It is with great pleasure that I present the twenty-fourth Report for the season 1374/75 and to advise that our Registration for that period was Five Hundred and Eighty.

Our Junior Team consisting of seven members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Track and Field Championships held on the 8th and 9th March in Brisbane.

It was unfortunate that knine Egan who had been performing so well sustained an injury, and the Selectors felt that in the interests of Anne's future it was wise to limit her run to the Relay.

Jan Merrington, Jann Sheehan and Shirley-Anne Kettle performed well in their heats but the moment of glory was when with Anne Egan their fine run in the relay gained them a bronze medal.

Francine Murray jumped very well and was unlucky not to take out third place.

Penny Gray proved her quality by again winning the gold medal in the 800 metres and establishing a Queensland record. Penny also won a silver medal in the 1500 metres. This was a magnificent run with Penny clocking her best ever personal time of 4 mins. 31.8 seconds.

Jenny Gordon in her first year of competition gave a boost to Tasmanian Field Games when she won a silver medal in the shot, with a put of 12.11 metres.

The 1775 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 3th February and Sunday 9th February.

Fay Denholm performed very well taking out the 100, 200 and 400 metres, with Christine Sheehan and Kathy Gilbert filling second and third places and Adele Lucas and Karen Barker filling the minor placings in the 400 metres.

In the 800 and 1500 metres Shirley Brasher was first with Melissa Jory and Daphne Holland filling the minor placings.

In the Field Games, Ruth Squibb was first in the javelin and discus, and second in the shot put.

It was very pleasing to see Elaine McLeod again competing and taking out first place in the shot put, and second in the long jump.

Kathy Gilbert's performances were outstanding, she established a new residential record in the 100 metre hurdles, her time being 15.6 seconds, was also first in the high jump and long jump.

In the junior programme, the most outstanding event was the 400 metres.

Anne Egan and Robyn Gray set off at a blistering pace, each trying to gain the lead, but Anne held a slight advantage until near the end, when Robyn surged past to win and establish a new residential record time of 55.8 seconds.

Penny Gray won the 300 and 1500 metres, and was third in the 400 metres.

Anne Egan was first in the 100 and 200 metres, with Jan Merrington, Robyn Gray and Jann Sheehan filling the minor places.

In the Field Games, Jenny Gordon was the most outstanding, winning the discus and javelin and setting a new residential record in the shot with a put of 11.10 metres.

Others to do well in the high jump, and long jump were Francine Murray, Sally-Anne Setter, Yvonne Tiygelaven, Gaylene Chick and Sally Lansky.

Jann Sheehan won the 100 metre hurdles in the time of 16.7 seconds, but was sind assisted.

Other placings were Sally-/nne Setter and Elizabeth Furst.

Vicki Heath was the most outstanding athlete in the sub-junior 100 and 150 metres. She showed the benefit of her trip to the Sub-Junior Match in Mestern Australia last January.

In the field games girls winning their events were as: Long jump Christine Egan, high jump Susan Johnson, shot put Dianne Brasher, javelin Debra Masciantonia, discus Leanne Capes, who was also second in the javelin and high jump.

Minor placings were taken out by Ruth Duniam, Julie Reil, Francis Stormo, Loree Barnett, Debra Hol, Jocelyn Miller and Sally Whiteway.

In the 100 metre hurdles, Julie weil was first and kuth Duniam and Jody Unn, second and third respectively.

Sandra Speers was the most outstanding juvenile, winning both the 00 and 100 metres with Katrina Fenner taking out second place in each event, and Susan hooper and Anne Voss filling the third placings.

A Sub-Junior Team consisting of Dianne Skeggs, (Captain), Susan Johnson, Ruth Duniam, Vicki Heath and Carmel Hughes represented Tasmania at a fatch held at Perry Lakes Stadium Perth, Western Australia on the 27th January, 1975.

The Team was managed by Mrs. Margaret Skeggs.

Unfortunately the heat and unfamiliar track conditions prevented the girls from registering very good performances, but it is hoped that the experience gained from the interstate competition will prove of benefit to them in the future.

The 1976 Sub-Junior Match will be held in Adelaide during the Australia Day long week-end in January.

It is with very much pleasure and honour that. I present the report of the Tasmanian Team which journeyed to Drisbane to compete at the 1775 National Titles at Lang Park.

Un Wednesday March 5th with two team members and many supporters, we left Tasmania, under a cloud of some very adverse publicity, to meet up with the other five members of the team, who travelled from Launceston, and some more supporters to travel on to brisbane together.

We were met at Brisbane Airport at 4.45 p.m. by our two Liaison officers with a huge box of fruit (one provided for each girl) and they accompanied us to the Hotel where the bookings were found to be slightly awry, however after some discussions and rearrangement everybody was together on the same floor. The team's representative meeting was held at Mrs. Lanyon-Owen's home some distance from the City commencing time 4.30 p.m., we found that our girls were unable to attend, much to their disappointment, the Manager's meeting was also held at the same venue at 6.00 p.m. at which I arrived some three-quarters of an hour late.

