Teams Championship was donated by Mrs. F. Wrighter, Honorary Secretary New South Wales Women's Amateur Athletic Association and to be known as the "Mabel Robinson" Shield.

Rule 274 - (Amendment) Opening and Closing Ceremonies (Cont.)

At the discretion of the host State, a memento (e.g.) silver spoon with emblem be presented to winning members of Team events, other than relays, at Australian Cross Country Road Relays and Road Walk Championships.

Honorariums:

An amount of \$300 was granted to the Honorary Secretary A.W.A.A.U., and \$150 for the Honorary Treasurer.

Entertainment Allowance for Australian Championships:

Owing to the increase in costs the above allowance was increased to \$550.
