It is with pleasure that I submit for your consideration the twenty-eighth annual Report for the 1978-79 season and to advise that our registration for the period was six hundred and thirty two athletes and officials.

A Junior team of ten members and one Senior member was selected to represent Tasmania at the Combined Men and Women's Australian Championships held on the 22nd - 25th March inclusive, in Perth.

The National Titles were conducted at Perry Lakes Stadium. The Weather conditions were very pleasant for the four days of competition.

The performances of our girls were outstanding and I was a very proud official to be present at these Championships. Gold medals were won by Penny Gray, Susan Johnson and Sally Whiteway; Silver medals by Vicki Harwood and Jocelyn Millar (2); Bronze medals by Lisa Gray and Penny Gray.

Other members of the team performed quite well, some of the girls producing their best times.

The 1979 State Track and Field Championships were held in conjunction with the Men's Association on the 3rd/4th March, at the Domain Athletic Centre.

The conditions were pleasant on both days and the Championships were enjoyed both by athletes and officials. Seven records were broken in the Track and Field Titles. Of these records three were established by Penny Gray, two by Lisa Gray and one each by Sophie Sullivan and Sandra Speers.

MANAGERESS' REPORT ON THE AUSTRALIAN ALL SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS HELD IN ADELAIDE ON WEDNESDAY 13TH & THURSDAY 14TH DECEMBER, 1978

The Tasmanian team left in two groups from Hobart and Launceston on Tuesday 12th December. The two groups met up in Melbourne and travelled together to Adelaide after lunch at Tullarmarine.

On arrival in Adelaide we were met by a representative of the South Australian A.A.A. A bus had been chartered to take the Tasmanian Girls and Boys to our hotel, the Hotel Australia where we were met by Mrs. Phyl Chesterman from the South Australian Women's A.A.A. Mrs. Chesterman proved to be invaluable during our stay in Adelaide.

After settling into our rooms, Mrs. Chesterman "ferried" us to our training ground for a light training session and a relay practice.

As the competition on Wednesday was not due to start until the evening, Mrs. Chesterman and I took the girls to the track so that they could familiarise themselves with the warm-up area and the general lay-out of the track. Mrs. Chesterman kindly supervised the girls on the way back so that they could go shopping while I returned to the hotel for the manager's meeting at 11 a.m.

The Tasmanian girls all tried hard in their events although some of them were a bit overawed by their first experience in this type of competition. Our medal winners were:-

and Catherine Dennis 3rd in U15 Righ Jump

The other members of the team also performed well. Unfortunately in her hurdles race, Catherine Dennis had a recurrence of a knee injury and stumbled when being well placed. I was able to make an appointment for her to see a Sports Medicine Specialist before she competed on Thursday and a report on this visit was given to her father.

Although the medal tally was not great, the trip to Adelaide was very pleasant and I am sure that the girls who took part will benefit from their experiences.

The South Australian Men's and Women's Association are to be congratulated on their organisation, friendliness and helpfulness. All the girls enjoyed the Barbecue and Disco that was put on for them at the end of the Champion-ships.

Since the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia has taken the responsibility for these Championships, the number of events for girls has been increased and the organisation improved. It would seem to me that these Champion ships should become important dates on the calendar for our athletes who are still at school.

MANAGER'S REPORT

SUB-JUNIOR MATCH JANUARY 20TH & 21ST, 1979

Preamable

A team of 13 athletes, 5 from the South, 2 from the Coast and 6 from the North represented Tasmania in the Sub-Junior Match between all States at the Olympic Sports Field Adelaide. The competition was held over two days, January 20th and 21st commencing at 2 p.m. each day. A.A.V. rulings for a Sub-Junior Women's match is that only the winner receives "a prize". Placegetters receive no recognition except to stand on the victory dias. Medals were presented last year as a gesture of the Queensland Association.

Travel

On Wednesday 17th January, flying T.A.A., 5 athletes from the South and 7 from the North left on separate flights from Hobart and L'ton respectively. One athlete travelled A.N.A. We all met at Tullamarine, leaving there at 2 p.m. for Adelaide. The team was met by liaison officers Miss Brenda Pearl and Mr. Don McLennan who made us very welcome and put us at our ease. We were directed to the transport coach which would take us to the Hotel Australia.