Thursday dawned: Opening ceremony and Pentathlonday, also heats of JOO and 400 metres. The opening ceremony and the Dath of Amateurism is a very moving thing and it is such a pity that so few people attend to see this fine display. Unfortunately knne Egan developed some soreness in her knee in the last few days of training before the team left and the Selectors were consulted and it was voted unanimously that she should still travel to the Titles and compete it after seeing a poctor he advised that she should do so. After watching Penny sail through her 300 heat and qualify for the Final in the best time of the two heats and seeing the heats of the 400 run we set off back to the Hotel and Anne and I went to the Doctor, who advised Anne to run in the relay only, as this at 4.45 on Saturday after the heats of the 200 so after much deliberation this event was ruled out for her. We set off for training which was approximately 10 miles distant and the girls got the travel cobwebs out of their legs and organised their relay changes. We left the field in the dark and headed back for a meal, a walk, and bed.

Friday: Was a free day and our liaison officer, Barbara Kennedy, met us at the Hotel after breakfast and we headed for the Gold Coast. A rainy day in urisbane, showers along the Coast. After spending a couple of hours at Southport Harineland where we fed the porpoises, me too, we moved on to Surfers for some much needed lunch, then back to the Hotel. Some of the girls visited relatives or friends for the evening and the rest of us are at the Hotel and turned in for an early night, after everybody had arrived home on time.

Saturday: Weather reasonable and the girls arrived for breakfast looking just a bit pale and not very hungry. Time passes slowly when it's your first time on the track at the vationals. The two Jans were very quiet and Jenny was very excited, the others were just subdued, the butterflies were working overtime.

So we arrived at Lang Park for some keen competition. Froncine did very well in the high jump, jumping her personal best. Shirley Anne and Jan Merrington acquitted themselves very well in the 200 heats and came very close to a berth in the final, Jenny Gordon did well in the Discus at 3.00 p.m.; then the 500 metres at 4.15 p.m. and Penny showed them how to come home with a gold medal with a well timed and perfectly planned run, well done Penny and thank you.

Then it was the Relay team's turn and those baton changes were perfect. Thank you girls for a well run race and a bronze medal. A thank you goes to Fay Denhold from the girls for her assistance and encouragement to them in the relay. Happily we left the field and that evening we attended the "Peppers" a Bavorian resturant which served very good food and a relaxing night was had by all.

Sunday: Competition commencing at 1.20 p.m. The Junior Javelin at 1.40 and Jenny Gordon took the field for the second time and did very well in this event. 100 metres heats at 1.50 and the two Jans ran very well and should be better in the future with this experience, keep it up girls. The 1500 metres at 2.40 saw Penny on the track again and bringing home a silver medal inside the pending Australian record time. This was the only record broken during the Titles, well done Penny, thank you again. Then at 4.10 it was Jenny's turn again in the Junior Shot Put and in this event she pulled out all stops and finished with a silver medal and her personal best distance, well done Jenny and thank you.

The closing ceremony at approximately 5.00 p.m. was another occasion, once again in front of very few people as the majority of the crowd were making their way home. (Nore announcements should be made re this ceremony)

May I thank the Tasmanian Association for the honour and pleasure of the Manager's position for the 1775 Titles. It certainly was a pleasure to look after seven beaut kids and definitely an honour to return home with them, the bearers of the most medals yet for a Tasmanian team.

Also may I suggest that when it is our turn to have the Titles in our State that the Team's representative and the Manager's meetings be held at a central venue convenient to all accommodations.

The girls all settled into their respective billets and had a light relay practise that evening. Thursday, another run and Friday morning practise at the track with the afficial starter.

On Saturday the programme was conducted on the Lower Grounds - the temperature in the high 30's and some of the girls distressed by the heat. Susan Johnson and Ruth Duniam were the first to compete for us in the High Jump and the 100 metre hurdles. Ruth competed well in the hurdles and shot put but found the competition too much.

Vicki Heath and Dianne Skeggs both had some stiff competition in their respective heats of the 100 metres. Winning heat times being 12:1 and 12:3 seconds. Vicki's run of 13 secs. equalled her personal best time.

Sunday competition was held on the top ground with much cooler conditions and a strong wind down the finishing straight. Once again the other competitors were much stronger and although Dianne had a fourth placing in the 200 metres heats, their times weren't up to their standard here. Once they hit the straight the wind slowed them up considerably. Buth then competed in the discus and Susan and Ruth in the long jump. Finally the 4 x 100 metres relay again we were sixth, but I am sure that all the girls realise that they went for experience and they had everything to gain. They are the Juniors and Seniors of tomorrow and I hope that their trip away will instil in them the urge to continue to strive for improvement in every way.

I feel I must make mention here of the fact that eleven out of the thirteen records were broken during the meeting, some of the times even better than Junior records! Roll on the Tarton Track and the sooner the better. Also, in view of the fact that 400 and 300 metres are programmed ifficially in sub-junior interstate competitions, I would like to recommend that these events be included regularly in our Inter-Club and State Championship programmes.
