It is with pleasure I present for your consideration the twenty-sixth Annual Report for the 1976/77 scason and to advise that our registration for that period was 560 athletes and 70 officials.

A Team consisting of four Junior members and two Senior members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Australian Women's Track and Field Championships held on the 5th and 6th March inclusive, in Sydney.

Jenny GCRDCH (Captain) - Shot, discus, javelin

Penny GRAY - 400. 800 and 1500 metres

Carmel HUGHES - 100, 200, 400 metres and 4 x 100 M. Relay.

Diame BRASHER - 100, 200, 400 metres and 4 x 100 M. Relay.

Jan Merrington - 100, 200, metres and 4 x 100 M. Relay.

Vicki HEA'CH - 4 x 100 metre relay.

HANAGER: - Urs. Elaine McLeod.

Penny Gray who was competing for the first time in senior ranks proved that she had the ability to win yet another gold medal in the 800 metres and a silver in the 1500 metres.

Jenny Gordon was unplaced in her events, but performed very well and the experience of competing in the senior division should benefit her for competition this season.

The Junior members of the Team performed very well, and were unlucky not to have third placings in some events. Carmel Hughes ran a creditable 400 metres final, her time being 55.6 seconds. Carmel's personal best. This time was the same as the 2nd and 3rd placings.

The 4 x 100 metres relay team, consisting of Carmel Hughes, Dianne Brasher, Jan Merrington and Vicki Heath were fourth in this event, their time being 49.9 secs.

The 1977 State Track and Field Championships were conducted at the Domain Athletic Centre on Saturday 7th February and Sunday 8th February, on the new Chevron Track.

The Saturday after the was spoilt at times by a gale-force wind, but conditions on Sunday were quite pleasant.

Hany close and exciting races were witnessed. Penny Gray dominated the senior track events, winning the 400, 800, 1500 and 3000 metre titles, but was unable to establish any new records, except in the 3000 metres, which was an inaugural event.

Jenny Gordon continued her consistent form by easily winning the three senior throwing events. Jenny had broken the shot put record four times during the season, but narrowly missed the mark at the Titles.

Other Senior titleholders were Anne Egan 100 metres and long jump, Jann Sheehar 100 metre Hurdles, Robyn Gray 200 metres.

Carmol Hughes was the outstanding junior sprinter winning the 100, 200 and 400 metres.

Susan Johnson established a new residential record in the long jump with a leap of 5.31 metres. Susan also won the high jump.

Other girls who won titles were S. Moore (1500 metres), C. Brasher (hurdles and discus), S. Whiteway (800 metres), A. Blackbarrow (javelin), and E. Firth (Shot).

The Sandy Bay 4 x 400 metre Junior Relay Team consisting of Therese Postma, Michelle Postma, Louise Eslake and Dianne Skeggs established a new State and Residential Record with the time of 4m.02.4 seconds.

Jocelyn Hillar was the most successful sub-junior competitor, creating new records in the long and high jumps, winning the javelin throw and gaining second place in the 100 metres.

Other Sub-Junior who did well were Dianne Brasher (100 metres), Tracey Nation (1500 metres), Robyn Marshall (100 metre Hurdles), Lisa Gray (800 metres), Gail Millar (200 metres), Susan Hooper (150 metres).

The Juvelin section was hotly contested but Leah Millar proved too strong for the opposition and easily won the 80 and 100 metre events.

Other athletes who did well were S. Lyons, J. Fogarty and J. Philpott.

Congratulations to Tracey Nation and Dianne Brasher on winning a silver medal each, and bronze medal winnter Lisa Gray and Jocelyn Hillar.

Gail Millar, Sophie Sullivan, and Anne-Louise Hunt were unplaced in their events, but their performances were creditable and the experience gained will be helpful to them in their future career.

I have pleasure in presenting my Report on the 1977 State Sub-junior team who competed in Helbourne on Saturday and Sunday 29th-30th January at the All Australian Sub-Junior Interstate Track and Field Hatch.

The team - Tracey Nation (captain) Dianne Brasher, Lisa Gray, Jocelyn Millar, Gail Millar, Ann-Louise Hunt and Sophie Sullivan.

Thursday - From Launceston we travelled by T.A.A. to Tullamarine where we met the four Hobart team girls. Time of arrival was 11.45 a.m. We were met by our Liasion Officer Mrs. H. Jansen and Mrs. Pat McDonnell. After lunch at the airport they accompanied us in the coach to T.A.A. city terminal which was only around the corner from the YWCA where we were to stay. Our accommodation was very nice and we were all very happy there. West Australia, South Australia and New South Wales teams also stayed there. The girls changed and we went to Aberfeldie Park to see the track, a rubberised ashphalt track and to do light training.

