LADIES.

Once again I have pleasure in presenting the twenty-fifth Annual Report for the season 1974/75 and to advise that our Registration for that period was five hundred and eighty three.

It is very pleasing to report that even though our State is the smallest in area, we had the largest increase in registration for the 1975/76 season, than any of the other Australian States.

A Junior Team consisting of eight members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Men and Women's Combined Australian Track and Field Championships held on the 18th and 21st March inclusive, in Melbourne.

Congratulations to Penny Gray for her outstanding performances in the 800 and 1500 metres, not only did she win a gold medal in each event, but established two new Australian Junior Records.

Anne Egan performed very well, winning a silver medal in the 200 metres, and a bronze medal in the 400 metres and was a member of the Relay Team, winning another silver medal.

The other members of the Team, namely Jan Merrington, Carmel Hughes, Dianne Skeggs, Jenny Gordon, Yvonne Tiggelaven and Sally Whiteway performed well and the experience gained by all girls will be of great benefit to them in the future.

Congratulations to Jan, Carmel and Dianne who were members of the Relay Team, together with Anne, ran the good time of 47.7 seconds, taking out second place and winning a silver medal.

The 1976 State Championships were conducted on Saturday 7th February and Sunday 8th February.

In the senior division Robyn Gray, Christine Sheehan, Johanne Nolan, Shirley Brasher and Adele Lucas were prominent.

Jan Merrington (Newstead) broke the State Residential Junior 100 metres record in her heat in the outstanding time f 11.8 seconds, and won the title in a close finish from Anne Egan (Sandy Bay), her time in the final, being 12.3 seconds.

Anne Egan (Sandy Bay) had her revenge in the 200 metres, when she won from Newstead girls Carmel Hughes and Jan Merrington.

Outstanding performances came from Penny Gray winning the junior 800, 1500 and a dashing 400 metres win over Anne Egan and Dianne Skeggs.

Jenny Gordon took out the junior shot, discus and javelin events, Yvenne Tiggelaven high jump, Jennifer Fagg long jump, and Jann Sheehan hurdles.

Sparkling performances came from sub-juniors Sally Whiteway, Vioki Heath, Susan Johnson, Lee Capes, Kim Eyre, Christine Egan and Dianne Brasher.

The outstanding juvenile was Susan Scarafictti who took out the titles in the 80 and 100 metres.

Congratulations to Sandy Bay winning the "F.J. KOHL", SHIELD from Newstead who had retained it for seven consecutive years.

The most outstanding member of the Team was Sally Whiteway who won her heat in the 800 metres with a time of 2m. 21.1 secs., and was third in the final, redusing her time to 2m. 16.6 secs.

The 1977 Sub-Junior Match will be held in Melbourne during the Australia-Day long week-end in January.

### Manager's Report - Tasmanian Team

It is with honour and admiration that I present the report on the Tasmanian Women's Amateur Athletic team who competed at the Australian Women's championships held at Olympic Park Melbourne from Thursday 18th March to 21st March.

The team members were Jan Merrington (captain), Penny Gray, Anne Egan, Jenny Gordon, Yvonne Tigglehaven, Carmel Hughes, Dianne Skeggs and Sally Whiteway.

On Wednesday 17th March with Northern members of the team and many supporters we left Western Junction to fly to Melbourne where we met the four Hobart team members. Their flight was direct from Hobart to Melbourne and they were accompanied by Mrs. Ebzery Mrs. Frawley and supporters. Unfortunately our plane was half an hour late leaving which ment the southern girls had arrived first.

We were met at Tullamarine by Mrs. M. McQuestion and other members of the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association and our liasion officer Miss. Pat Brudenall. We were presented with a box of fruit, nuts and sweets from the Victorian Association and I am sure the girls all appreciated the gift and I wish on behalf of the team to say thank you for this thoughtful gesture.

We arrived at the Commodore Motel, St. Kilda where we checked in, hanged and then went to lunch. We travelled to Olympic Park to ckeck in Jenny Gordon's field game equipment and the girls did their training. It was a change for them to loosen up and get the feel of the track.

