Marianne was the smallest competitor in the event and showed great determination amongst her older rivals. Also to Susan Hooper who represented her State for the first time.

Even though some of our girls did not win a medal they recorded their personal best performance.

I'm sure that all members of the Team will be further enriched by the competition at these Championships.

Most Northern girls travelled down with their parents and stayed in various motels around Hobart.

After being advised what time to arrive at the ground the following day all the girls went their respective ways.

Saturday:

All team members arrived at the Domain Athletic Centre at 12,30 p.m. attended the Managers meeting held prior to commencement of competition. An alteration to future Sub-Junior Match programs was suggested by the Manager of Queensland: e.g. the second days program to be altered so to have 200m event before 800 metres. A further suggestion was to include a 3000m event and a 4 x 400m relay. Competition commenced at 1.30 p.m. and the Tasmanian Captain Shelley Mathewson pronounced the Oath of Amateurism.

The weather was warm although qusty winds were prevalent. The first event of interest to us was the High Jump in which our representatives were Susan Botak and Tina Henrick. Susan gained 8th place with a jump of 1.47m. Tina jumped 1.43m and gained 9th place.

The 100 metres heats followed and our representative in

Heat 1 Gelinda Simpson 12.6 1st in her heat which qualified her for the final.

Heat 2 Wendy Eyles 13.0 6th in her heat Leah Miller 5th in her heat 12.8

In the final of 100 metres Gelinda finished 2nd in the time of 12.4. A really great effort from her.

Next were the heats of 400 metres and our representatives were:

Heat I Frances Wallace 59.6 6th in her heat Heat 2 Sharon Barker 57.3 1st in her heat which qualified her for the final. Leah Miller 59.9 6th in her heat

In the final of 400 metres Sharon was placed 4th in the time of 58.3 and ran a fine race.

Debra Harwood was our representative in the Javelin Throw and was placed 7th with a throw of 28.86m.

In the 90m Hurdles our representative was Rebecca Pitt and in Heat 1 ran the time of 14.8 which gained her 5th place and qualified her for the final in which Rebecca finished 8th in a personal Jest time of 14.4. A really great effort from Rebecca.

Simone Solomon and Shelley Mathewson were our representatives in 1500 metres. Shelley finished 6th in the time of 4.46.3 and performed very well. Simone although unplaced tried very hard.

Jennifer Abrahams competed in the Shot Put and finished 8th with a distance of 11.54 metres.

A B.B.Q. was held at the end of the days events and greatly appreciated by all the competitors and officials.

Sunday:

Competition commenced at 1.30 p.m. The weather was fine and warm. The Long Jump was the first event on the program and Andrea Marshall, Julie Hooper and Angela Strange were our representatives and although all jumped well did not gain a place in the final eight competitors.

Angela was the baby of our team and I feel sure that the experience she gained at the Sub-Junior Match will help her tremendously in the future.

All teams assembled in the centre of the ground at the end of the days events and the closing ceremony brought to an end two great days of competition.

All winning competitors received a souvenir spoon from Mrs. Jepson, President of T.W.A.A.A. and the captain of S.A. winning team was presented with L.C. Mills Shield.

Again a B.B.Q. was held after which all our girls returned home.

MANAGER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present my report on the Tasmanian Team competing at the National Titles in Sydney March 20th - 23rd. Our team consisted of Sally Whiteway. (Captain), Penny Gray, Susan Johnson, Jocelyn and Gail Millar, Vicki Harwood, Marianne Hardstaff, Sophie Sullivan, Susan Hooper, Shelley Mathewson and Sandra Speers.

We arrived in Sydney at 3p.m. on Wednesday and were met by our Liaison Officer Mr. Brian Overton, who was most helpful to the girls and myself at all times, we were very grateful for his care and attention.

On arrival at the Canberra Oriental Hotel it was discovered that our reservations were in a dreadful muddle, by the time everything was straightened out the girls had missed being able to use the E.S. Marks field for training as it was past the time scheduled for use. We made use of a small oval that was within walking distance from our Hotel.

At 6 p.m. I attended the Managers' Meeting with Messrs Des Hardstaff and Brian Rowe. The main topics for discussion were dope testing and electronic timing.

We were sorry to learn that due to sickness Miss Daphne Holland was unable to travel with us, but were pleased when she was able to join us on the final day of competition.

