#### LADIES:

It is with pleasure that I present for your consideration the twenty-seventh Annual Report for the 1977/78 season and to advise that our registration for the period was 466 athletes and officials.

A Junior Team of six members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Combined Men and Women's Championships held on the 16th/19th March inclusive, in Brisbane.

Carmel HUGHES: 100,200,400 metres, 4 x 100 and 4 x 400m Relays

Jocelyn MILLAR: High jump, Long jump and 4 x 100m Relay Gail MILLAR: 100,200, 4 x 100m, and 4 x 400m Relay

Lisa GRAY : 800 and 1500 metres

Sally WHITEWAY: 400,800 metres and 4 x 400m, Relay -

Sophie SULLIVAN: 100,200,400m, 4 x 100m, and 4 x 400m Relay

MANAGER : Mrs. Peggy Bell.

Under the appalling conditions the girl's performances were outstanding, having won six silver and two bronze medallions.

Our congratulations are extended to Jocelyn Millar, silver medal in the high jump event with a leap of 1.75 metres, Lisa Gray, silver medal in the 800 metres and a bronze medal in the 1500 metres, the event which had to be re-run, a remarkable effort by Lisa considering the conditions under which she had to compete.

Members of the 4 x 400 metres Relay Sophie Sullivan, Gail Millar, Sally Whiteway and Carmel Hughes, a silver medallion each in this event.

Carmel was third in the 400 metres winning a bronze medal.

The 1978 State Track and Field Championships were conducted at the Domain Athletic Centre on Saturday, 18th February and Sunday, 19th February.

The conditions were pleasant on both days and the Championships were enjoyed both by athletes and officials, and seven records were broken and two equalled in the track and field titles.

New figures were set in the junior 400 metres by Sally Whiteway after a hard run race with Sandy Bay girls Therese Postma and Dianne Skeggs.

In the sub-junior section Sophie Sullivan (North Launceston) and Gail Millar (Eastern Suburbs) figured in several close and exciting finishes with Sophie having record breaking wins in the 200 and 400 metres and Gail breaking the 100 metre record.

Lisa Gray (Riverside) created new records in her sub-junior 800 and 1500 metres.

Susan Johnson equalled the junior hurdles record.

In the senior division Louise Eslake (Sandy Bay) won the 100, 200 and 400 metre titles.

Jenny Gordon won the javelin, discus and shot.

The junior 100 and 200 metres went to State Junior Champion Carmel Hughes (Newstead).

The senior 800,1,500 and 3,000 metre races were won by State Champion Penny Gray (Riverside).

Joanne Oliver (Sandy Bay) threw well to win the junior javelin title.

Leah Miller (Eastern Suburbs) won the 150 metres from Gail Simpson (Devon) and Kathy Boon (Newstead), Robyn Farrelly (Newstead) was the most outstanding juvenile runner at the titles, winning both 80 and 100 metre events.

Jenny Abraham (Tamar) won the sub-junior shot put, discus and javelin throwing events.

#### TASMANIAN SUB-JUNIOR TEAM REPORT

It is my pleasure to present the report on the activities of the 1978 State Sub-junior team competing in Brisbane on Saturday and Sunday 28th-29th January at the All Australian Sub-junior Interstate Track and Field match.

The Team - Gail Millar (captain), Karen Baldwin, Lisa Gray, Marianne Hardstaff, Anita Moss, Sandra Speers, Sophie Sullivan, Kellie Walton.

It was unfortunate that Jennifer Abraham also selected as a team member was unable to make the trip with us!

Wednesday - 25th January at 10.40am. Launceston and Hobart team members travelled per TAA to Melbourne on separate flights. On arrival at Tullamarine we had lunch and prepared to depart on the Brisbane flight at 1.35pm. There was a brief touch down in Sydney and then onto Brisbane where we were met by Mrs. Joyce Petfield and families from our liasion club Ashgrove Rangers who took us to the Viking Motel and presented us with a beautiful box of fruit. Our accommodation was very pleasing and the girls enjoyed the luxury of fridges in each room, fans, colour TV and a pool. The friendly and personal service by the Motel Manager and his wife contributed toward a very happy stay.

