THIRTIETH ANNUAL REPORT SINCE RE-AFFILIATION:

SEASON 1980-81

Presented to members of the T.W.A.A.A. at the Annual General Meeting held at the Board Room of the Division of Recreation, Kirksway House, Kirksway Place, Battery Point, on Saturday, 25th July, commencing at 2.00 p.m.

Ladies.

It is my pleasure to present to you the Thirtieth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

Our registration of athletes and officials for the 1980/81 athletic season was 620.

A Team of six Junior members and four Senior members was selected to represent Tasmania at the Combined Men and Women's Australian Track and Field Championships held on the 19th - 22nd March inclusive, in Adelaide.

Susan Johnson (Captain) Heptathlon, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Snr.) 100m, 200m, 400m, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Snr.) Sally Whiteway 800m, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m, 4 x 400m Relay (Snr.) Penny Gray Jocelyn Millar Heptathlon, high jump, long jump, 100m hurdles, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Snr.) 100m, 200m, 400m, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Jnr.) Gail Millar Vicki Harwood Javelin, (Snr.) and Junior Sandra Speers 400m, 800m, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Jnr.) Marianne Harstaff 400m Hurdles, 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay (Jnr.) Heptathlon (Jnr.) Cathy Dennis 4 x 100m, 4 x 400m Relay. Susan Hooper

Our team did very well at the Nationals winning 1 gold, 2 silver and 10 bronze.

Congratulations to Gail Millar on her fine win in the junior 400 metres; and also making the final in the 200m.

Everyone was thrilled when Marianne Hardstaff won her silver medal in the 400m. hurdles. Marianne had been under a great strain not knowing whether she would be available to compete, if heats were to be conducted earlier in the programme as she was doing her nursing exams and could not be available until the evening prior to the final, but 'Lady Luck' was with her as it was her last opportunity to compete as a junior.

Gail will also be joining the senior ranks and our best wishes are extended to these girls to continue with the success that they have brought to our State during their junior competition.

Jocelyn Millar was 2nd in the Senior Heptathlon, and Penny Gray gained a 3rd in the Senior 800 metres.

Although Sally Whiteway did not win a medal, she performed very well, and made the finals in all of her events.

Sandra Speers ran a good 3rd in the junior 800 metres and still has another year to compete in this rank.

Vicki Harwood did not perform as well as she has done previously, but I understand that she had problems with her 'run-ups'.

Cathy Dennis performed very well, and would have gained a great deal of knowledge from her first National Titles.

Susan Hooper ran very well in the relays, as did all the girls, and it was a great thrill to see our Teams taking out places.

It was disappointing that Susan Johnson had to withdraw from the Senior Heptathlon and relays owing to a big injury.

The 1981 State Track and Field Championships were held in conjunction with the Men's Association on the 28th February and 1/2 March.

The conditions were pleasant for the first two days but pouring rain and strong winds hampered the afternoon competition on the final day.

The competition throughout the Championships was very good, with many close finishes and good times, and records being established.

One of the closest finishes came in the final of the Senior 400 metres, when Sally Whiteway (Devon) just lasted to win from Penny Gray, with a time of 56 secs; with Penny second on 56.1, and Sophie Sullivan 56.4 in third place.

One of the best performances on the second day of the Championships was by Marianne Hardstaff (North L'ton) who broke her own residential record for the 400 metres Junior hurdles by one second, with a time of 62 seconds.

Marianne competing against only one other competitor, Judy Harrison (Newstead) hurdled smoothly all the way and put on a fast finishing effort.

Suzanne Botak (Riverside) set a new Tasmanian record in the Under 15 (sub-junior) high jump by clearing 1.62 metres with Catherine Fisher and Olivia Garrott filling in the minor places.

In the women's senior high jump, Cathy Soanes (Victoria) and Jocelyn Millar (Riverside) finished equal first after clearing 1.76 metres.

It is with pleasure that I present my report on the Tasmanian Team competing at the National Titles in Adelaide 19th - 22nd March. Our team consisted of Seniors:-Susan Johnson (Captain), Penny Gray, Sally Whiteway, Jocelyn Millar. Juniors:-Gail Millar, Sandra Speers, Vicki Harwood, Marianne Hardstaff, Cathy Dennis, Susan Hooper.

Departed Wednesday morning, met up with North girls in Melbourne, arrived Wednesday afternoon, settled in accommodation at Flinders Lodge satisfactory. Attended Managers Meeting with Brian Roe, which unfortunately did not start on time, consequently meeting did not finish until after mid-night.

First day of competition Thursday with Tasmania off to a good start, Gail Millar putting us on the map by winning a gold in a thrilling 400 metre Junior title. Gail made the finals of the 200 metres and ran well in all relays.

Jocelyn Millar was 2nd in the Senior Heptathlon and ran well in both Senior relays.

Penny Gray gained a 3rd in the Senior 800 metres and ran a good leg in the Senior 4×400 relay.

REPORT ON THE AUSTRALIAN ALL SCHOOLS' CHAMPIONSHIPS DECEMBER 12TH - 15TH 1980

With the radar strike in progress, the trip hardly got off to a flying start. After a further four hour wait at Tullamarine, we finally left for Sydney, arriving six hours later than planned. We were met on arrival by a very helpful man, Mr. Peter Waters, then caught taxis straight to the Gemini Motor Inn, at a cost of approximately 85 cents per person. The northern girls were well settled in to their rooms by this stage.