That evening Jan Merrington and Anne Egan attended the teams' meeting at the Y.W.C.A. and I attanded the managers' meeting. I was disappointed to learn at the meeting that the Opening March and assembly of Teams had been deleted and only the Captains of the men and women's state team were to assemble. The women were not to carry their State flag but after discussions it was agreed for each state to meet with their flag by 9 a.m. When we would be told if our captain could carry their flag. It was not until 10 a.m. that it was agreed that the captain of each of the Women's teams would carry their associations flag.

Thursday, the Opening Ceremony was held with all Team Captains assembled. Charlene Rendina pronounced the amateur oath. Penny, Sally, Dianne and Anne were feeling a little nervous. First to compete was Sally in her heat of the Junior 800 metres. Salyy only 14 yrs. of age performed well, this being her first run in Australian National Titles. Her time of 2.20.8 sec. was outside her best performance but this type of competition was new to her. The experience Sally gained will help her in future championships. Sally was not last and I am sure she has the potential to go further.

There was great excitement when Penny set a new Australian and Victorian record in her heat of the Junior 800 metres. Penny ran with such ease it was lovely to watch. We were all very proud of her and it gave us great hopes for the final. Well done Penny. Next came the heats of the Junior 400 metres. First to compete was Dianne. Dianne gave a grand performance and although did not make the final she ran her fastest 400 metre ever in 56.9 sec. For Dianne too, it was her first Nationals. Congratulations Dianne.

Anne was next and we were all thrilled with Anne's performance. Anne gained second placing in 55.3 sec. this gave us a team number in the 400 metres final. Well done Anne.

Penny was in the third Heat and excelled herself at the finish of the 400 metres. J. Nabor, Victoria and Penny both clocked the same time of 55.0 sec. but it was unlucky for Penny to be officially placed third as this put her out of the final. It is most disappointing when only 1st and 2nd qualify for a final and fast third placegetters miss out.

After competition was over the girls who had to train did so and then practised their relay. Although it was getting dark Jan, Dianne and Carmel were determined to practice baton changing so waited until Anne was ready. It was quite dark but at least it gave them confidence. We left Olympic Park, travelled into the city had tea then returned to our motel to shower and rest.

Friday was a free day. Penny went with her parents to Geelong. Anne went to Essendon to friends, Jenny visited her mother and the rest of the team and myself went shopping and visited the Victorian market. We all enjoyed our outing and were back at the motel by 4 p.m. to rest. In the evening the girls went to tea and I attended the Smorgasborg given by the Victorian Women's Amateur Association. I wish to say it was a most enjoyable evening and I have never seen such a fine display of food. The caterers and organizers are to be congratulated.

Saturday arrived. This was our first big day. The girls Anne, Jan Carmel, Penny and Diane all warmed up. Jenny had practised. So we were all ready, but of course, the butterflies and nerves were all acting at once.

The wind was quite strong and came in gushes, in fact it was quite uncanny. At the field games the officials told me it came in like wurly winds making competition difficult. First heat of the Junior 200 metres we had Jan competing. She came fourth with a good run. Heat two Carmel gained fifth placing in 25.9 sec. a good performance by Carmel her first time in Australian National competition. Heat three was exciting with Anne winning in 24.9 sec. This gave us another chance in the final of the 200 metres. Congratulations Anne on a fine run.

Next was the Junior High Jump. Yvonne was nervous but gave her best under the conditions and jumped 1.55m. This was not the best height that Yvonne can jump but we were proud of her. Well done Yvonne.

Then came the final of the Junior 800 metres. A result for all Tasmanians to be proud of. Penny won a gold medal with first placing and broke her Australian and Victorian record in the time of 2.06.2 sec. Congratulations on a top class performance.

This was followed by the final of the Junior 200 metres. Anne gaining second placing in 24.7 sec. and a silver medal. A brilliant run by Anne and congratulations.

Conditions were very heavy and windy when Jenny competed in the Junior Discus. Jenny gave her best under the circumstances and did well, considering she had a throat virus. We were all proud of her. Well done Jenny.