Already we could notice the humidity and the girls were tired from the days travelling so after our evening meal and a brief look through the program they retired to their rooms. It seemed strange that it was dark so early but we had to keep in mind the loss of one

Thursday - We were off to an early morning start with training at Mft. Gravatt and our first glimpse of the Queen Elizabeth 11

Jubilee Sports Centre. The remainder of the day was spent leisurely with lunch at the nearby Garden City and evening meal at our Motel. Our girls anxiously awaited the arrival of the W.A. team. The other team to stay with us at the Viking.

Frieny - We awoke to the sound of rain. It was a free day and we decided to spend it at the Oasis Gardens. That evening I was to attend the Managers meeting. The President Mrs. McMinn kindly called for us. The meeting gave us the change to ask questions and deal with any problems. Thank you to Mrs. Briscoe for the very nice supper provided.

Saturday - First day of competition with much excitement and success ahead of us.

Athletes assembled in track uniform for the opening ceremony. Gail carried our State flag.

Large tents were provided for athletes due to no seating or shelter at the oval. The days program of events included a Womens Open Pentathlon competition and Under 15 years boys N.S.W. v Queensland. For the first time a system was introduced whereby heats were not drawn up until the day. The first event of major interest for us was the High Jump in which our entrant was Kellie Walton. Kellie controlled herself well and jumped her personal best of 1.53. Tasmania had three representatives in the 100 metres heats. Heat 1 Gail Millar and Karen Baldwin and Heat 2 Sophie Sullivan. First 4 placings into final. Gail finsihed 2nd and Karen a very close 5th. Sophie also finished 2nd in her heat. This meant two finalists for us. It was a little disappointing for Karen not to be in the final when she was just so close.

Event 12. There was excitement again. This time it was the heats of the 400 metres. Our three representatives Lisa Gray, Sophie Sullivan and Sandra Speers all qualified for the final. Lisa and Sophie 1st and 2nd respectively and Sandra also 2nd in her heat. This was followed by the 100 metres Hurdles. Marianne Hardstaff was our only competitor and although unplaced Marianne recorded her personal best time of 17. sec. No-one can ask more. The next event of particular interest for us was the 1500 metres. It was a thrilling race with Lisa Gray finishing second in time of 4.43. The first four placegetters were all inside the Queensland State record. A silver medal to Lisa. The 100 metres finalists took their mark and wow, what a race, it was Tasmania's first gold medal. Sophic Sullivan 1st in her personal best of 12.0 sec. Gail Millar finished 4th in a blanket finish recording 12:2 sec. a personal best time for Gail also. 10 minutes later it was the 400 metres final. Sophie and Lisa were fealing the effects of their previous events but for Sandra Speers it was a different story. Sandra ran a very spirited race and tried hard. She finished 4th in her personal best time of 58.2 sec. We returned to the Motel bursting with excitement and completely drenched from 'he storn experienced at conclusion of the days program. We travelled into the city to dinner at the Arcade Bistro and after a very enjoyable moal returned to the Motel for an early night in readiness for competition the next day.

Sunday = 1:19mm. It was the heats of the 800 metres. Lisa and Marianne both drow heat one. Lisa's 1st placing qualified her for the final. Marianne was unlucky to miss out finishing in 5th position. Marianne's time of 2.19.8 sec. was her personal best.

200 metres Feats - Sophie in heat 1 finished 1st in her best ever time of 24.4 sec. Gail in heat 2 also finished 1st. Anita was in heat No. 2 with Gail and was placed 5th in her personal best time of 25.6 sec.

The 800 metres final followed and it was another silver to Lisa who finished 2md in time of 2.12.2 sec. All placegetters broke the previous record.

Onto the 200 retres final - We were jubil nt when the placings were given Sophie Sullivan 1st 24.6 sec. and Gail Millar 2nd 24.7 sec. Sophies second gold medal and a silver medal for Gail and another personal bast time.