Friday - Although it was a free day there was light training for Gail Millar and Ann-Louise Hunt who were not to compete until Sunday. We went to a nearby oval after breakfast and all met in the city for lunch. A barbecue tea had been arranged by our host club Malvern Glen-Iris together with Glenhuntley Club for West Australia and Tasmania teams. It was a very enjoyable and relaxing evening. We travelled with W. A. tean members by train to Jordanville where we were met by families and taken by cars to the home of the Seekamp family. We returned early in family cars ready for competition the next day.

Saturday - The girls had a restful morning. We travelled by Taxis to the oval. I attended the Managers meeting held prior to commencement of the program where we dealt with any problems. All teams assembled in competitive State uniforms for the Opening Ceremony. Tracey carried our State flag. Because of the heat the Opening Ceremony was very brief. The Competition was officially opened by Mrs. A. Robinson MBE President of the Australian Momen's Amateur Athletic Union and the origin of the match explained. The oath of Amateurism was pronounced by Victorian team captain Lisa Seekamp.

For us it was to be a very exciting afternoon. First event - High Jump. Jocelyn Millar was our representative. Jocelyn reach 1.57m which was equal to her State Residential record. Whilst still competing in the High Jump permission had been granted for Jocelyn to leave to compete in the first heat of the 100 metres. Although unplaced Jocelyn's time of 12.8 sec, was equal to her personal best. During the heats of the 100 metres the starting line of the track had been hosed several times.

Heat two was Dianne Brasher. Dianne was 3rd in her personal best time of 12.5 sec. This qualified her for the final. 30 mins. later Dianne ran in the first heat of the 400 metres finishing 3rd in the time of 58.6 secs. This meant two finals for Dianne.

Sophie Sullivan was in Heat two. Sophie was terribly nervous. She tried very hard and clocked 62.4 sec. At conclusion of this event Sophie suffered exhaustion but with help and assistance from St. Johns Ambulance she was soon looking herself again.

Event 10 was the 1500 metres. We were represented by Tracey Nation and Lisa Gray. It was a great race and great results. Placings were Tracey 2nd in 4 m 42.6 and Lisa 4th in 4 m 48.5 secs. Tracey was our first girl on the Victory dias. A silver medal for her efforts.

The 100 metres final followed. Dianne was unplaced but she turned the table in the final of the 400 metres. With a magnificent run Dianne finished 2nd in 57.9 sec. this was well inside Dianne's personal best time. The winner M. Jones form South Australia clocked 57.7 sec.

The day's program concluded at 5 p.m.

We accompanied the W.A. girls and their Manager's to tea in the city and returned to YWCA for an early night.

Sunday - Families called for our team to transport us to the Oval. First event was the Long Jump at 2 p.m. Our representatives were Ann-Louise Hunt and Jocelyn Millar. Both girls prepared their run ups and appeared quite happy. Ann-Louise's best jump was 4.94 m. Jocelyn made the final top 6 and on conclusion of the event Jocelyns best leap of 5.31 m gave her 3rd placing a bronze medal. We were all very excited.

This was followed by heats of the 800 metres. It was excitement again when Lisa Gray won the first heat and Tracey Nation finished 4th in heat two. Both girls qualifying for the final.

Heats of the 200 metres. Gail Hillar in Heat one finished 3rd with a fine run and Dianne Brasher 2nd in Heat two. Again two girls into the final.

Event No. 6 the 800 metres final. It was a thrilling race and Lisa finished 3rd in 2.18.0 with Tracy 5th. I was proud to perform the Medallion Victory Presentation.

The following event was the 200 metres final. Dianne was 4th in her best ever time of 25.4 sec. with Gail 7th in 26.0 sec. This was a personal best time for Gail also. Although unplaced both girls should feel very proud of their times and it was an achievement alone to compete in the final.

Last event was the 4×100 metre Relays. Tasmania finished 4th in 49.6 sec. a very good time and only .3 behind the 3rd placegetters.

All teams assembled for the closing ceremony. It was announced that Brisbane will be the next venue. The L.C. Fills shield was presented to the Victorian team who narrowly defeated Western Australia.

A Buffet tea was organised for all teams and families and enjoyed by all.

Monday - It was our day of departure. On two separate flights we left Melbourne at approx 1.30 p.m.

It is hard to find words to express the thrill and excitement it has given me to be able to share the success of the girls and to bring home 2 silver medals and 2 bronze. This was the first time that medals had been presented to the placegetters.

Our team of seven was only very small but filled with talented young athletes the promise of a bright future for Tasmanian Athletics.

The girls have every reason to feel very proud of their efforts. Each one tried so hard and with determination and must benefit from the experience of competing in this match. Gail Millar, Lisa Gray and Sophie Sullivan our 13 year old girls have the opportunity to try for State representation as sub-junior again next season.

The Melbourne people were wonderful to us and were willing to help us in every way.

We made many friends and I would like to especially mention the West Australia team and their Hanager Mrs. Norma Christensen for the companionship we all shared.

A special thank you to the girls for the lovely gift, thoughtfulness and co-operation. They were a credit to their State.

To State Secretary, Clubs and families who sent Good Luck telegrams a Big Thank You.