Accommodation

The Hotel Australia, a 6 storey building was well situated in close proximity to the city, to bus services and eating houses. The room allocation was met with some reserce by the manager, as the 13 athletes and myself had been accommodated on 5th and 6th floors either in triple or double rooms, as had been arranged. A single room for the manager was quite some distance from any of the athletes. This factor added difficulties to my task, as it can be well understood, since all athletes from visiting states except N.S.W. men had been accommodated at this hotel, I would strongly recommend that in future, where possible, consideration be given to accommodating representative teams on their own, rather than with other teams. It can be fully appreciated that having all athletes housed together must be a very satisfactory arrangement for the Host State. Rooms were comfortable with all "mod. cons." Breakfast menu was satisfactory.

"Free Days"

Thursday and Friday were classed as "free days" for want of a better word. Thursday morning, quite warm, 38 was spent by most, shopping in the city. Training for all athletes was scheduled for 4.30 p.m. "Park 9" a training field in 10 minutes walking distance proved an excellent slot for the field game athletes. The remaining athletes went to Kensington Oval for individual training and relay practice. As was custom over the five day stay in Adelaide, team meetings were held at least twice a day. Following a short managers talk on our arrival, the first of these meetings was 1.30 p.m. on the Thursday. The manager stressed the importance of good conduct and behaviour, their purpose for being in Adelaide and the responsibility they owed to themselves, their parents and their state. Each evening at 7.15 p.m. the team and myself went for an evening meal together.

Friday - Athletes preferred to remain in the cool of the Hotel with an expected temperature of 42°. A trip to Marineland had been organized for the afternoon with a bus calling at the Hotel for us at 1.30 p.m. returning us to the Hotel in the afternoon. No athlete was permitted to leave the hotel unless permission was given by myself. On our return from an enjoyable trip the athletes were again reminded of their responsibilities, since competition would commence the next day. They were to be in their rooms by 10 p.m. and in their beds by 10.30 p.m. Unfortunately not all athletes considered the above necessary.

Saturday - Following a thunderstorm Friday evening and rain Saturday morning the weather was a little better with a less intense heat. A Managers meeting was arranged for 10.30 a.m. Athletes spent the morning resting and preparing themselves for competition. Minutes of the Managers meeting will be forwarded to the Association as soon as possible. Most managers felt that a meeting on the morning of competition has its disadvantages namely - any directives to the athletes, any alterations to the programme left little time to be carried out.

Transport was provided for all athletes and managers, to and from the track both Saturday and Sunday.

2 p.m. was commencement of competition. The opening ceremony was scheduled at 1.30 p.m. - five girls were unable to participate due to their events being timed at 2 p.m. The highlight of the meeting appeared to me to be focused on the Charles Hansen Shell Cup for U17 boys, even though Sub-Junior girls did get some recognition. The weekend competition was officially opened by Mr. Casey M.H.R.

Karen Baldwin, Susan Hooper and Christine Spinks were each in a heat of 100 metres, all qualifying for the final.

In the final 100 metres Karen Baldwin 3rd in 12.5 - the winning time was 12.4 - 2nd placegetter 12.5. A pleasing effort by Karen.

Katrina Fenner, Sandra Speers and Susan Hooper had been selected to compete in the 400 metres.

S. Hooper withdrew K. Fenner placed 5th in 61.5

S. Speers placed 1st in 57.7

In the final of 400 metres Sandra Speers 2nd in 57.0 ran a fine race, beaten by the new record holder for S.A. (55.3).

Saturday (Continued)

In the 1500 metres Shelley Matthewson performed very well, was placed 2nd with a personal best of 4.42.7, 10 seconds better than her previous best time.

Javelin - representatives Dianne Pickett and Jenni Abraham were placed 5th with a throw of 30.02, good effort for Dianne and Jenni 12th 20.46. Winning javelin throw was 37.48.

Shot put - Dianne Picket 11th 8.83

We were pleased with the results of the days competition although some athletes were disappointed with their efforts. Naturally placegetters for Tasmania were disappointed and rightly so, in not receiving some token for their efforts. Following a successful day of competition, the team returned to the hotel to relax.

Sunday - The morning was spent quietly. Competition commenced with long jump at 2 p.m. Kelly Walton and Heather Millar performed quite well. Heather 10th and Kelly 11th out of a team of 15.

800 metres saw Shelley Matthewson placed 4th in her heat. 1st time 2.21.5 and next three times 2.21.8, so she was unlowky not to get to the final.