Everyone was still full of excitement when the 4 x 100 metre Relay competitors prepared for the start. Our team of Sophie Sullivan, Karen Baldwin, Anita Moss and Gail Millar was a great combination. Their baton changed were smooth and as a result of each girl performing at her best we finished in 2nd placing in a creditable time of 48.8 sec. only one behind the winners. The four girls were proud of their silver redals.

Overall we had now claimed a total of 9 medals a mighty effort from such a small team.

Drizzle rain had occurred occasionally during the day. The closing ceremony brought close to a great competition. All teams assembled in their State Track suits. The captain of W. A. the winning team was presented with the L.C. Mills Shield. It was their first win and for Tasmania it was also a first to finish in equal third position with N.S.W. defeating S.A. and Queensland. I would like to congratulate our team of girls for putting Tasmania on the map in the Subjunior Competition.

On return to the Motel it was a whirl with excitement and it was great to share in the success of the W.A. team.

Monday - was departure day. We were kindly taken to Brisbane airport by families from our liasion olub.

Thank you to the Queensland people for their hospitality and kindness and especially for their willing response to loan starting blocks to our girls.

Each girl has reason to feel proud of her performances. To our, three thirteen year olds Kellie Walton, Karen Baldwin and Sandra Speers it was a great experience and should prove beneficial next season when they will return in the sub junior ranks again. Outstanding performances recorded by our fourteen year olders must surely strengthen Tasmanias Junior section next season.

A BIG thank you is extended to all who sent good luck telegrams, they were a great boost to the moral of the team.

In conclusion of my report I wish to sincerely thank the girls for the most beautiful gift. It was a pleasure to be Manageress and their co-operation, thoughtfulness and bright and happy personalities made my task an easy one. The team was a credit to Tasmania. Thank you to Gail Millar team captain for the capable manner in which she carried out her duties. Gail was a very popular captain.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Association for giving me the privilege to manage the sub junior team to Brisbane and to thank cur State Secretary Mrs. Ebzery for help and advice. To the many people who helped out with favours I am sincerely grateful.

# MANAGERS REPORT AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS. BRISBANE - MARCH, 1978.

We left Hobart on Wednesday 15th march at 10.40 a.m., arriving in Melbourne at 11.40 where we met the Northern contingent. We had an hour to spare in Melbourne and after eating lunch, we boarded the aircraft, and had a short stopover in Sydney arriving in Brisbane at about 5.00 p.m. The bus took us direct to the Canberra Private Hotel. Carmel and Jocelyn had to go to the athletes meeting at 6 p.m. and I had to go to a managers meeting at 7.30. It had been a long day travelling and we were all in bed by 9.30.

#### THURSDAY .....

This was the first day of competition. We left our hotel at 8.45 a.m. and arrived at the ground at 5 past 9. The sun was trying to peet through and looked reasonably promising.

The 200 metre heats were the first events our girls were to compete in. Sophie was in the first heat and ran very well to finish fourth in 25.1. Then it was Carmel's turn, she was placed third in 25.0, and in the third heat Gail was second in 25.1. We were all thrilled, they had all made the semi finals.

Then came the rain and cold, we had no shelter. Sally was in the first heat of the 800m. In the final stages of the race, she was elbowed and pushed, and was virtually bustled out of the race. About 50 metres from the finish line she ran around the pack and finished third in her personal best time of 2.10.7, and showed tremendous courage in the way she fought out the event.

Lisa was in the scoond heat, she also received treatment from the more experienced runners, but the did t let it worry her and we were all jumping with excitement, when about 100m from the finish she burst her way through and we had a first placing. A courageous effort from both girls and I'm sure they would be very pleased with themselves.