In conclusion I wish to thank the Association for giving me the opportunity to take the Sub-junior team to Melbourne, and to thank everyone who helped in anyway.

It was a trip I will always remember.

It is with pleasure that I present my report on the activities of the Tasmanian Team competing at the Australian Women's Track & Field Championships, held in Sydney from the 3rd to the 6th larch '77.

The Team consisting of Seniors Penny Gray, Jenny Gordon (Captain), Juniors - Jan Merrington, Carmel Hughes, Vicki Heath and Diame Brasher, left Tasmania on Wednesday 2nd March. On arrival at Sydney Airport we were met and made welcome by the Secretary of the N.S.W.W.A.A.A. (Mrs. F. Wrighter), and our Liaison Officer Mrs. Dawn Smith. We were guests of the Randwick Botany Harrier Club, who provided us with a delicious luncheon. The girls were presented with Club badges and other souvenirs and taken on a tour of inspection of the magnificent Club rooms. liember of the Randwick Botany Harriers Social Committee were very kind to us, throughout our stay in Sydney. Dawn and Barry Smith did everything they could to make things easy for us.

The most outstanding performer for Tasmania was Penny Gray competing for the first time in Senior ranks. Penny used her heat of the 400 metres on Thursday as a warm up for her serious competition at the weekend. Although Penny ran well in the 1500 metres she lacked Angela Cook's senior experience, but she acquitted herself well to fill 2nd place in 41 27.8 secs. On Sunday Penny was more relaxed and confident, and we had the pleasure of seeing her running at her best, with effortless case she kept ahead of the opposition and came home an easy winner in 2 mins. 05.5 secs. Carmel Hughes showed out well in the Junior 200 and 400 metres. In her heat of the 400 metres she clocked 56.6, and went on to record a personal best of 55.6 in the final. It was Jenny Gordon's first experience up among the Seniors and she struck very tough opposition in all the Field events, Jenny was among the final 8 who qualified in both the Shot Put and Discus Throw. The Relay Team of Vicki Heath, Dianne Brasher, Carmel Hughes and Jan Herrington combined well and ran an exciting race coming in a close 4th, this smooth combination is due to the training of their coach Mrs. Fay Denholm.

The accommodation at the Canberra Oriental was satisfactory, our rooms were very good, my only criticsm was the lack of co-operation with regards meals. It is often necessary to be able to order meals of a varying nature, to be supplied at different times on days of competition, and I would suggest that if it is possible enquiries about these facilities could be made when the bookings are done.

The morale of the Team was very high at all times. The manners and behaviour of the girls was excellent. I would like to thank them for their co-operation, the good will shown towards me, and their cheerfulness towards each other made my task a very easy one.

The Opening and Closing Ceremonies were spectacular, but rather marred by rain.

A quaint out of the way Restaurant provided the setting for a happy Dinner Party; to celebrate Penny's wonderful performances at the Nationals, this was given for the Team by the Tasmanian supporters, Mrs. Ebzery and Mrs. Claxton were unable to attend but gave a donation.

I wish to thank the Association for granting me the privilege of looking after our State Tam, to Mrs. Ebzery for the help and advice she is always willing to give, a special mention to all the Tasmanian supporters who despite the deplorably wet conditions barracked loudly for all our competitors.

Also a big thank you, goes to all club members for their participation on all occasions, which enabled club to gain sufficient points to finish on top.

The Burnie Pageant again drew representation from all Northern, and Coastal Clubs. After, a good days sport Newstead Club ran out winners from Devon, however we were proud of the way all team members gave of their best.

Club appreciated invitations to carnivals at North, Henley on Mersey, and Wesley Vale, unfortunately the day at Wesley Vale had to be deleted owing to it clashing with Men's State Championships.

North West Coast team Triangulars in Launceston consisted entirely of Devon members. Unfortunately some athletes did not attend, and left short of runners. When it is realised, that Ruth and Judith Duniam came all way from Mawbanna to compete, a little more effort from some of our other athletes to attend would be appreciated, especially as team was a Coastal one, and members were not competiting as individuals. J. Sheehan won open hurdles and also filled several placings. Others to be placed were C. Viney, H. Vincent, M. Elphinstone, J. Duniam, and S. Whiteway.

From an entry of twenty only seventeen made trip to compete in State Championships held on new Domain track for first time. J. Sheehan was our only senior to win an event, with S. Whiteway doing same in junior section. The two girls mentioned plus following, H. Vincent, R. Duniam, C. Viney, M. Elphinstone, and J. Duniam, all managed to fill placings. Congratulations must also go to the four juveniles, who were competiting at their first big meeting, and I'm sure all gained from the experience.

Pentathlon was first of Coastal Championships held at Devonport on January 15th while remainder of events were held over three days at Burnie, Ulverstone, and Devonport. To allow all competitors a chance of winning the Perpetual Trophy, given Pentathlon competition, everyone was given a handicap according to their ability in the five events. This year M. Elphinstone won narrowly from S. Whiteway, and J. Batt.