200 metres heats run in gusty winds saw Susan Hooper 2nd in 25.6, Gelinda Simpson 2nd in 26.9 and Karen 4th in 27.5. Susan and Gelinda into the final, Susan 5th in 26.3 and Gelinda 7th in 26.5.

Fiona Thomas 16th with a throw of 22.76
Winning throw was 36.40

The relay was placed 5th with a time of 50.2 the winning team N.S.W. recorded 49.3.

Following competition the closing ceremony saw all athletes on the field. The weekend competition was officially closed by the President of the Union.

A chicken salad meal was provided at the oval for us all and at 6 p.m. we all returned to the hotel. Packing was the priority of the evening.

Athletes were called for 7.30 breakfast, 8.30 luggage in the hotel foyer and at 9.45 we left for the airport to return home on the Monday.

To make comment on the team's behaviour and performance as a whole is a little difficult. My only comment is that I was proud to leave Tasmania with these girls and to meet the challenge and responsibility that I had undertaken as their manager. With 13 U15 girls I can only say I did my best. I trust the athletes themselves can say the same. I thank the Association for the opportunity given to me, and for the help and advice given. Encouragement needs to be given to these U15 athletes who of course will be the seniors of tomorrow.

TASMANIAN STATE TEAM

It is with pleasure that I present the report on activities of the Tasmanian Women's Athletic State team that competed in Perth. W.A.. March 22nd - 25th.

The team - Senior: Penny Gray (Captain); Junior: Karen Balawin, Lisa Gray, Vicki Harwood, Susan Johnson, Jocelyn Millar, Gail Millar, Shelley Matthewson, Sandra Speers, Sophie Sullivan, Sally Whiteway.

Tuesday - 7.40 a.m. per TAA we left L'ton to Melbourne where we met the 3 team members who had travelled from Hobart. Then it was on to Perth. A very pleasant flight. On arrival at approx. 11.55 (W.A. time) we were met by members from our liaison club who were very willing to help us. The team travelled by airways bus direct to Forrest House Motor Hotel, our place of accommodation. It was ideally situated in the city. After settling in the team members who had been instructed to train did so at Perry Lakes where I was given programs for the girls and a large bag of apples.

Wednesday - Although a free day it was training for several team members. It was necessary to have all spikes and blocks checked. Official starters made themselves available for starting practise and all officials were most helpful. Athletes meeting was held at 5.30 p.m. 2 athletes from each state attended. Our team reps. were Penny and Jocelyn. The Managers meeting was held that evening at 8 p.m. I attended the meeting with Mr. Des. Hardstaff Manager Tas. mens team. We were given information in respect of National titles.

Thursday - The first of a four day competition. Venue was Perry Lakes Rekortan Track. Before I commence talking times. I would like to explain that all timing was electornic and not manual. It was also very interesting to note that all finishes up to 1500m were photo finish and one could purchase a copy of the photo for a fee. Sports Medicine Clinic facilities were made available to athletes at all times and proved to be in great demand.

Official Opening took place at 10.15 a.m. A flag party of 3 from each team assembled for the ceremony. Penny, Jocelyn and Sally represented our Tas. team. Meanwhile Susan Johnson was warming up in preparation for the hurdles which marked the start of the Junior Pentathlon. Susan was our first state Pentathlon rep. for many years. She competed superbly and with only the 800m to be held Susan was leading by 1 point. You can imagine the excitement when Susan won this event for it meant a gold medal. A total of 3528 points gave Susan 1st placing.

1.10 p.m. Heats of Junior 400m. Sally Whoteway in Heat 1, 1st placing in 54.7 sec. and Heat 2 Sophie Sullivan 3rd 55.59, Sandra Speers 56.66 secs. Sally and Sophie both qualified for the final. It was gold for Sally. A very determined and strong finish by Sally to win the final in W.A. record time of 54.02.

The Women's 1500 metres - Penny Gray was our great hope. Penny led the field from start to finish in a very classy performance. Penny's time of 4.17.09 sec. was a W.A. record.

3.55 p.m. Junior 3000 - Lisa Gray representing Tas. finished 4th recording a time of 9.58.14 sec. Lisa unfortunately was troubled by tired legs and later found it necessary to seek physic treatment.

At conclusion of the days events a Presidents' Meeting with all interested athletes was held at the stadium. It was a first for this type of get together.