The Junior 4 x 100 metres Relay was next on the program for us. Our team of Dianne, Carmel, Jan and Anne were all keyed up and did they give a performance. I am sure the Tassie cheer squad could be heard above all. The girls really excelled themselves for their State and gained a silver medal. Congratulations girls on your 2nd placing and on a fine performance clocking 47.7 sec. We returned to the motel very excited and happy with our days results and the tensions of the team had lessened.

After a rest the Team with the exception of Anne who visited her grandmother went to a restaurant in the city to celebrate our successful day and my birthday (with apple cider). Thank you girls for your thoughtfulness of a nice birthday gift and for your company at dinner. We returned early to rest in readiness for our second big day.

Sunday another day of success. First to compete was Jenny in the Junior Javelin. Jenny still not feeling 100% did her best with a throw of 33.18. Well done Jenny.

The Junior 100 metres. First heat we had Jan competing. Jan's performance was very pleasing. She gained second placing in 12.3 sec. with only point one separating first and second. This qualified Jan for the final. Heat two we gained third placing with Anne with a good run clocking 12.5 sec. Anne also qualified for the final. Heat three was the fastest heat of the 100 metres the winners time being 12.0 sec. and second in 12.1 sec. Carmel ran very well and came fifth clocking 12.5 sec. together with the 3rd and 4th placings. At the conclusion of the heats we had two representatives to take part in the 100 metres Junior final.

Next the Junior 1500 metres. Penny once again came flying home with another Australian and Victorian record and a gold medal. It was a grand performance and I am sure next Australian Championships we will see Penny performing with the same success in the Senior section. Congratulations Penny.

Then came the Junior 100 metres final with our two girls Jan and Anne taking their mark. Although they did not come 1st, 2nd or 3rd they gave a wonderful performance. Jan clocked 12.5 sec 7th placing and Anne 12.5 sec. in 8th placing. There was only point 5 seperating the first eight placings. A very close finish. This proves how well the girls ran.

The Junior Shot Put. Jenny was our representative. Jenny's performance was not what she is capable of doing but once again under the circumstances we were very pleased with efforts. Jenny came fifth with a throw of 12.09m. there was 8 competitors.

In the Junior Long Jump we had Anne competing. She did her best and thats all we can expect.

Our last event came at 3.35 p.m. the Junior 400 metres final and the cheer squad was waiting anxiously. We had Anne competing in this final. Anne gave a great performance and came third gaining a bronze medal clocking 55.7 sec. only point two behind second placing. Congratulations Anne.

We left the Olympic Park with our medals and feeling very proud. We all attended a barbecue at the Army Barracks conducted by the International. We enjoyed in very much. It gave the young athletics both girls and boys a chance to mingle and talk to each other. We were feeling tired and most of the teams had left so we departed from the barbecue at 9 p.m., went into Flinders Street Station by car and then taxied home to the motel to pack.

Next morning being Monday we checked out of the motel, taxied to A.N.A. depot checked all luggage in and then the girls went back into the city to finish their shopping. I stayed at the depot as my knee was painful after a fall I had on the steps the previous day. I was joined by Mrs. Frawley and Mrs. Park, then Mrs. Ebzery and Mrs. Claxton came to say good-bye to us all. The girls returned and we departed from the depot and arrived at the airport where we only had a few minutes before our plane left. It was very pleasing to have the whole team leaving together.

In conclusion I wish to thank our captain Jan Merrington for the way she conducted herself. As captain Jan carried out her duties creditably in every way and was a very good help to our younger girls. She helped me at all times.

To all members of the team I wish to thank for their co-operation given to me and for my lovely gift. I was very proud to have been the manager of the Tasmanian Team for 1976.

The Team returned to Tasmania with two gold medals, two new Australian and Victorian records, five silver medals and one bronze medal. I think this has been one of our best Junior teams to compete in an Australian championship and I am sure the T.W.A.A.A. the Tasmanian people, parents and clubs of these girls must be very proud.

The new Tasmanian women's competitive uniform looked very smart.