Competition commenced for most girls on Thursday. It was the first time the E.S. Marks Field had been used officially. The weather was fine, conditions suitable for good competition. Sally Whiteway and Kent Rayner represented Tasmania at the opening ceremony. Due to the large number of withdrawals from various events, many heats and semi finals were cancelled and often finals were scheduled to be held several days later. Many competitors found the long wait unnerving.

Our first and only gold medalist was Vicki Harwood who against very stiff opposition on Thursday unleashed a magnificent throw of 45.75 to win the Junior Javelin event.

Sally Whiteway performed very well, especially as this was her first year in senior competition. Her splendid effort in the 400 metres gained her a Bronze Medal in her personal best time of 53.83. Sally just missed making the final in the 200 metres.

In the Senior 1500 metres Penny Gray was up with the leaders until the final run home, when she was passed by New South Wales runner Sue Muir. Penny clocked 4m20.3 for her 2nd placing which was her best time this season. In the 800 metres competitors were subjected to a most unsettling experience of not knowing whether the race would be run in heats or as a final. Decisions were made and altered several times before the final decision was agreed to. In this race Penny again led all the way, but was run down in the home straight. Penny tried hard and came in a creditable 3rd in 2 mins. 6.6 secs.

A fine all round performance by Jocelyn Millar gained her 2nd place in the Junior Pentathlon with a score of 3460 points. Her prodigious leap of 1.80 broke the New South Wales Junior High Jump record.

Marianne Hardstaff had a nerve wracking wait before she competed in the Junior 400 metre Hurdles. Although the smallest competitor in the event Marianne displayed great courage and determination to finish 3rd. This was a really great effort for a first year competitor.

Our Juniors tried hard and figured in some very tight finishes which should spur them on to train hard for selection in next years State Team.

Gail Millar made the finals in the 200 and 400, clocking 24.9 in her 200 heat and finishing a close 5th in the final in 25.28. Gail recorded 55.3 in the 400 final.

Sophie Sullivan put up a very good showing in the 400 metres coming in a very close 4th and clocking her personal best time of 54.18.

MANAGER'S REPORT - National Titles (CONTINUED)

Susan Hooper performed very well for a first year recruit reaching the finals in the 100 metres, clocking 12.1 heat, 12.0 semi-final and 12.4 final.

Sandra Speers displayed great determination in her running, recording 2m15.3 in her heat to go through to the 800 final and although unplaced recorded a personal best time of 2 mins. 10.8 secs.

Shelley Mathewson's run of 2 mins. 15.2 gained her a berth in the 800 final in which she recorded 2 mins. 16.6, owing to an injury it was necessary to withdraw Shelley from further competition.

Susan Johnson competing for the first time in senior ranks performed well and although unplaced in the Pentathlon recorded a personal best score of 3638 points, this experience should ensure that she gains more confidence in her own capabilities.

I am sure that everyone was thrilled and delighted with the spectacular success of our two relay teams. Our 4 \times 100 quartette showed speed and determination when they finished a close 2nd. Susan Hooper sent us away with a great start and a fine change to Sophie Sullivan enabled her to put in a fast run to Jocelyn Millar who changed to sister Gail and her strong run home ensured a silver medal for Tasmania.

The members of our 1600 metre team Marianne Hardstaff, Gail Millar, Sandra Speers and Sophie Sullivan covered themselves with glory with their magnificent performances, with a special mention for Sophie who withstood a strong challenge from the Victorian and Australian Junior 400 metre champion to take our colours across the line in 2nd place.

It is gratifying to know that the performances of our athletes are being recognised, and that four of our top athletes - Sally Whiteway, Penny Gray, Vicki Harwood and Jocelyn Millar have been selected in the Alcoa squad, and will benefit by having the opportunity of taking part in Inter State competitive meetings and training camps on the mainland. I am sure they will benefit greatly from being part of this intensive athletic background, and that it will help Tasmania emerge more dominantly in athletics in the future. I hope that all team members will capitalize on the valuable experience they were able to acquire, from competing and meeting with top Australian athletes during their Sydney trip, and that it will encourage them to train even harder so that they may gain selection next year. I wish them every success for the coming 1981 season and in the future.

I wish to whank Mr. Des Hardstaff for his courtesy, kindness and co-operation at all times.

I wish to thank the T.W.A.A.A. for giving me the opportunity to take our State team to the Australian championships and to thank Mrs. Ebzery for the advice she is always willing to give.