<u>Friday</u> - Second day of titles with first event at 10 a.m. For us it was the heat of the Jnr. 200m at 11.20 a.m. Heat 1 Gail Millar 4th 24.60 and Sophie Sullivan 5th in 24.79. Heat 2 Sally Whiteway 2nd 24.40 sec. Sally and Gail both qualified for the final to be held on Saturday.

800m Jnr. heats followed. Our 2 reps. Lisa Gray and Shelley Mathewson both qualified for the final to be held the following day. In heat 1 Shelley finished 3rd and Heat 2 Lisa was 4th.

It was Jocelyn's birthday. As a special treat we went to dinner at the Parmelia Steak House with members of the Tas. Mens team.

Saturday - Jocelyn was our first competitor of the day. It was the Jnr. High Jump. With a great performance Jocelyn finished in 2nd placing a height of 1.74. A silver medal to Jo.

On the track it was the Jnr. 800m final. Tassie cheering squad was in action again. Lisa finished 3rd in 2.8.87 it was a bronze medal. Shelley although unplaced recorded her personal best time of 2.12.9 sec.

3.20 p.m. It was the 200m Jnr. final with Sally a close 4th and Gail 5th. Our 4 x 100m relay team of Karen Baldwin, Gail Millar, Sally Whiteway and Sophie Sullivan combined well and recorded an excellent time of 46.80 to finish in 4th place. This was only 0.04 behind the 3rd placegetters.

Sunday - Final day of competition. Our 2 reps. in the Jnr. Long Jump were Jocelyn Millar and Susan Johnson. Both girls performed well. Susan's leap of 5.61 was her personal best for the season and Jocelyn's fine jump of 5.74 gained her 2nd placing, making it Jocelyns 2nd silver medal for the champs.

100m Junior heats - Gail Millar finished 3rd in heat 1 in 12.26 to qualify for the final. Karen in heat 2 5th in 12.7.

Junior Javelin event with Vicki Harwood. This was not only Vicki's first time at the National titles but it was also her first season in competitive athletics. It was a great achievement for Vicki to gain 2nd placing in the Javelin, her throw of a distance of 41m66.

Women's High Jump - Jocelyn competing in Open class was eliminated with a height of 1m73 to finish 8th. It was a wonderful experience for Jocelyn to take part in this Senior event in addition to the Junior section.

Women's 800m followed. Penny Gray ran a great race to finish 3rd in a creditable time of 2m03.93.

Ten minutes later our Juniors Lisa Cray and Shelley Mathewson lined up for the starte of the 1500m. Lisa feeling the stress of leg injury finished 9th in 4.39.37. Shelley finished 7th in 4.36.79, for Shelley only 14 years of age in U18 competition it was a great experience.

100 metres final Gail ran well and finished 6th in 12.36.

Our last event for the titles the 4 x 400m Jnr. relay. Sophie Sullivan, Gail Millar, Sandra Speers and Sally Whiteway. The girls aims were high. They all tried so hard and were leading with less than 200m to go. It was very disappointing for them to be unplaced but what can one say except we know you did your best and unfortunately these things do happen. Keep trying girls it may be gold next year.

A very brief closing ceremony was performed at conclusion of the events, followed by a final function at the Stadium where presentations to winning teams were made, plaques of service presented to Mrs. Robinson, Mrs. McGee and Miss Gould and the Australian team to compete against New Zealand the following weekend was named. It was a thrill to have Penny Gray selected as a member of the Aust. team. Congratulations Penny.

Monday - (Sally's 18th birthday). We were fortunate to have until 11.55 p.m. at our leisure. We took this opportunity to finish our souvenier shopping, lazing on the beach and a movie to finish up on. It was a tiring trip home with 6 a.m. early morning breakfast at Tullamarine.

Medal tally of 3 gold, 3 silver, 2 bronze was an achievement for all Tasmanians to be proud of. A very successful state team. Each team girl gave of her best and performed with distinction. All have reason to feel proud of their efforts. Our 13-14 year old girls gained valuable experience.

The happy and bright personalities of the team made it a pleasure for me to be with them as Manager. I thank the girls for their co-operation. A special little thank you girls for my gift. To Penny Gray, team captain, thank you for help given to the girls and myself, a more capable captain you would never find.

To the T.W.A.A.A. my sincere thanks for giving me the opportunity and privilege to manage the State Team of '79. It was a trip I will always remember.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the Tasmanian men's team on their syccess at the titles and also thank them for support given to us.