We had a long wait then until the 200m semi final. It poured and poured and was bitterley cold. By this time we had tents to shelter in, but the mudinside was at least six inches thick. In the first semi we had Carmel Hughes. The girls were kept waiting at the start and were soaked. Carmel ran a very good 25.2, which was a really good time considering the circumstances. There was another long delay until the next heat, the girls were all saturated, and to make matters worse there was a false start. When the event finally got under way an ironic cheer went up from the crowd. Gail threw herself in the last 10m and finished fifth with the same time as the fourth girl, 25.2. Sophie's time was 26.3.

We were a wet bedraggled lot going back to the hotel, but I felt very proud of them all. We had hot showers, went to tea in the hotel and then had an early night.

#### FRIDAY.

More rain. As we were not competing today, we decided on a bus tour to Surfers Paradise. We spent two hours exploring all the shops and arcades. The beach was closed because of the bad weather and rough seas. After lunch we went on to the bird sanctuary and the Land of Legends which was absolutely fabulous. We arrived back in the City, and went to tea in the hotel restaurant, and then had an early night.

#### SATURDAY.

It was still raining when we left the hotel, however it cleared up before we got to the track and turned out very hot. The first event we had a competitor in, was the long jump. Jocelyn finished fifth with a jump of 5.73, her personal best. She had to miss her sixth round, as she had to run to the high jump.

Carmel and Sophie were next in the first heat of the 400m. Imagine our excitement when Carmel won in a new Queensland junior record of 55.1 and Sophie finished in a very bright 56.4.

Sally was in the second heat and a great effort by her and was placed first in 55.8.

Then it was the final of the 800m. Lisa drew lane four and Sally drew lane eight. It was a great race. The noise from the Tasmanian crow! was deafening. Lisa ran a great race to take out the silver medal in 2.08 and Sally came fourth in 2.11. Only about ten seconds later we found that Jocelyn had won a silver medal in the high Jump, with a leap of 1.75m. 5 cm above her personal best. I felt very proud to be able to present her with that medal. We were not placed in the 4 x 100m relay, but the time of 48.6 was excellent. In contract to previous days, we all had sunburnt noses. We went home very proud of the days events, and after tea at the hotel cafe, went to bed at about 9.30 p.m.

#### SUNDAY.

The first event was the 100m Junior. Carmel and Sophie drew heat one. It was a good race and Sophie ran very well to be fourth in 12.3 and Carmel ran a good 12.5. Gail was in the second and fastest heat, and ran an excellent 12.2, while in the third heat Jocelyn recorded 12.6. Lisa was the next to compete in the 1500m, we were thrilled when she gained third place, and then we found there had been a dispute and the race had to be re-run at the end of the programme.

At 3.20 the 400m final was on. Carmel was in lane four and Sally was in lane five. It was an exciting finish with Carmel winning the Bronze medal in 55.2 and Sally was right behind her in 55.4. Then came the 4 x 400m relay. The first time we had a team in this event. The Tasmanian supporters just about went mad, as we were well placed right throughout the event, and we easily took out second place in 3.44.5.

It was dark when Lisa had to start in the 1500m again. She didn't give herself much hope, as she was tired, but again she ran a brilliant race to take out the bronze medal in her personal best time of 4.35.5.

It had been a great championship for us. Every girl had won a silver medal, and Carmel and Lisa had bronze medals as well. We went to tea at my brothers place, where we played eight ball and generally relaxed before going back to the hotel at about 9.30. Then we went to the Gazebo Hotel where the girls went swimming in the pool. However they only had about ten minutes to swim before the pool was closed. We returned home completely relaxed and happy.

In closing I would like to say thank you to all the people who gave me the opportunity to be able to manage the Tasmanian team. I was very proud of the girls. Their corduct was above reproach, they were a credit to themselves and the State. It was a pleasure to be associated with them, and I wish to thank them for making my task so much easier and enjoyable.

I would like to thank Carmel for all her help to myself and the rest of the team. She has been a tremendous captain. Also my thanks to Mrs. Fay Denholm for coaching the relay teams. She must be very proud of the success they had.

Finally I would like to thank Mrs. Ebzery for her help and encouragement. It was a wonderful experience I will never forget.