I wish to thank Fay and Elaine for their help given in coaching the relay team. Thanks to Mrs. Ebzery our State Secretary for the help and advice given to me and to the girls at all times and I would like to express how fortunate we are to have such a capable person as Mrs. Ebzery for our State Secretary, and congratulate her on selection as a jury member at the titles. Thank you to all who assisted me. Thank you also to every one who sent us telegrams.

Thanks to the T.W.A.A.A. for making it possible for me to be Manager of such a successful Team. I carried out my duties as Manager to the best of my ability. It is a very hard task to please all but I would like everyone to know that I did my best. Finally, I wish to thank the T.W.A.A.A. for selecting such a delightful motel for our accommodation.

Diane's time of 12.8 sec. was her personal best. Diane also competed in the Shot Put and 400 metres heat and although unplaced recorded her personal best in both events. No one can ask for more. On Saturday Lee Capes competed in the Javelin and Shot Put, Lee tried hard but found competition very strong in those events. The team was given a boost when Sally Whiteway won her heat of the 800 metres. Sally had plenty of supporters in the final and she finished 3rd, clocking her best ever time of 2.16.6 sec. It was a very exciting moment for us. This was our first placing.

On the Saturday night a barbecue tea was held by Mrs. B. Pearl for New South

Wales and Tasmania Teams and families. It was enjoyed by all.

Sunday - It was competition again. First event being the Long Jump at 1:30 p.m. We had two representatives in Lee Capes and Susan Johnson. Tracey Nation and Lyn Page took their mark for the 1500 metres. Both girls tried extremely hard and were very determined. Tracey finished sixth in a field of ten recording 4.53.2 sec. She has next season in the Sub junior ranks and ne doubt learnt a lot from the competition. Lyn was hampered by sore legs and after falling, showed great courage to finish the race. She felt disappointed in herself but she certainly had no reason to, for it was a hard race and one could only feel proud of her efforts. Vicky Heath and Donna Peters ompeted in the 200 metres heats. Donna struck 1st and 2nd placegetters of the final but shedid not give up trying. Vicky clocked a creditable 26.7 sec. The Relay was the final event. It was most unfortunate and very disappointing for Susan Johnson who suffered a leg injury thus preventing her from taking part. Sally Whiteway took Susan's place as starter and teamed together with Diane Brasher, Donna Peters and Vicky Heath. We were unplaced but was pleased with their time of 51.9 sec.

Winners of events were presented with souvenir spoons. The Teams assembled and took part in the closing ceremony which was followed by a buffet tea at the oval. It was the end of two days top class competition. This was proven by the many records that were broken. Victoria won the overall competition and was presented

with the Shield.

Monday - We all met at the airport for our trip home leaving Adelaide at 1.05 p.m.

This Sub-Junior Interstate Match was a wonderful experience for everyone who took part and I am sure the girls have all learnt a great deal. Our two 13 year old girls, Tracey Nation and Diane Brasher must surely benefit from this trip.

### 1976 CONFERENCE AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION:

The twenty-sixth Annual Conference of the Australian Women's Amateur Athletic Union was held at the Y.W.C.A., 489 Elizabeth Street, Melbourne on Wednesday, March 17th at 7.30 p.m., and on Thursday, March 18th, 1976 at 7.30 p.m.

Your Association was represented by Mrs. M. Ebzery Executive Member, and Mrs. D. Frawley Delegate.

Rule 9 Jurisdiction Par. 2: "Little Athletes shall be 12 years of age and under". This motion was withdrawn by Queensland.

Rule 20. Officers and Committees: AMEND to read "The Officers of the Union shall be President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, whose term of office shall not exceed six years. These members to hold office for periods of two, four and six years respectively, the order of retirement to be decided by lot thereafter at each Annual Conference. The vacancy occurring in that year shall be filled by the election of a person who may hold office for six years only". THIS MOTION WAS LOST.

Rule 69 Investigations: The following amendments were submitted to conform with the substitution of "Executive Committee" for "Investigation Committee passed 1975 Annual Conference and were carried.

- (b) DELETE "Investigation" and substitute "Executive". ADD "For the purpose of investigation the quorum shall be not less than three, but those comprising the Committee shall bot include more than one member of the Association involved in the investigation".
